THE WEST GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

(TALBOT ROAD, PORT TALBOT)

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LIMITED WAITING)

ORDER 1987

The West Glamorgan County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984) and of all other powers them enabling and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order.

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on the "5" day of October 1987 and may be cited as the West Glamorgan County Council (Talbot Road, Port Talbot) (Prohibition of Waiting and Limited Waiting) Order 1987.
- 2. Save as provided in Articles 4 and 5 to this Order no person shall, except on the direction of the Police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden cause any vehicle to wait at any time on the sides or lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- Save as provided in Articles 4 and 5 to this Order no person shall, except on the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a traffic warden cause any vehicle to wait for longer than all hour treturn prohibited within elshour between 8.00 a.m and 6.00 p.m on any day except Sunday on the sides or lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- 4. Nothing him Articles 2 and 3 to this Order shall crender it unlawful of scause for permit any vehicles to wait on ther lengths nor sides of roads specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable: 3 and a separated period not excueding 2 hours of the separated
 - a) apperson to board or alight from a vehicle parts
 - the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:
 - building, industrial or demolition operations
 - ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic
 - iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the side of road, or

- (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said side of road of any sewers or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984 or
- the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers and duties
- d) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivery or collecting posted packets as define in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953
- e) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to any of the said sides or lengths of road for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral or
- f) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes or
- g) stage carriage vehicles or omnibuses engaged in carrying out a local bus service as defined in the Transport Act 1985 when waiting at an authorised abusestop to set down or pick up passangers.
- Nothing in Articles 2 and 3 to the Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the sides or lengths of road referred to in the said Article for a period not exceeding 2 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of road).

6. In this Order:-

"disabled persons vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulation 1975;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled OPersons (Badged for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975;
