TONNA/RESOLVEN, NEATH (AREA TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT SCHEME)

ORDER 1997

The Neath Port Talbot County Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2, 32, 36 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other powers them enabling and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order:-

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of September 1997 and may be cited as the "Neath Port Talbot County Borough Council (Tonna/Resolven Neath Area Traffic Management Scheme) Order 1997".
- 2. (1) In this Order -

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales Regulations 1986).

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982 as amended by The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulations 1991.

"parking disc" means a disc issued by a Local Authority, complying with the requirements of the British standard Specification for Parking Discs (B.S. 4531 - 1970) coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting beings, and

"relevant position" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982 as amended by The Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1991.

"public service vehicle" shall have the same meaning as in Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981 and "local service" shall have the same meaning as in Section1 of the Transport Act 1985.

"carriageway" means a way consisting of or comprised in a highway being a way (other than a cycle track) over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles.

"Residents Parking Place" (hereinafter referred to as "a Permit") means a permit issued by the Council for a period of up to twelve months to a person who has satisfied the Council as being a bona fide resident of the area to which the Order relates.

(2) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

- (3) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the Interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- (4) The provisions of the Orders specified in Schedule 1 to this Order are hereby revoked insofar as they relate to the lengths or sides of road specified in Schedules 2 to 4 to this Order.
- 3. Save as provided in Articles 4 and 5 to this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the sides or lengths of road as set out in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- 4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides or lengths of road specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose, in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said site of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (iv) a vehicle being used for Police, Ambulance or Fire Brigade purposes;
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a Local Authority or of a Water Authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 37 of the Post Office Act, 1953;
 - (f) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of road.
 - (g) local public service vehicles when waiting at an authorised bus stop to set down or pick up passengers.

- 5. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the side of road referred to in the said Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of road).
- 6. Save as provided in Articles 4 and 5 of this Order no person shall except on the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day except Saturday and Sunday on the sides or lengths of road as set out in Schedule 4 of this Order

7. Residents Parking Places

Except as provided by Articles 4 and 8 of this Order or upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a Traffic Warden no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in a Parking Place designated by Schedule 3 to this Order.

8. The provisions of Article 7 to this Order shall not apply to the holder of a Residents Permit when parking a vehicle in the parking place as described in Schedule 3 to this Order.

9. Regulation of Parking Place

- A (i) The holder of a Residents Permit shall not park in any Parking Place other than in the street named on the Permit.
 - (ii) Where a Police Constable in uniform or a Traffic Warden is of the opinion that the provisions contained in Article 7 of this Order have been contravened he may remove or cause to be removed the vehicle from the Parking Place and where it is so removed shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle.
 - (iii) A Police Constable in uniform or a Traffic Warden may move or cause to be moved in the case of emergency to any place he thinks fit any vehicle left in the Parking Place.
 - (iv) The Permit shall be valid only for the vehicle in respect of which it is issued and no permit holder shall cause or permit any Permit issued to him by the Council to be displayed on any vehicle bearing a different registration number to that contained on that Permit.

B. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any part of the Parking Place during such period as there is in or adjacent to that part of the Parking Place a traffic sign placed in pursuance of Article 7 of this Order.

Provided that nothing in this Article shall apply:-

- in respect of any vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any other reason specified in this Order;
- (ii) to anything done with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform, Traffic Warden or the person suspending the use of the Parking Place or part thereof in pursuance of this Order.
- C. (i) Nothing in Article 7 of this Order shall apply to:-
 - (a) legally qualified medical practitioners as defined in Section 52 of the Medical Act 1956, community nurses or registered veterinary surgeons while visiting premises adjacent to the Residents Parking Place provided that the vehicle is displaying an appropriate worded notice to the effect that it is being used "on call";
 - (b) a maximum of two vehicles being used in connection with a wedding;
 - (c) vehicles being used for building and maintenance purposes in properties adjacent to a Parking Place;
 - (d) to enable any hearse or any vehicle owned by a funeral director or owner of funeral vehicles to be used as part of a funeral cortege or otherwise in connection with a funeral;
 - (e) to enable Support Officers of a bona fide care organisation to park in the Residents Only Parking Area whilst visiting a Community Care dwelling in pursuit of their duties, provided the special permit issued by N.P.T.C.B.C. is displayed in the correct position on the front windscreen of their vehicle.

Permits

- D (i) The Council may at any time require an applicant for a Permit or the holder of a Permit to produce to an Officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a Permit made to them as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them or in respect of any Permit issued by them as they may reasonably require to verify that the Permit is valid.
 - (ii) On receipt of an application for a Permit the Council upon being satisfied that:-
 - (a) the applicant is a person who resides in a road referred to in the Schedule to this Order or is a person who falls within the categories of persons eligible for the granting of a Permit as may be determined from time to time by the Council.
 - (b) the application is made in respect of an eligible vehicle as defined in paragraph (iii) of this Article;

shall issue to the applicant a Permit in respect of that vehicle, subject to no more than two Permits being issued in respect of any particular residence.

- (iii) For the purposes of this Article "eligible vehicle" means:-
 - (a) a passenger vehicle which is a motor vehicle constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects or adapted to carry no more than twelve passengers exclusive of the driver and not drawing a trailer:
 - (b) a goods vehicle the weight of which does not exceed 30 cwt. unladen.
 - (c) solo motor cycle or moped.
- (iv) (a) No person shall be entitled to hold a Permit for more than one vehicle at any one time.
 - (b) The Permit shall be valid only for the vehicle in respect of which it is issued and no permit holder shall cause or permit any Permit issued to him by the Council to be displayed on any vehicle bearing a different registration number to that contained on that Permit.

- (v) A permit holder may surrender a Permit to the Council at any time and shall surrender it to the Council on the occurrence of any one of the following events:-
 - (a) the permit holder ceasing to be a resident in the street for which the Permit was issued;
 - (b) save as provided in paragraph (viii)(a) of this Article the permit holder ceasing to be the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the Permit was issued;
 - the vehicle in respect of which the Permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it ceases to be an eligible vehicle as defined in paragraph (iii) of this Article;
 - (d) the issue by the Council of a duplicate Permit;
 - (e) the expiry of the Permit pursuant to paragraph (vi) of this Article;
 - (f) the withdrawal of the Permit by the Council.
- (vi) A Permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the date stated thereon or on the occurrence of any of the events set out in paragraph (v) of this Article whichever is the earlier.
- (vii) The Council may by notice in writing served on a permit holder by sending the same by recorded delivery service to the permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the Permit or at any other address believed to be that person's abode withdraw a Permit if it appears to the Council that any of the events set out in paragraph (v) of this article has occurred and the Permit Holder shall surrender the Permit to the Council within forty eight hours of the receipt of the aforementioned notice.
- (viii) A Permit shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:-
 - (a) the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the Permit was issued except when such Permit is issued to a resident whose vehicle is owned by a bona fide motor trader and which vehicle does not exceed 30 cwt. unladen weight in such cases the registration mark will be replaced with the words "MOTOR TRADER";

- (b) the expiry date of the Permit pursuant to paragraph (vi) of this Article;
- (c) an indication that the Permit was issued by the Council;
- (d) the name of the street in which the applicant resides.

Charges

- E. Council may at its discretion charge for the issue of residents parking places permits such charge to be determined from time to time by resolution of the Council or the appropriate Committee thereof and in any case any duplicate permit shall only be issued on the payment by the applicant of a fee of one pound sterling.
- 10. The provisions of this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any other restriction or prohibition whether imposed under the Act of 1984 or otherwise.

SCHEDULE 1 - REVOCATIONS

TONNA/RESOLVEN (AREA TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT SCHEME) ORDER 1991

Schedule 2 - Prohibition of Waiting 8.00 am to 6.00 pm monday to saturday

2. Tanyrhiw Road (South Side)

Between its junction with Neath Road and a point 25 metres east of that junction.

SCHEDULE 2 - NO WAITING AT ANY TIME

1. Henfaes Road (South East Side)

- (i) Between its junction with Quarry Road and a point approximately 10 metres South West of that junction.
- (ii) Between its junction with School Road and a point approximately 15 metres North East of that junction.

2. School Road (Both Sides)

Between its junction with Henfaes Road and a point approximately 32 metres South East of that junction.

3. <u>Lletty Dafydd (South West Side)</u>

Between points approximately 10 metres South West and 10 metres North East of its junction with Llys Dwfnant.

4. Llys Dwfnant (Both Sides)

Between its junction with Lletty Dafydd and a point approximately 10 metres South East of that junction.

5. Parkfield (Both Sides)

Between its junction with Park Street and a point approximately 15 metres North West of that junction.

6. Park Street North West Side)

Between points approximately 20 metres South West and 15 metres North East of its junction with Parkfield.

7. Neath Road (South East Side)

From its junction with Tanyrhiw Road to a point approximately 10 metres South West of that junction.

8 Tanyrhiw Road (South West Side)

From its junction with Neath Road to a point approximately 53 metres South East of that Junction.

SCHEDULE 3 - RESIDENTS PARKING

Henfaes Road (North West Side)

Between points approximately 31 metres South West and 75 metres South West of a point in line with the South West kerbline of School Road.

Between points approximately 11 metres South West and 7 metres North East of a point in line with South West kerbline of School Road.

SCHEDULE 4 - NO WAITING (Mon-Fri) 8.00am to 6.00pm.

Pen-Y-Bryn (East Side) Between points approximately 15 metres North and 25 metres North of its junction with Tonna Uchaf.
