

THE GLASGOW COUNTY COUNCIL

(VARIOUS STREETS, GLASGOW)

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER, 1968

The Glasgow County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections (1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, and of all other powers then enabling in that behalf, hereby make the following Order:-

1. Save as provided in Article 2 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform cause or permit any vehicle to wait in those streets in Glasgow specified in the Schedule to this Order.

2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in the lengths of road referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary:-

- (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
- (b) to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle;
- (c) to enable the vehicle, if it can be conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the length of road so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to the said length of road of any sewer or of any gas, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act, 1878;
- (d) to enable the vehicle to take fuel, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of road;
- (e) to enable any vehicle to be used by a funeral director or owner of funeral vehicles to be used as part of a funeral cortege or otherwise in connection with a funeral.

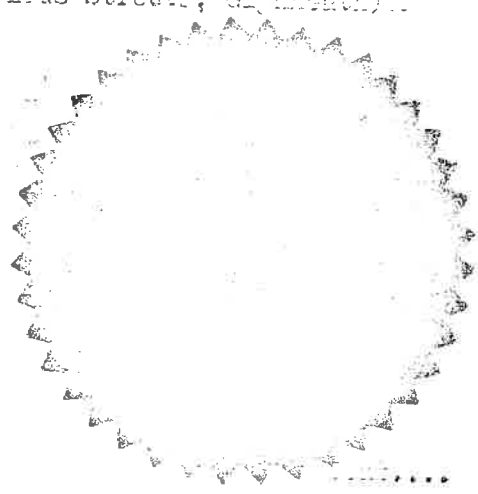
3. The Interpretation Act, 1937, shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the 10th day of June, 1968, and may be cited as the Glasgow County Council (Various Streets, Glasgow) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1968.

SCHEDULE.

- (i) Aberdulais-Seven Sisters-Glynneath Road, route A.4109, from its junction with the Neath-Abergavenny trunk road, route A.465, to its junction with Woodland Park, a distance of approximately 620 ft.
- X (ii) Gellidawel Road from its junction with the Neath-Abergavenny trunk road, route A.465, to a point 50 ft. southwards.
- (iii) The road on the opposite side of the Neath-Abergavenny trunk road route A.465, to Gellidawel Road, from its junction with route A.465 to a point 50 ft. northwards. *formerly closed*
- X (iv) Whitting Street from its junction with the Neath-Abergavenny trunk road, route A.465, to a point 50 ft. southwards.
- X (v) Bethania Street, from its junction with the Neath-Abergavenny trunk road, route A.465, to a point 50 ft. southwards.
- (vi) Oddfellows Street from its junction with the Neath-Abergavenny trunk road, route A.465, to a point 50 ft. southwards.
- (vii) Heathfield Avenue from its junction with the Neath-Abergavenny trunk road, route A.465, to a point 50 ft. northwards.
- (viii) Bethel Road from its junction with the Neath-Abergavenny trunk road, route A.465, to a point 50 ft. south-westwards on its west side and 110 ft. south-westwards on its east side.
- (ix) Pontneathvaughan Road from its junction with the Neath-Abergavenny trunk road, route A.465, to a point 150 ft. north-eastwards on its north side and approximately 50 ft. north-eastwards on its south side.
