

WEST GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

(WOODLAND ROAD AND DYFED ROAD, NEATH)

(PROHIBITION OF WAITING, LOADING AND UNLOADING)

ORDER 1986

The Council of the County of West Glamorgan (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Section 1, 2 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order.

- 1. (1) This Order shall come into operation on the 21st November 1986 and may be cited as the West Glamorgan county Council (Woodland Road and Dyfed Road, Neath) (Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 1986.
- (2) The provisions of the Various Strets, Neath (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 1976 (Amendment No. 4) Order 1978 are hereby revoked in so far as they affect or relate to the sides or lengths of road specified in Schedule Two to this Order.
- 2. (1) In this Order:-
  - "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975;
  - "disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975;
  - "parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS. No. 4631 - 1970), coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins.
- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying -
  - (a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when



- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the nearside of and immediately behind the windscreen, and
    - (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle, and
  - (b) a parking disc in the relevant position, when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.
- (3) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- (4) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. Save as provided in Article 5 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait, be loaded or unloaded at any time on the sides or lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
4. Save as provided in Articles 5, and 6 and 7 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day on the sides or lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
5. Nothing in Articles 3 and 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the length or lengths of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
- (i) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-

- (a) building, industrial or demolition operations;
  - (b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
  - (c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the side of road; or
  - (d) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said side of road or any sewer or of any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984
- (ii) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (iii) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act, 1953;
  - (iv) the vehicle to be used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
  - (v) a public service vehicle to load or off load passengers at a duly authorised bus stop marked by a bus stop markings and signs in accordance with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1981 or any succeeding Regulations.
6. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to:-
- (i) cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling persons to board or alight from the vehicle or goods to be loaded or unloaded from the vehicle and
  - (ii) cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length or on the same side of road on the same day).

7. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit omnibuses used for the conveyance of school children and engaged or employed by the West Glamorgan County Council or its successors for that purpose to pick up or set down school children attending the Gnoll Junior and Infant School or the Castell Nedd Welsh Primary School and to wait up to a maximum of 30 minutes for that purpose on the lengths or sides of road referred to therein.
8. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

#### SCHEDULE ONE

##### **DYFED ROAD (NORTH EAST SIDE).**

For a distance of 60 metres or thereabouts along the frontage of the swimming baths.

#### SCHEDULE TWO

##### **Prohibition of Waiting Monday to Saturday**

8.00 a.m. - 6.00 p.m.

##### **Woodland Road (South eastern side).**

From the north eastern kerbline of Gnoll Avenue to the western boundary of No. 1 Woodland Road, a distance of 70 metres.

##### **Woodland Road (North western/north eastern side).**

From the south western kerbline of Forster Road, for a distance of 5 metres in a south westerly direction. From the north eastern kerbline of Forster Road for a distance of 60 metres to a point in line with the north western kerbline of the stem of the 'T' junction in Woodland Road.

**Woodland Road 'T' Junction: Head of Tee.**

From the south eastern kerbline of the stem for a distance of 5 metres in a south easterly direction.

**Stem of Tee (both sides).**

From the north eastern kerbline of the head for a distance of 5 metres in a north easterly direction.
