The West Glamorgan County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as the "Act of 1984") and of all other powers them enabling and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 12 day of August 1992 and may be cited as the West Glamorgan County Council (Prohibition of Waiting and Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) (Park Avenue and Lon Las Avenue, Skewen, Neath), Order 1991.

2. In this Order:-

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1986;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a Local Authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specification for Parking Discs (BS.4631 - 1970), coloured orange, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins, and

"relevant position" means:-

(i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the nearside of and immediately behind the windscreen;

(ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle.

3. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

4. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle except an emergency services vehicle, police or ambulance vehicle to wait, be loaded or unloaded at any time on the sides or lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.

5. Save as provided in Articles 7 and 8 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the sides or lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
6. Save as provided in Articles 7 and 8 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any day except Sunday on the sides or lengths of road specified in Schedule 3 to this Order.
7. Nothing in Articles 5 and 6 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides or lengths of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said side of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984; or
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act, 1953;
8. Nothing in Articles 5 and 6 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the side of road referred to in the said Article for a period not exceeding 2 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of road).

9. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any other prohibition or restriction whether made under the Act of 1984 or otherwise.

SCHEDULES

SCHEDULE 1.

PROHIBITION OF WAITING, LOADING AND UNLOADING, "AT ANY TIME".

Park Avenue (Southside).

Between points 55 metres west and 45 metres east of a point opposite the western kerbline of Lon Las Avenue, a distance of approximately 100 metres.

SCHEDULE 2.

PROHIBITION OF WAITING, "AT ANY TIME".

Park Avenue (North Side).

Between points 15 metres west and 15 metres east of its junction with Lon Las Avenue.

Lon Las Avenue (Both Sides).

Between its junction with Park Avenue and a point 10 metres north of that junction.

SCHEDULE 3.

PROHIBITION OF WAITING, 8.00 A.M. TO 6.00 P.M., MONDAY TO SATURDAY.

Park Avenue (North Side).

Between points 15 metres and 45 metres west of its junction with Lon Las Avenue.

Between points 15 metres and 62 metres east of its junction with Lon Las Avenue.
