ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE OLDHAM - BROADGATE (CHADDERTON)
PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND NO LOADING/UNLOADING
ORDER 2000

The Oldham Borough Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) and 2(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on 9th October 2000 and may be cited as the Oldham - Broadgate (Chadderton) Prohibition of Waiting and Loading/Unloading Order 2000.
2. Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
3. Save as provided in Article 4 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the sides of the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
4. Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the length of road or any other adjacent length of road;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (d) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the length of road for so long as is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral; or
 - (e) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.
5. Save as provided in Article 6 no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be loaded or unloaded at any time in the sides of the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

6. Nothing in Article 5 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to be loaded or unloaded in the length of road referred to therein to enable:-
- (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the lengths of road or any other adjacent lengths of road;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984.
 - (b) The vehicle if it cannot be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of the local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
 - (c) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.
7. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
