**THE OLDHAM - BOOTH STREET/MELLOR STREET/ST JOHN STREET (LEES)
PROHIBITION OF DRIVING/NO ENTRY/ONE-WAY TRAFFIC ORDER 2001**

The Oldham Borough Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) and 2(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 4th August 2003 and may be cited as the Oldham - Booth Street/Mellor Street/St John Street (Lees) Prohibition of Driving/No Entry/One-Way Traffic Order 2001.
2. Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
3. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
4. Save as provided in Article 7 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in the length of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
5. Save as provided in Article 7 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle except for public service vehicles and especially adapted coaches to enter the road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
6. Save as in Article 7 no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in the length of road specified in Column 1 of Schedule 3 to this Order in a direction other than that specified in Column 2 of the said Schedule.
7. Nothing in Articles 4, 5 and 6 shall render it lawful to cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in the lengths of road specified in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 to this Order unless that vehicle is being used:-
 - (a) for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
 - (b) for the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the length of road or any other adjacent length of road or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984; and
 - (c) if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

Lengths of road in Lees in the Borough of Oldham

SCHEDULE 1

<u>Road</u>	<u>Length</u>
Mellor Street	Extending from its junction with High Street, Lees (A669), for a distance of 16 metres in a northerly direction
St John Street	Extending from its junction with High Street, Lees (A669), for a distance of 17 metres in a northerly direction

SCHEDULE 2

<u>Road</u>	<u>Length</u>
Booth Street	No vehicles except public service vehicles and especially adapted coaches to enter Booth Street from High Street, Lees (A669)

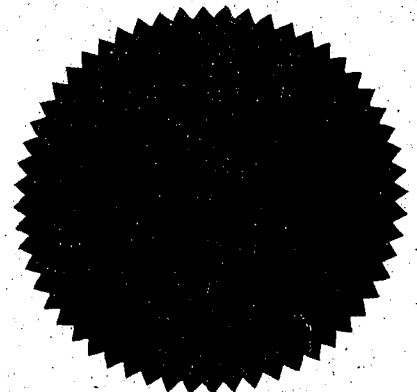
