OLDHAM BOROUGH COUNCIL

THE OLDHAM - COLLINGE STREET (SHAW) DOCTORS PARKING PLACE AND AMENDMENT EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2000

The Oldham Borough Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 9 and 10 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on the 27th March 2000 and may be cited as the Oldham Collinge Street (Shaw) Doctors Parking Place and Amendment Experimental Order 2000 and will continue in force until 26th March 2001.
- 2. The Oldham (Lancashire County Council) (Central Area of Shaw Crompton) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1965 shall have effect as though the entry in Schedule 1 hereto was deleted therefrom and substituted with the entries contained in Schedule 2 hereto.
- 3. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the length of road specified in Column 1 to Schedule 3 hereto unless that vehicle is a medical doctors vehicle not exceeding 3.5 tonnes and which is displaying in the relevant position a valid doctors parking permit issued by the Council.
- 4. (1) Any medical doctor who is the owner of a motor vehicle the maximum gross weight of which does not exceed 3.5 tonnes or a motor cycle may apply to the Council for the issue to him of a permit in respect of the vehicle and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council and shall include the information required by such form.
 - (2) The Council may at any time require an applicant for a permit to produce to an Officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a permit to be made to them as they may reasonably require to verify any information given to them.

On receipt of an application made under the foregoing provisions of this article the Council upon being satisfied that the doctor is the owner of a vehicle of the class specified in paragraph 1 of this Article, may issue to that applicant one permit for the leaving of the vehicle to which such permit relates by the owner of such vehicle or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the owner other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward in the highway referred to in Column 1 to Schedule 3 hereto.

- 5. (1) A permit holder may surrender a permit to the Council at any time and shall surrender a permit to the Council on the occurrence of any of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article.
 - (2) The Council may, by notice in writing served on the permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the permit or at any other address believed to be that person's residence, withdraw a permit if it appears to the Council that any one of the events set out in paragraph 3(a), (b) or (c) of this Article has occurred and the permit holder shall surrender the permit to the Council within 48 hours of the receipt of such notice.
 - (3) The events referred to in the foregoing provisions of this Article are:-
 - (a) the permit holder ceasing to be a medical doctor;

- (b) the permit holder ceasing to be the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the permit was issued;
- the vehicle in respect of which such permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of the class specified in Article 4 of this Order;
- (d) the issue of a duplicate permit by the Council under the provisions of Article 6 of this Order.
- (4) A permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period specified thereon or on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article, whichever is the earlier.
- (5) The Council may at any time require a permit holder to produce to an Officer of the Council such evidence in respect of any permit issued by them as they may reasonably require.
- 6. (1) If a permit is mutilated or defaced or the figures or particulars on it have become illegible or the colour of the permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the permit holder shall surrender it to the Council and may apply for a duplicate permit.
 - (2) If a permit is lost or destroyed, the permit holder may apply to the Council for the issue to him of a duplicate permit and the Council, upon being satisfies as to such loss or destruction, shall issue a duplicate permit so marked.
 - (3) The provisions of this Order shall apply to a duplicate permit.
- 7. A permit shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:-
 - (a) the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the permit has been issued;
 - (b) the period during which subject to the provisions of Article 5(4) of this Order the permit shall remain valid;
 - (c) an authentication that the permit has been issued by the Council.
- 8. At all times during which a vehicle is left in the highway referred to in Column 1 of Schedule 3 hereto there shall be displayed on the front or nearside of the vehicle a valid permit issued in respect of that vehicle so that all the particulars referred to in Article 7 of this Order are readily visible from the front or nearside of the vehicle.
- 9. Where a permit has been displayed on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 8 of this Order, no person, not being the driver of a vehicle, shall remove the permit from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver of the vehicle.
- 10. The Council shall:-

- (a) cause the limits of the area referred to in Column 1 to Schedule 3 hereto to be indicated on the carriageway by placing and maintaining thereon the appropriate traffic signs;
- (b) carry out such work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of this section of highway.

- 11. The driver of a doctor's vehicle shall not use the highway specified in Column 1 to Schedule 3 hereto so as to unreasonably prevent access to any premises adjoining the road or the use of the road by any other person or so as to be a nuisance.
- 12. The driver of a doctor's vehicle using the highway specified in Column 1 to Schedule 3 hereto shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position within the area and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the area.
- 13. No person shall use a doctor's vehicle whilst it is in the highway specified in Column 1 to Schedule 3 hereto in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the highway or in accordance with the selling or offering for hire of his or her skill or services.
- 14. Subject to the proviso hereto, when a doctor's vehicle is left in the highway specified in Column 1 to Schedule 3 hereto in contravention of any of the provisions contained herein an authorised person may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from the highway provided that when a vehicle is waiting in contravention of the provisions of this Order, an authorised person may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with that provision.
- Any person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of the last preceding article of this Order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he or she may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he or she may consider necessary to enable him or her to move it or alter its position as the case may be.
- 16. When a person removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from the specified highway by virtue of Article 14 of this Order he or she shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

SCHEDULE 2

No Waiting 7am to 6pm Monday to Saturday

The north west side of Collinge Street from its junction with Rochdale Road for a distance of 10 metres in a south westerly direction.

The north west side of Collinge Street from a point 16 metres south west of its junction with Rochdale Road to its junction with Kershaw Street.

The south east side of Collinge Street from its junction with Kershaw Street to its junction with Rochdale Road.
