## **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**

## THE OLDHAM – QUEBEC STREET & WADDINGTON STREET PROHIBITION OF WAITING EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2016

The Oldham Borough Council have today made an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the effect of which is to:-

Remove the 'at any time' waiting restrictions on both sides of Quebec Street from its junction with Featherstall Road North to its junction with Waddington Street and on the south east side of Waddington Street from its junction with Osborne Street to a point 10 metres north east of its junction with Quebec Street

Introduce 'at any time' waiting restrictions on the south side of Quebec Street from its junction with Featherstall Road North to its junction with Waddington Street and on the north side of Quebec Street from its junction with Waddington Street for a distance of 17 metres in a south easterly direction and on the north side of Quebec Street from a point 27 metres south east of its junction with Waddington Street to a point 44 metres south east of its junction with Featherstall Road North to a point 44 metres south east of its junction with Waddington Street and on the south east side of Waddington Street from its junction with Osborne Street to a point 15 metres south west of its junction with Quebec Street and on the south east side of Waddington Street from a point 5 metres south west of its junction with Quebec Street to a point 10 metres north east of its junction with Quebec Street

Introduce Limited Waiting on Monday to Friday 8am to 6pm where a vehicle can wait for a maximum of 2 hours with a period of 3 hours to elapse before a vehicle can return on the north side of Quebec Street from a point 17 metres south east of its junction with Waddington Street for a distance of 10 metres in a south easterly direction and on the north side of Quebec Street from a point 44 metres south east of its junction with Waddington Street for a distance of 22 metres in a south easterly direction and on the south east side of Waddington Street from a point 5 metres south west of its junction with Quebec Street for a distance of 10 metres in a south westerly direction and on the south east side of Waddington Street from a point 10 metres north east of its junction with

The Order will come into operation on 3rd February 2016 for a period of 18 months.

The Executive Director, Cooperatives and Neighbourhoods for Oldham Borough Council or any person authorised by him, if it appears to him or that person to be essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic, and after:-

- (i) consulting the Chief Constable of Greater Manchester Police, and
- (ii) giving such public notice as the Secretary of State may direct.

may make modifications of any description to this Order (other than additions) or suspend it.

The Council will consider in due course whether or not to continue the Order in force indefinitely. Within a period of 6 months from the coming into force of this Order any person may object to the making of an Order for the purposes of such indefinite continuation.

Appropriate exemptions are included in the Order.

Any such objections should be sent to Director of Legal Services, Oldham Council, Civic Centre, West Street, Oldham OL1 1UL in writing, stating the title of the Order to which they relate and the grounds for making them.

The Order and a map showing the length of road referred to and a Statement of the Council's Reasons for making the Order may be examined at my office between the hours of 8.40am and 5.00pm Mondays to Fridays (Civic Entrance Tel. 0161 770 4836 Ref: LJM/TO15/38) during the objection period.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from the date hereof apply to the High Court for the purpose.
