ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (THE WATERSIDE, OXFORD) (CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE) (VARIATION NO 1) ORDER 2007

The Oxfordshire County Council ("the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 45 and 46 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of schedule 9 to the Act, make the following Order:-

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on 30 May 2007 and may be cited as the Oxfordshire County Council (The Waterside, Oxford) (Controlled Parking Zone) (Variation No 1) Order 2007
- 2. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the following meanings -
 - (1) Any reference in this Order to any enactment (meaning any act and any subordinate legislation as defined in the Interpretation Act 1978) shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended or replaced by any subsequent enactment
 - (2) Words importing the masculine gender shall also include the feminine gender and words in the singular include the plural and vice versa
- 3. The City of Oxford (The Waterside) (Controlled Parking Zone) Order 2001 ("the Waterside CPZ Order") is amended in the manner and to the extent specified in the Schedule to this Order

SCHEDULE

INDEX LINKING

- In Article 3 the following definition is inserted:
 "index linked" means adjusted as provided in Schedule 6 to this Order.
- Schedule 6 is inserted as follows:

"SCHEDULE 6

Index Linking

- 1. Index linking will be undertaken by adjusting the relevant charge according to the fluctuation of the Retail Prices Index: monthly numbers of retail prices produced by the Office for National Statistics occurring between April 2007 and the most recently published figure at the month of March in the year in which the adjustment is undertaken, and rounding up or down to the nearest whole pound.
- 2. The relevant charge will be adjusted from 1 April of the year in which the indexation adjustment is undertaken.
- The relevant charge will be subject to indexation adjustment no more than once in every 3 years and the first adjustment will take place from April 2010."

Visitors' Parking Permits

- 1. In Article 3 the following is added at the end of the definition of "resident" "and including a resident (short term) being a person who is temporarily resident for work purposes at such an address and who has established this to the satisfaction of the Council but for the avoidance of doubt excluding a person who is resident for study purposes."
- 2. The following is inserted at the end of Article 20 (1): "and the following charges shall apply
 - (a) The first allocation of visitor's permits (25 days worth) issued to a resident for use during a year (commencing on 1 September) will be free of charge.
 - (b) The charge for the second allocation of visitor's permits (25 days worth) issued to a resident for use during such year and valid at any time from and including 1 September 2007 is £15 index linked but this shall be reduced to nil where the Council is satisfied that the resident is aged 70 years or older.
 - (c) The charge for any additional discretionary visitor's permits valid at any time from and including 1 September 2007 is 60 pence per permit index linked but the Council may waive the charge and shall waive the charge where the resident is aged 70 years or more."
- 3. In line 1 of Article 20(4) the following is inserted after the word "Article": "and a remittance for the appropriate charge specified in Part 1 of this Article."
- 4. The following is inserted at the beginning of Article 20(5) instead of "No resident": "No resident (short-term) will be entitled to more than 25 days worth of visitors' permits and no other resident".
- 5. Article 20 (6) is replaced by the following:
 "The Council may in its absolute discretion issue to a resident more than the equivalent of 50 days worth of visitor's permits in any year if it is satisfied, upon consideration of such supporting evidence as the Council may require, that to do so would be appropriate in the circumstances."

- 6. The following is inserted at the end of Article 21 (1):
 "provided that the Council may revise visitor's permits so that each visitor's permit will be valid for a period of up to 24 hours from the validation time provided that it is validated by the resident, or by a person authorised by him, by writing in ink on the face of the visitor's permit (or by such other means as the Council may direct) the time of day the vehicle is left in the parking Space using the 24 hour clock (being the validation time) and the date on which it is left (being the validation date) in the permit holder's parking place and that no other writing or marks appear on the permit."
- 7. In line 4 of Article 21 (2) the following is inserted after the word "permits": "and a remittance for the appropriate charge specified in Article 20 (1)."
- 8. Article 22 (6) is inserted as follows:

 "(6)On the surrender of any blank visitor's permit, for which payment has been made, the Council will issue a refund at the rate of 60p per blank visitor's permit."
- Article 23 (3) is inserted as follows:
 "(3) No charge shall be payable for a duplicate permit."
- 10. Article 26(3) is inserted as follows:"(3) There will be no refund of the charge paid for any permit withdrawn or surrendered further to this Article."

Charging for Discretionary Permits for Contractors

- 1 In line 3 of Article 6(c) the words 'or adjacent to' are deleted
- 2 In line 2 of Article 8 the following is inserted after the words "a parking attendant":
 - ", the Council"
- 3 Article 17 (3) (d) is inserted as follows:

 "(c) if this is permitted by a parking attendant, the Council or a police officer in uniform, and where the Council, in the exercise of such discretion, agrees to authorise the use of any permit holders' parking place by a vehicle in connection with works at premises in the area stated in Schedule 1 to this Order, from and including 16 June 2007 the charge for such authorisation will be £15 index linked."
