

THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH (MORICE TOWN) (ONE WAY) ORDER 2004

The Council of the City of Plymouth (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:

This Order shall come into force on the 29th March 2004 and may be cited as The City Of Plymouth (Morice Town) (One Way) Order 2004.

1. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in any road specified in the schedule, for that length specified other than in the direction specified in the Schedule to this Order.
2. Nothing in this Order shall apply to:-
 - a) Any vehicle on an occasion when it is being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or Police purposes if the observance of any provision of this Order would be likely to hinder the use of the vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion;
 - b) Anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a Traffic Warden.
