THE PORTSMOUTH CITY COUNCIL (MILE END ROAD) (BUS LANE REDUCTION) (NO.94) ORDER 2016

The Portsmouth City Council (hereinafter referred to as 'the Council'), in exercise of the powers under sections 1 - 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ('the Act'), as amended by the Road Traffic Act 1991 ("the 1991 Act"), the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996, and all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following order:-

- 1. Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this order.
- 2. The order specified in Schedule 1 shall have effect subject to the amendments specified below the said order in the said Schedule.
- 3. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act, or by or under any enactment.
- 4. This Order may be cited as The Portsmouth City Council (Mile End Road) (Bus Lane Reduction) (No 94) Order 2016 and shall come into operation on the 22 February 2017.

AMENDMENT TO EXISTING ORDER

- 1. The Portsmouth City Council (Consolidated) (Bus, Taxi and Cycle Lanes and Prohibition of Driving Except Buses, Taxis and Cycles) (No.17) Order 2016
 - a) Amend Item 15 in Schedule 1 relating to Mile End Road to read:
 - 15. MILE END ROAD Southbound, the area bounded by;
 - (i) the eastern edge of the southbound carriageway from a point 40 metres south of Rudmore Roundabout to the junction with Havisham Road and,
 - (ii) a single white line on the same side of the road as that edge.

Reason for Making the Order

To make permanent the provision of experimental order 33/2015, which reduced the bus lane in Mile End Road between Havisham Road and Church Street roundabout, for the purpose of reducing congestion into Portsmouth.
