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THE BOROUGH OF PEADING (TOWN CENTRE AREA) (WAITING RESTRICTIONS AND MOVEMENT CONTROL) ORDER 2000

The Reading Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "The Council"), pursuant to its powers under Sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 4(2), 32(1), 35(1) and 124 of The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (The Act Of 1984) and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby make the

PART I GENERAL

1. Definitions

In this Order: -

"Authorised Cab Rank" means any area of carriageway which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with Diagram 1028.2 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions, 1994;

"Authorised Parking Place" means any parking place on a road authorised cr designated by an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984;

"Authorised Officer" means the Head of Planning and Transport for The Council, or any other officer to be designated by The Council;

"Authorised vehicle" means a vehicle in respect of which a current vehicle special access permit has been issued by the Authorised Officer;

"Bus" has the same meaning as in Regulation 22 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1994;

"Bus Lane" has the same meaning as in Regulation 23 of the Traffic Signs and General Directions 1994;

"Bus Stand" means any area of carriageway in any of the lengths of road or side of roads specified in the Twenty Fourth Schedule to this order, intended for the waiting of Buses which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1025.1 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations General Directions, 1994 with the words "Bus Stand" instead of Bus Stop.

"Bus Stop Clearway" means any area of carriageway in any of the lengths of roads specified in the Twenty-First Schedule to this Order, intended for the waiting of buses, which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with either Diagram 1025.1, or Diagram 1025.3 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions, 1994;

"Carriageway" means a way constituting or comprised in a highway being a way (other than a cycle track) over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles;

"Cycle Lane" means the length of road specified in this Order as a cycle lane and bounded by delineating road markings as described under The Traffic Sign Regulations and General Directions, 1994...

"Disabled Person's Badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations, 1982 (as amended);

- (i) this Order or another Order shall be construed as such a reference to this Order or, as the case may be, such other Order, as the same may have been or may from time to time be amended, varied or supplemented;
- (ii) a Statute or Regulations shall be construed as reference to such Statute or Regulations as the same may have been, or may from time to time be amended or re-enacted.
- (iii) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

PART II WAITING OF VEHICLES

- 5. Save as provided in Articles 8 and 9 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in Uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait:-
 - (1) At any time in the lengths of roads specified in the First, Second and Third Schedules.
 - (2) On any day other than Sunday between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. in the lengths of roads specified in the Fifth Schedule for a longer period than two hours or, if a period of less than two hours has elapsed since a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road.
 - (3) On any day other than Sunday between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. in the lengths of roads specified in the Sixth Schedule for a longer period than one hour or, if a period of less than one hour has elapsed since a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road.
 - (4) At any time in the lengths of roads specified in the Twentieth Schedule, except for Motor Cycles.
 - (5) At any time in the lengths of roads specified in the Eighteenth Schedule, except for Police Vehicles.
 - (6) On any day other than Sunday between the hours of 7.00 am and 6.00 pm to wait in the length of roads referred to in the Twenty Fifth Schedule or to load or unload on any day other than Sunday between 7.30 am 9.30 am and 4.00 pm 6.00 pm in the same lengths of roads.
 - (7) On any day other than a Sunday to wait between the hours of 7.00 am and 6.00 pm in the lengths of roads referred to in the Twenty Sixth Schedule.
- 6. (1) No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle, other than a bus, to stop or wait in a bus stop clearway as specified in the Twenty First Schedule.
 - (2) No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle other than a Bus to stop and wait on a Bus Stand as specified in the Twenty Fourth Schedule.

- (3) No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle, other than a Hackney Carriage to stop or wait in the lengths of roads specified in the Nineteenth Schedule.
- 7. No person shall except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait other than to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded at that time in the lengths of road specified in the Tenth Schedule during the times referred to in the said Schedule.
- 8. Nothing in Article 5 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:
 - a. A person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - b. The vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) Building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) The maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of roads; or
 - (iv) The laying, erection, alteration or repair in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication system as defined in the Telecommunications Act, 1984;
 - c. The vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a Local Authority or a Water Authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - d. The vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act, 1953;
 - e. The vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads;
 - f. The vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral; or
 - g. The vehicle to be used for Fire Brigade, Ambulance or Police purposes.
- 9. (1) Nothing in Article 5 shall render it unlawful, to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle at any time on any day, in the lengths of roads specified in the Third Schedule, or at any time except between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. and 6.00 p.m. in the lengths of roads specified in the Second Schedule.
 - (2) Nothing in Article 5 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for as long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle, Monday to Saturday at ant time except between the hours of 7.30am 9.30am and 4.00pm 6.00pm in the lengths of roads specified in the Twenty Fifth

Schedule and Monday to Saturday at any time in the lengths of roads specified in the Twenty Sixth Schedule.

- (3) Nothing in Article 5 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle:
 - a. To wait upon an authorised parking place; or
 - b. Being a Hackney Carriage, to wait upon an authorised cab rank; or
 - c. To wait for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to be used in the provision of a local service within the meaning of the Transport Act, 1985.
- (4) Nothing in Article 5 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Person's Vehicle which displays in the relevant position a Disabled Person's Badge to wait:-
 - (a) In the lengths of roads specified in the Second and Third Schedules for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road on the same day), provided that the Disabled Person's Vehicle also displays, in the relevant position, a Parking Disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began), and provided that, insofar as the lengths of roads specified in the Second Schedule are concerned, such period lies entirely within the period during which the exemption as to loading and unloading specified in Paragraph (1) of this Article applies.
 - (b) in the lengths of roads specified in the Fifth and Sixth, Schedules, at any time on any day.
- 10. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause any vehicle to wait at any time in the lengths of roads specified in the Thirteenth Schedule except for vehicles displaying in the relevant position a Disabled Person's badge subject to the following provisions;

Vehicles displaying a Disabled Person's Badge may not wait for a longer period than four hours or, if a period of less than two hours has elapsed since a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road.

PART III AUTHORISATION AND USE OF PARKING PLACES

- 11. (1) The lengths of roads specified in Column 1 of the Eleventh and Twenty-Third Schedule are authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as parking places for the parking, during the permitted hours and in such positions as are specified in the said Schedule, of a vehicle, displaying in the relevant position, a valid Permit issued by the Council;
 - (2) The lengths of roads specified in column 1 of the Forty Sixth Schedule are authorised to be used, subject to the provisions of this order, as Parking places for the parking at any time and in such positions as specified in the schedule, of a vehicle displaying in the relevant position a valid Business Permit issued by the Council.

- (3) Nothing in Paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Article shall restrict the power of the Council to close a parking place.
- 12. Where in the Eleventh, Twenty Third and Forty Sixth Schedule a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the parking place unless it is:
 - a. of the specified class; or, as the case may be
 - b. in the specified position;
 - c. and displays a current Parking Permit issued by the Council.
- 13. A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place:
 - a. So as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by any other person, or so as to be a nuisance;
 - b. When the Council, or a Police Constable in Uniform or a Traffic Warden has closed the parking place.
- 14. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in, or to depart from, the parking place.
- 15. No person shall use a vehicle, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place, or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services.
- 16. When a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in Article 12 or Article 13, a Police Constable in Uniform or a Traffic Warden or a person authorised by the Council to do so may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from the parking place. Provided that when a vehicle is waiting in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 12(b), a Police Constable in Uniform or a Traffic Warden or a person authorised by the Council to do so may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle so that its position shall comply with that provision.
- 17. Any person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of Article 16 may do so in such manner as he thinks necessary.
- 18. When a Police Constable in Uniform or a Traffic Warden or a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by virtue of Article 16, he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

PART IV PERMITS

19. (1) Any Business who is the owner of a passenger vehicle, goods vehicle, am invalid carriage or a motor cycle may apply to the council for the issue of a Business permit for the parking of that vehicle in a parking place described in the Forty Sixth Schedule to this order and any such application shall be made on a form issued and obtained from the council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form.

- The Council may at any time require an applicant for a permit or may require a permit holder to produce to an officer of the council such evidence in respect of the application or the permit as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them, or to verify that the permit is valid.
- (3) The Council upon being satisfied that an applicant is a Business user and is the owner of a vehicle of a class specified in paragraph (1) of this Article may issue to that applicant one permit for the parking during the permitted hours in a parking place of the vehicle to which such a permit relates by the owner or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the owner (Other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward).
- (4) A permit shall only be valid permit for use in the Parking area indicated by the code shown in column 2 of the Forty Seventh Schedule.
- (5) The Council may at the Discretion of the Authorised Officer issue a Business Permit in respect of those roads or parts of roads specified in the Forty Sixth Schedule.
- (6) The Council may at any time require the applicant for a Business permit or a Business permit holder to produce to the officer of the Council such evidence in respect of the application as they may reasonable require to verify that the Business permit is valid.
- 20. (1) A permit holder may surrender such permit to the Council at any time and shall surrender such permit to the Council on the occurrence of any of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article.
 - (2) The Council may, by notice in writing served on the permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the permit, or at any other address believed to be that persons residence, withdraw a permit if it appears to the council that any of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article have occurred, and the permit holder shall surrender the permit to the Council within 48 hours of the receipt of the said notice.
 - (3) The events referred to in the foregoing provisions of this Article are :-
 - (i) The permit holder ceasing to be in business.
 - (ii) The permit holder ceasing to be the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the permit was issued.
 - (iii) The vehicle in respect of which such permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of a class specified in Article 19.
 - (iv) The issue of a duplicate permit by the Council under the provisions of Article 29.
 - (v) The expiry of the period for which the permit was issued.

- 21. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of Article 20, a Business permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period specified thereon (Which period shall not exceed a period of 12 months from the end of the month during which it first became valid) or on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of Article 20 whichever is earlier.
- 22. (1) Any resident who is the owner of a passenger vehicle, goods vehicle an invalid carriage or a motor cycle, may apply to the Council for the issue of a permit for the parking of that vehicle in a parking place and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtained from the Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form.
 - (2) The Council may at any time require an applicant for a permit or may require a permit holder to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of the application or the permit as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them, or to verify that the permit is valid.
 - (3) The Council, upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident and is the owner of a vehicle of a class specified in paragraph (1) of this Article, may issue to the applicant one permit for the parking during the permitted hours in a parking place of the vehicle to which such permit relates by the owner or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the owner (other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward).
 - (4) A resident shall not be entitled to be in possession of more than one Permit at any one time.
 - (5) A permit shall only be a valid Permit for use in the parking area indicated by the code shown in column 2 of the Twelfth Schedule.
- 23. (1) Each of the parts of a road specified in column 1 of the Seventeenth Schedule is authorised to be used as a doctors parking place by any fully registered person to whom the Council has issued a Doctors Parking Place Permit.
 - (2) Any fully registered person may apply to the Council for the issue of a Doctors Parking Place Permit in respect of each vehicle which shall be specified in the application and any such application shall be made on a form issued and obtained from the Council and shall include the particular information and authentication required by such form to be supplied.
 - (3) The Council may at any time require the applicant for a Doctors Parking Place Permit or may require a Doctors Parking Place Permit holder to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of the application or the Permit as they may reasonable require to verify any particulars or information given to them or to verify that the Doctors Parking Place Permit is valid.
 - (4) Upon receipt of an application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this Article, the Council may issue to the applicant a Doctors Parking Place Permit for the leaving at any time in the Doctors Parking Place specified thereon of such vehicles as they are satisfied are used by fully registered persons who are liable to be called if necessity, to emergencies away from the surgery or consulting room shown on such application to the extent that the need for special parking arrangements is justified and to whom no suitable alternative parking facility is available within a reasonable distance.

- 24. Notwithstanding the provisions contained in Article 22 the Council may also grant Permits to such other persons as they may think fit.
- 25. (1) The Council may, at the discretion of the Authorised Officer, issue a Special Access Permit in respect of those roads listed in the Sixteenth Schedule to this order;
 - (2) The Council may, at any time, require an applicant for a Special Access Permit or may require a Special Access Permit Holder to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of the application or the Special Access Permit as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them or to verify that the Special Access Permit is valid;
- 26. (1) A Permit holder, (whether of a Resident's Parking Place Permit or a Doctors' Parking Place Permit or a Special Access Permit) may surrender such Permit to the Council at any time and shall surrender such Permit to the Council on the occurrence of any of the events set out in Paragraph (3) of this Article;
 - (2) The Council may, by notice in writing, served on the Permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the permit, or at any other address believed to be that person's residence, withdraw a Permit if it appears to the Council that any of the events set out in Paragraph (3) of this Article have occurred, and the Permit holder shall surrender the Permit to the Council within 48 hours of the receipt of the said notice;
 - (3) The events referred to in the foregoing provisions of this Article are:-
 - (1) In the case of a person holding a Residents' Parking Place Permit:
 - a. The Permit holder ceasing to be a resident;
 - b. The Permit holder ceasing to be the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the Permit was issued;
 - c. The vehicle in respect of which such Permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of a class specified in Article 21;
 - d. The issue of a duplicate by the Council under the provisions of Article 29; or
 - e. The expiry of the period for which the Permit was issued.
 - (2) In the case of a fully registered person holding a Doctor's Parking Place Permit:-
 - (a) The vehicle or any vehicle in respect of which the permit was issued ceasing to be used by a fully registered person who is liable to be called, of necessity, to emergencies away from the surgery or consulting room shown on the application for that permit to the extent that the need for special parking arrangements can be justified;
 - (b) The revocation of the designation of the parking place in respect of which the permit was issued;

- (c) The issue of a revised permit or a duplicate permit by the Council under the provisions of Article 29;
- (3) In the case of a person holding a Special Access Permit where the Authorised Officer considers that the vehicle is no longer reasonably required for the purpose of access to the roads set out in the Sixteenth Schedule;
- 27. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of Article 26, a Permit (whether a Residents' Parking Place Permit or a Doctor's Parking Place Permit or a Special Access Permit) shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period specified thereon (which period shall not exceed a period of 24 months from the end of the month during which it first became valid) or on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in Paragraph (3) of Article 26, whichever is the earlier.
- 28. (1) The holder of a Doctors' Parking Place Permit may at any time apply to the Council for a permit issued to him to be amended so as to relate to any other vehicle, being a vehicle which is used by a fully registered person who is liable to be called, of necessity, to emergencies away from the surgery or consulting room shown on the application for that permit to the extent that the need for special parking arrangements can be justified.
 - (2) Upon receipt of an application pursuant to Paragraph (1) and of the relevant permit, the Council may amend the permit accordingly, or to such extent as they think fit, or, at their discretion, issue a revised permit, and if a revised permit is so issued, the permit shall become invalid and shall be surrendered to the Council.
- 29. (1) If a Permit (whether a Residents' Parking Place Permit or a Doctor's Parking Place Permit or a Special Access Permit or a Business Permit):
 - a) Is accidentally mutilated or defaced or the figures or particulars thereon have become illegible or the colour of the Permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the Permit holder shall surrender it to the Council and apply to the Council for the issue of a duplicate Permit, whereupon the Council shall issue a duplicate Permit so marked and the original Permit shall forthwith become invalid;
 - b) Is lost or destroyed, the Permit holder may apply to the Council for the issue to him of a duplicate Permit and the Council, upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction, shall issue a duplicate permit so marked and the original Permit shall forthwith become invalid;
 - (2) All the provisions of this Order shall apply to a duplicate Permit to the same extent as they applied to the original Permit.
- 30. A Permit (whether a Residents' Parking Place Permit or a Doctor's Parking Place Permit or a Special Access Permit or a Business Permit) shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:
 - a) The registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the Permit has been issued;
 - b) The period during which, subject to the provisions of Article 21, the Permit shall remain valid;
 - c) An authentication that the Permit has been issued by the Council.

- d) A Code indicating the Parking Area for which the Permit is valid
- 31. At all times during which a vehicle is left in a parking place during the permitted hours, there shall be displayed in the relevant position a valid Permit (whether a Residents' Parking Place Permit or a Doctor's Parking Place Permit or a Special Access Permit or a Business Permit) issued in respect of that vehicle, so that all the particulars referred to in Article 30 are readily visible from outside the vehicle.
- 32. When a Permit has been displayed on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 31, no person other than a Police Constable in uniform or a Traffic Warden shall remove the Permit from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the owner of the Permit.

PART V PROHIBITED MOVEMENTS

- 33. No person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in the road or length of road specified in Column 1 of the Thirty-third Schedule of this Order in a direction other than that specified in column 2 in relation to that length of road.
- 34. No person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or a Traffic Warden, drive or cause or permit to be driven, any vehicle in the roads or parts of roads shown in the Thirty-seventh Schedule, except for loading between midnight to 11.00am and 4.00pm to midnight.
- 35. No person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or a Traffic Warden, drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle in the roads shown in the Thirty-ninth Schedule, except for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded or unloaded from the vehicle, or access to adjacent off-street garaging.
- 36. No person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or a Traffic Warden, drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle in the roads shown in the Forty-fourth Schedule in the direction shown in column 2 of the said Schedule provided that nothing in this Article shall apply to any person driving or causing or permitting to be driven any bus or pedal cycle.
- 37. No person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle in the roads shown in the Forty-fifth Schedule in the direction shown in column 2 of the said Schedule provided that nothing in this Article shall apply to any person driving or causing or permitting to be driven any pedal cycle.
- 38. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in the roads shown in the Thirty-Fourth Schedule the height of which exceeds the height shown in Second column of the said Schedule.
- 39. No person shall cause any vehicle, proceeding in a road specified in column 1 of the Thirty-second Schedule to make a right hand turn into the road specified in relation to that road in column 2 of the said schedule.
- 40. No person shall cause any vehicle, proceeding in a road specified in column 1 of the Thirty-first Schedule to make a left hand turn into the road specified in relation to that road in column 2 of the said schedule.
- 41. No person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle other than a bus or

pedal cycle to enter, proceed or wait in the bus lane shown in the Thirty-sixth Schedule.

- 42. No person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any bus or pedal cycle to proceed along a bus lane, otherwise than in the direction specified in column 3 of the Thirty-sixth Schedule.
- 43. No person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle proceeding along a bus lane in accordance with Article 42 to cross over the white line unless it is necessary to do so in order to overtake a vehicle which is stationary in the bus lane.
- 44. Nothing in Article 36 shall prevent any person causing or permitting any vehicle to enter or proceed in any roads shown in the Forty fourth schedule in so far as such entry is absolutely necessary to enable that vehicle to be used for the removal of any bus or to effect emergency repairs to a disabled bus so as to relieve any obstruction to those lengths of roads shown in column 2 of that schedule
- 45. Nothing in Article 41 shall prevent any person causing or permitting any vehicle to enter or proceed in a bus lane in the direction specified in the Thirty-sixth Schedule as the case may be, insofar as such entry or proceeding is absolutely necessary, to enable the vehicle to be used for any of the purposes set out hereunder or to wait in the bus lane for so long as may be necessary for any of those purposes:
 - a) the removal of any vehicle or to effect emergency repairs to a Disabled vehicle in the bus lane so as to relieve any obstruction.
 - b) Police, Fire Brigade or Ambulance purposes; or
 - c) the service of any local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; or in connection with the supply of gas or electricity, or any telecommunications system as defined in the Telecommunications Act, 1984.
- 46. Nothing in Article 41 shall prevent any person causing or permitting any vehicle:-
 - To enter a bus lane for any of the purposes set out in paragraphs (a) to (d) below, by crossing the white line, at a point opposite that person's destination, or a point as close as possible to that point, (and, insofar as the bus lane specified in the Thirty Sixth Schedule is concerned, in such a way that, on completion of the entry of the vehicle into the bus lane, the vehicle is facing the opposite direction to that specified in the Thirty-sixth Schedule) provided that such entry is absolutely necessary:
 - the gaining of access to off-street loading or garaging premises adjacent to or accessible only from the bus lane;
 - (ii) the loading or unloading of any goods or burden at these premises adjacent to or accessible only from the bus lane; provided that such loading or unloading can reasonably be carried out only from the bus lane and that it takes place only whilst no prohibition on loading or unloading in the bus lane by virtue of any other order is in force;
 - (iii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic in the bus lane; or
 - b) In the service of any local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; or in connection with the supply of gas or electricity, or any telecommunications system as defined in the

Telecommunications Act, 1984 from entering a bus lane.

- c) having entered a bus lane in accordance with (a) above, to wait therein for the purposes set out in (i), (ii) and (iii);
- d) having entered a bus lane in accordance with (a) above, to leave the bus lane by crossing the white line at a point as close as possible to the point of entry.
- 47. No person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle other than a pedal cycle to enter, proceed or wait in the length of roads specified in the Thirty-eighth Schedule.
- 48. No person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, drive or cause or permit to be driven any articulated vehicle or vehicle with a gross weight in excess of 10 tonnes in the roads shown in the Thirty-fifth Schedule.
- 49. Nothing in Article 48 shall apply to any bus.
- 50. No person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle in the roads shown in the Forty-third Schedule in the direction shown in column 2 of the said Schedule provided that nothing in this Article shall apply to any person driving or causing or permitting to be driven any bus, hackney carriage or cycle, Permit holder and for loading and unloading 11.00am 4.00pm Monday to Saturday.
- 51. No person shall, except upon the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle in the roads shown in the Forty-second Schedule, between 11.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. Monday to Sunday provided that nothing in this Article shall apply to any person driving or causing or permitting to be driven any bus, hackney carriage, pedal cycle, Authorised Vehicle or any Disabled Person's vehicle.
- 52. Save as provided in Article 53, no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle in the part of Station Hill shown in the fortieth schedule.
- 53. Nothing in Article 52 shall apply to:
 - a) Any bus;
 - b) Any hackney carriage;
 - c) Any goods vehicle for the purpose of loading or unloading between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 4. p.m. and 6 p.m. to 7.30 a.m.;
- 54. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter the part of Station Hill other than via the western entrance as shown in the thirty third schedule.
- 55. No person shall, accept on the direction of a Police Constable in uniform or of Traffic Warden, drive or cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle in the roads shown in the Forty-first Schedule, provided that nothing in this Article shall apply to any person driving or causing or permitting to be driven any vehicle or for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded or unloaded from any vehicle, and for access to off street garaging.
- 56. Nothing in the foregoing provisions of Articles 35, 35, 36, 39, 40, 42, 43, 48, 51, 52, and 61 shall apply to any Vehicle which is being used for

Police, Fire Brigade or Ambulance purposes

- 57. Nothing in the foregoing provisions of Articles 35, 51, and 55 shall apply to:
 - a) Any vehicle which is to be used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any lengths or road, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near any of the lengths of road of any sewer or main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or telegraph line;
 - b) Any purpose-built cash/bullion vehicle operated by security personnel and being used for the purposes of cash/bullion deliveries;
 - c) A vehicle, other than a privately-owned vehicle, which is being used as an official vehicle for the purpose of a funeral;
 - d) A vehicle being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory duties.
- 58. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle, other than a Disabled Badge holders vehicle to enter roads or parts of roads as specified in column 1 and 2 of the Forty Eighth Schedule
- 59. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or of a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle to enter the roads specified in the Twenty-ninth Schedule.
- 60. No person shall cause any vehicle, the width of which, inclusive of any load on the vehicle, exceeds 2 metres, to enter or leave the roads specified in the Thirtieth Schedule.
- 61. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle other than a Bus, Hackney Carriage or Cycle to enter the roads listed in column 1 of the Forty Ninth Schedule in the direction shown in column 2 of that Schedule.
- 62. No person shall cause any vehicle other than a pedal cycle proceeding in the roads shown in column 1 of the Twenty Seventh Schedule to make a left turn into the roads specified in relation to that road as shown in column 2 of the said schedule.

PART VI REVOCATION OF TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDERS

63. The parts of the Order specified in The Fiftieth Schedule are hereby revoked.

PART VII IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ORDER

64. This Order which shall come into operation on 215tteby 02792000 and may be cited as "The Borough of Reading (Town Centre Area) (Waiting Restrictions and Movement Control) Order 2000.
