THE BOROUGH OF READING (CIVIL ENFORCEMENT AREA) (WAITING RESTRICTIONS REVIEW 2023B) ORDER 2025

The Reading Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "The Council"), pursuant to its powers under Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 32, 35, 45 and 46 to The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (The Act of 1984) and Part IV of Schedule 9 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:

PART I

CITATION

1. This Order shall come into operation on 10 February 2025 and may be cited as "The Borough of Reading (Civil Enforcement Area) (Waiting Restrictions Review 2023B) Order 2025.

INTERPRETATION

2. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

Ambulance	has the same meaning as in the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994;
At Any Time	means all days and all hours;
Authorised agent	means an employee or agent of the Council authorised to exercise all or any of the functions of the Council under this Order;
Authorised Vehicle	means a Vehicle which has been authorised by Reading Borough Council.
Board and Alight	means Waiting for a person to Board or Alight from a Vehicle other than a Public Service Vehicle provided that no such Vehicle Waits for so long only as may be required to enable Waiting passengers or disabled person to Board or Alight the Vehicle;
Carriageway	means a way constituting or comprised in a highway, being in a way over which the public has a right of way for the passage of Vehicles;
Civil Enforcement Officer	has the same meaning as in section 76 of the Act of 2004;
Delivering and Collecting	means in relation to any Goods, includes checking the Goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;
Disabled Person's Badge	means a badge which was: (a) issued, or has effect as if issued, to a Disabled Person or an institution under the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 (as amended) or under Regulations having effect in Scotland or Wales under Section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970; and

Unladen Weight	means the weight of a Vehicle or trailer inclusive of the body and all parts (the heavier being taken where alternative bodies or parts are used) which are necessary to or ordinarily used with the Vehicle or trailer when working on a Road, but exclusive of the weight of water, fuel or accumulators used for the purpose of the supply of power for the propulsion of the Vehicle or, as the case may be, of any Vehicle by which the trailer is drawn, and of loose tools and loose equipment;
Verge	means any area between the edge of the Carriageway and the highway boundary, excluding the Footway;
Wait and Waiting	refers to a Vehicle stopping and remaining stationary for any period of time whether or not with the intention of parking and whether or not the Driver is in the Vehicle;

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- a. The making of this Order by the Council is done so under the duty imposed by Section 122(1) of the 1984 Act to secure the expeditious, convenient, and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic and the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on and off the highway, insofar as practicable having regard to the matters in Section 122(2) of the 1984 Act.
- b. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation made or having effect as if made under the 1984 Act or by or under any other Enactment provided that where a prohibition or restriction which is imposed, varied or revoked by this Order is in conflict with a prohibition or restriction imposed by a previous Order, then the provision of this Order shall prevail.
- c. The Interpretation Act 1978 (as amended) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- d. Any reference to a numbered article shall, unless the context requires otherwise, be construed as a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.
- e. Words importing the masculine gender shall also include the feminine gender and words in the singular include the plural and vice versa.
- f. Headings are inserted for ease of reference only and shall not affect the construction or interpretation of this Order.
- g. In the event this Order contains errors which renders any provision of it void or unenforceable, all other provisions of this Order shall continue to have effect.
- h. The plans annexed to this Order identifies the lengths of Roads subject of this Order, provided that where there is any inconsistency between the plans and the Schedules it is the wording of the Schedules that shall prevail.
- Nothing in this Order shall prevent the Council from suspending any of the restrictions within this order.

PART II PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS

4. WAITING LOADING AND UNLOADING OF VEHICLES

- 4.1 Save as is hereinafter provided no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time, on any day in the length of Roads set out in Schedule 4 of this Order.
- 4.2 Save as is hereinafter provided no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait, Load or Unload at any time, on any day on the length of Roads set out in Schedule 1 of this Order.
- 4.3 Save as is hereinafter provided no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait for a period exceeding 1 hour, with no return within 1 hour, from Monday to Saturday inclusive between 8am to 6.30pm in the length of Roads set out in Schedule 5 of this Order.
- 4.4 Save as is hereinafter provided no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any vehicle to Load for a period exceeding 40 minutes at any time, on any day on the length of Roads set out in Schedule 2 of this Order.

5 RED ROUTE NO STOPPING

5.1 Save as is hereinafter provided no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any vehicle to stop at any time, on any day in the length of Red Route set out in Schedule 3 of this Order except to load from 9.30am-4pm and again from 6pm-11pm for a period not exceeding 40 minutes.

PART III GENERAL EXEMPTIONS OF THIS ORDER

Exemptions to the Waiting Loading and Unloading provisions of this Order

- Nothing in Articles 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle to Wait during the controlled hours for the lengths of Roads or on any of the sides of Roads referred to therein, or in any part of a Parking Place, if the use of that part has not been suspended, for a period no longer than is necessary for:
 - a. a person to Board or Alight from the Vehicle:
 - b. the vehicle is an Authorised Vehicle:
 - c. the closing of any gate or other barrier at the entrance of premises to or from which the Vehicle is gaining or has gained access or egress;
 - d. the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other Road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely
 - i. building, industrial, demolition or excavation operations;
 - ii. the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - iii. the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of Road(s);
 - iv. the laying, erection, installation, alteration, removal or repair in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of Road or sides of Road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any Electronic Communications Apparatus;
 - v. the construction, installation, improvement, maintenance, repair or cleaning of any

Traffic Sign, bus stop infrastructure or other street furniture or other object lawfully placed or to be placed on, in or over the said lengths of Roads or sides of Roads;

- a Liveried Vehicle to be used for fire and rescue, Ambulance purposes or for the purpose of providing a response to an emergency at the request of an NHS Ambulance service, Blood Service, police, bomb or explosive disposal, Special Forces, Armed Forces and National Crime Agency purposes;
- f. preventing a Vehicle from proceeding by any circumstances beyond their control, where the said circumstance relates directly to the movement, or otherwise of traffic on the Road;
- g. avoiding an accident;
- h. the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other Road, to be used in the service of a local authority, the Environment Agency, a water undertaker or sewerage undertaker in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- i. a Vehicle is a Royal Mail Liveried Vehicle or is one in the service of a Universal Service Provider: (a) Delivering or Collecting or Loading or Unloading Postal Packets to or from addresses or public letter boxes in or adjacent to the Road in which the Vehicle is Waiting or (b) servicing a telephone kiosk adjacent to the Road in which the Vehicle is Waiting;
- j. the Vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of Road or sides of Road;
- k. as long as is reasonably necessary for the official wedding car(s) or an official Hearse and any other Motor Vehicle provided by the funeral director to Wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to any length of Road for the purpose of a wedding or funeral provided that the Vehicle can be reasonably be used for that purpose only from that Road;
 - the Vehicle is being used for purposes of a local authority in pursuance of statutory power duties if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other Road;
- m. a Vehicle being a recovery Vehicle and is Waiting to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of a traffic obstruction or a Vehicle which has broken down;
- n. Nothing in Article 4.1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Person's Vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Person's Badge and Parking Disc (on which the Driver, or other person in charge of the Vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of Waiting began) to Wait in any of the lengths of Road or on any of the sides of Road referred to therein for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of Waiting by the same Vehicle in the same length or on the same side of Road on the same day).
- o. The lengths of Roads specified in Schedule 5, may be used without any limit on time, subject to the provision of this Order, for the leaving during the Permitted Hours a Disabled Persons Vehicle displaying a Disabled Person's Badge in accordance with Section 12 of The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 in the Relevant Position a disabled persons badge, but only if that Vehicle has been or is about to be driven or used by the person to whom the badge has been issued, or as the case may be used for carrying of Disabled Person(s) as passenger(s).

p. Nothing in Article 4.1 and 4.2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or Permit any Vehicle to Wait for so long as may be necessary and in any event for no longer than 20 minutes for the purpose of enabling goods to be Loaded or Unloaded from the vehicle provided that such exemption does not apply during the hours when Loading and or Unloading restrictions are imposed by that Article.

Exemptions Stopping Restrictions

- 7 Nothing in Article 5 shall apply any person from causing or permitting any Vehicle to stop in the lengths of Red Route or on the sides of the Red Route referred to therein so long as may be necessary if that person is:
 - a. required by law to cause the Vehicle to stop or not to proceed.
 - b. obliged to stop the Vehicle so as to avoid an accident.
 - c. prevented from proceeding by any circumstances beyond their control, where the said circumstance relates directly to the movement, or otherwise of traffic on the Red Route;
 - d. getting or giving help in consequence of an accident or an emergency or otherwise taking action for public safety.
 - e. opening of closing a gate or other barrier at the entrance to premises to which the Vehicle is being driven or from which it has emerged if it is not reasonably practicable to cause the Vehicle to stop elsewhere for the purpose.
 - f. using a Liveried Vehicle for fire and rescue, Ambulance, providing a response to an emergency at the request of an NHS Ambulance service, police, bomb or explosive disposal, Special Forces, and National Crime Agency purposes.
 - g. using a Vehicle in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic.
 - h. using a Vehicle for the purposes of maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of any part of the Red Route.
 - using a Disabled Person's Vehicle which displays a Disabled Person's Badge in the Relevant Position to stop for so long only as may be required to enable a disabled person Board or Alight the Vehicle.
 - j. using a Vehicle in the service of a local authority, the Environment Agency, a water undertaker or sewerage undertaker in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
 - k. the laying, erection, alteration, repair or cleaning in or near the controlled area of any sewer, or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any Electronic Communications Apparatus kept installed for the purposes of an electronic communications code system or of any other Electronic Communications Apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position;
 - doing anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer;
 - m. Using a Pedal Cycle;
 - n. an Authorised Vehicle.

PART IV AUTHORISATION AND USE OF PARKING PLACES

The length of Road specified in Schedule 6 are authorised as a Parking Place by Disabled persons badge holders only, and no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any vehicle to park in that length of Road at any time, on any day unless it is a vehicle displaying

- a Disabled persons badge in the Relevant Position for a maximum of 1hour and no return within 1hour.
- 9 The length of Road specified in Schedules 2 and 5 are authorised as a Parking Place in accordance with Articles 4.3 and 4.4 of this Order.
- 10 Where in Schedule 6 a Parking Place is described as available for the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the Parking Place unless it: -
 - (a) is a vehicle falling within the Specified Class;
 - (b) is in the Specified Position;
 - (c) displays the Parking Disc; and
 - (d) holds a valid Disabled Persons Badge issued by the Council.
- 11 A Driver of a vehicle shall not use a Parking Place:-
 - (a) so as to unreasonably prevent access to any premises adjoining the Road, or the use of the Road by any other person, or so as to be a nuisance
 - (b) when a Police Constable in uniform, a Civil Enforcement Officer or a or a person authorised by the Council has closed the Parking Place
- 12 The Driver of a Motor Vehicle using a Parking Place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the Parking Place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in, or to depart from, that Parking Place.
- 13 No person shall use a vehicle whilst it is in a Parking Place in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the Parking Place, or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services.
- When a vehicle is left in a Parking Place in contravention of the provisions of the provisions of this Order, a Police Constable in uniform, or a Civil Enforcement Officer or a person authorised by the Council to do so may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle so that its position shall comply with that provision.
- 15 Any person altering the position of a vehicle by virtue of Article 14 may do so in such manner as he thinks necessary.
- 16 A Police Constable in uniform, or a Civil Enforcement Officer or a person authorised by the Council to do so may, in case of emergency, or in contravention of this Order, remove or cause to be removed to any place he thinks fit any vehicle left in a Parking Place.
- 17 Any person removing or causing to be removed a vehicle from a Parking Place in accordance with Article 16 shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle.




