

**THE ROTHERHAM BOROUGH COUNCIL
MALTKILN STREET, ROTHERHAM
EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC ORDER 2009**

Notice is hereby given that Rotherham Borough Council has made an Experimental Traffic Order on 29th January 2009 in exercise of its powers under Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter called "the Act") and all other enabling powers after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Schedule 9 to the Act.

The purpose and general effect of the Experimental Traffic Order is to prohibit vehicles from waiting at any time and prohibit loading and unloading on Maltkiln Street, Rotherham as specified in the Schedule to this notice. No exemptions shall apply to these restrictions.

The reasons for introducing the restrictions by way of an Experimental Traffic Order are to assess whether this will alleviate problems of access caused by indiscriminate parking on Maltkiln Street.

The Order comes into effect on the 9th February 2009 for an experimental period of eighteen months and the Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the Experimental Order should be continued in force indefinitely.

Within a period of six months from the date this Order comes into force or if the Order is varied by another Order or modified beginning with the day on which the variation or modification or the latest version of the variation or modification comes into force any person may object to the making of the Order for the purpose of its indefinite continuation. If you wish to object to this Experimental Order please send your grounds for objection in writing to the Assistant Chief Executive, Legal and Democratic Services to the address below.

Copies of the Experimental Traffic Order, a map relating to it and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Experimental Order may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of the Assistant Chief Executive (Legal and Democratic Services) at Civic Building, Walker Place, Rotherham.

Any persons wishing to question the validity of the Order or any provisions contained in it on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, or any instrument made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within six weeks from the date of this notice apply for that purpose to the High Court.

Details of any representations or objections received may be made available for inspection at council meetings and other forums, or supplied to members of the public and others in response to requests for information under the 'Freedom of Information Act'
