THE ROTHERHAM BOROUGH COUNCIL (ALDWARKE LANE, GREAT EASTERN WAY AND MANGHAM ROAD, PARKGATE) (40 M.P.H. SPEED LIMIT AND 24 HOUR MAIN CARRIAGEWAY CLEARWAY) ORDER 2000

Rotherham Borough Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1 (1), 2(1) and (2), 4 (1) and 84 (1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter called "the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into force on the 13th day of March 2000 and may be cited as "The Rotherham Borough Council (Aldwarke Lane, Great Eastern Way and Mangham Road, Parkgate) (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit and 24 Hour Main Carriageway Clearway) Order 2000."

2. In this Order :-

"carriageway" means a way constituting or comprised in a highway being a way (other than a cycle track) over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles;

"lay-by" means any area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles and bounded partly by a traffic sign shown in diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1994, and partly by the outer edge of that carriageway on the same side of the road as that on which the sign is placed;

"main carriageway" means any carriageway used primarily by through traffic, includes any carriageway of a slip road, but excludes any lay-by;

"verge" means any part of a road which is not a carriageway.

- 3. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed execeeding 40 miles per hour on the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 4. Save as provided in Article 5 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to stop or wait on the main carriageway of the roads specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 5. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall apply :-
 - (a) so as to prevent any vehicle waiting on the main carriageway referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with:-
 - (i) any building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the part or parts of road comprising or including that carriageway, or

the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near such parts of road or any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984.

- to a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- to a vehicle being used in the service of a local authority or of the Environment Agency or of a statutory undertaker in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; (b) (c)
- to a vehicle being used for the purposes of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953; (d)
- to a vehicle waiting on the main carriageway referred to in that Article while any gate or other barrier at the entrance to premises to which the vehicle requires access or from which it has emerged is opened or closed, if it is not reasonably (e) practicable for the vehicle to wait otherwise than on that carriageway, or
- to a vehicle waiting when the person in control of the vehicle :-(f)
 - is required by law to stop; (i)
 - is obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident; or (ii)
 - is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control.

No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any verge or lay-by immediately adjacent to the main carriageway comprised in the roads specified in the Schedule to this Order for the purpose of selling goods from that vehicle unless the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected.

The Rotherham Borough Council Aldwarke Road (Part) and Aldwarke Lane, Parkgate (24 Hour Main Carriageway Clearway) Order 1993 is hereby revoked.
