

**THE BOROUGH OF RUGBY
(OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2010**

The Council of the Borough of Rugby in exercise of their powers under Section 35(1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act, as amended by the Traffic Management Act 2004 and of all other enabling powers, with the consent of the County Council of Warwickshire in accordance with Section 39(3) of the Act and after consulting the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following order:-

PART ONE

GENERAL

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 12 day of July Two Thousand and Ten and may be cited as "The Borough of Rugby (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2010"
2. The Borough of Rugby (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2009 is hereby revoked.
3. (1) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article is a reference to the Article bearing that number in this Order, and any reference in this Order to "the Schedule" is a reference to the Schedule to this Order.
(2) In this Order:-

"Council" means the Council of the Borough of Rugby;

"Driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;

"goods vehicle" means a vehicle which is constructed and adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description;

"civil enforcement officer" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any parking place;

"parking place" means any area of land specified by name in column 1 of the Schedule provided by the Council under Section 32(1) of the Act for use as a parking place;

"passenger vehicle" means a vehicle constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects;

“penalty charge” as defined in Band 2 of Schedule 1 Article 2 of The Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (Guidelines on Levels of Charges) (England) Order 2007.

“ticket machine” means an apparatus of a type and design approved by the appropriate minister pursuant to section 35(3) of the Act

PART TWO

USE OF PARKING PLACES

4. Each area of land specified in column one of the Schedule may be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such vehicles or classes of vehicles, in such positions and on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to that area in the Schedule.
5. Where in the Schedule a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place unless it is of the class and in the position so specified.
6. (1) The driver of a vehicle shall not leave such vehicle in any parking place or part of a parking place reserved either by notice erected in a conspicuous position at the entrance to the parking place or in specified positions reserved by notice on the ground or otherwise unless the driver is a person for whom the space is reserved.
(2) The driver of a vehicle shall not leave such vehicle in any part of a parking place reserved whether by notices on the ground or otherwise for the exclusive use of disabled persons unless the said vehicle displays a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority by virtue of the **Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000**
7. The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a parking place for longer than the maximum period permitted for waiting specified in the Schedule in relation to that parking place.
8. (1) This Article applies to the parking places specified by name in Column One of the Schedule
(2) The charges for the parking of vehicles in parking places shall be set out in Column Seven of Parts One, Two and Three of the Schedule and as indicated in Parts Four and Five of the Schedule.
(3) Where the driver of any vehicle parking that vehicle in a parking place is not the

holder in respect of that vehicle, of a current season ticket, he shall pay the appropriate charge by inserting an appropriate coin or coins into the ticket machine provided or, where the ticket machine so permits, by inserting a bank card or pre-payment card issued by the Council into such ticket machine.

- (4) Where any ticket has been issued on payment of the appropriate charge or where the driver of any vehicle is the holder of a current season ticket in respect of that vehicle, the driver shall attach the said ticket or season ticket in a conspicuous position to the vehicle in respect of which it was issued. A vehicle shall not be left in a parking place if it displays an out of date ticket.
 - (5) The ticket or tickets shall be so exhibited on the vehicle that the time or expiry date shown on the front of the said ticket or tickets is clearly visible.
9. (1) If a vehicle is left in a parking place for longer than the period for which payment was made by the appropriate charge, the said charge together with an additional amount (which additional amount is hereinafter referred to as "the penalty charge") shall be payable. If payment of the penalty charge is made to the Council as provided in Article 12 within fourteen days of the affixing of the notice specified in paragraph (3) of this Article the amount of penalty charge payable will reduce by 50%.
- (2) If a vehicle is left in a parking place for which no payment has been made or is left in a parking place in contravention of Article 5 Article 6(1) or 6(2) or Article 7 an penalty charge shall be payable. If payment of the penalty charge is made to the Council as provided in Article 12 within fourteen days of the affixing of the notice specified in paragraph (3) of this Article the amount of penalty charge payable will reduce by 50%.
- (3) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which an penalty charge may have been incurred, it shall be the duty of a civil enforcement officer to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a notice which shall include the following particulars:-
- (a) the registration mark of the vehicle or, where the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the number of the trade plate carried by the vehicle;
 - (b) the time at which he first observed that the period for which payment was made by the initial charge had expired;
 - (c) a statement that the penalty charge Band 2 is required to be paid;
 - (d) the manner in which, and the time within which, the penalty charge should be paid; and

- (e) a statement that it is an offence under section 35A of the Act for the driver of a vehicle who has left the vehicle in a parking place to fail to pay the penalty charge.
10. If a vehicle is left in a parking place for more than the maximum period permitted by Article 7 of this Order, it shall be the duty of a civil enforcement officer to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a notice which shall include the particulars mentioned in paragraph (3) of Article 9 of this Order and the following additional particulars, namely the time at which he first noticed that the vehicle had been left in the parking place for more than the maximum period permitted by Article 7 hereof.
11. (1) Where a notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provision of paragraph (3) of Article 9 or Article 10 of this Order, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle or a duly authorised representative of the Council, shall remove the notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.
- (2) When a ticket or tickets have been exhibited on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 8 of this Order no person, not being the driver of the vehicle shall remove the ticket or tickets from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.
12. The penalty charge shall be paid to the Council either by cheque, giro bank transcash, or postal order sent by post so as to reach the Resources Department at the Town Hall, Rugby, not later than 5.00pm on the fourteenth day following the day on which the penalty charge was incurred Provided that, if the said fourteenth day falls upon a day on which the said Department is closed, the period within which payment of the said charge shall be made to the Council shall be extended until 4.30pm on the next full day on which the said Department is open.
Alternatively, payment may be made by credit or debit card either via the telephone or on the internet.
13. There shall be on or near each parking place at least one ticket machine.
14. If at any time while a vehicle is left in a parking place no parking ticket is exhibited on that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 8 it shall be presumed unless the contrary is provided that the charge specified in Article 8(2) has been duly paid for the vehicle and that the initial period for which payment was made by the charge has already expired.

PART THREE
OTHER PROVISIONS

15. No person shall (a) use a parking place so as to prevent or obstruct access thereto or egress therefrom and the use thereof by other persons (b) cause or take part in any gathering or demonstration within a parking place unless the prior written approval of the Council has been obtained, or (c) cause any unreasonable or unnecessary noise.
16. The driver of a vehicle shall not permit that vehicle to wait in a parking place unless the vehicle is licensed in pursuance of the provisions of the **Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994** and unless there is in relation to the use of the vehicle by the driver such a policy of insurance as complies with the requirements of **Part VI of the Road Traffic Act 1988**
17. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.
18. No person shall, within a parking place sell or attempt to sell any article to persons in or near the parking place, or sell or offer for hire his skill or service and shall not use a vehicle or anything towed by a vehicle while it is in a parking place or any part of a parking place for such a purpose, or for the purpose of any exhibition unless the prior written approval of the Council has been obtained.
19. No person shall use any part of a parking place or any vehicle or anything towed by a vehicle while it is left in a parking place -
 - (1) for sleeping or camping or cooking; or
 - (2) for the purpose of servicing or washing any vehicle or part thereof other than is reasonably necessary to enable that vehicle to depart from the parking place
20. In a parking place no person shall:-
 - (1) commit any act which, if committed on a public highway, would constitute an offence under the provisions of the **Environmental Protection Act 1990** or **any re-enactment thereof**
 - (2) erect or cause or permit to be erected any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure without the written authority of the Council
 - (3) drive a vehicle at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour
21. The driver of any vehicle in a parking place shall comply with any instructions given, either orally by a person duly authorised by the Council or a Police Officer in

- uniform by direction signs or by surface markings or in any other manner as to the route to be followed within the parking place.
22. The driver of a vehicle using a parking place shall not sound any horn or other similar instrument except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or depart from the parking place.
23. (1) If a vehicle is left in a parking place in a position other than in accordance with the provisions of **Column Two of the Schedule**, a person authorised by the Council in that behalf may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle so that its position is in accordance with the said provisions.
- (2) If a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the foregoing provision of this Order a person authorised by the Council in that behalf may remove the vehicle from that parking place or arrange for such removal.
- (3) For the purpose of meeting the requirements of an emergency, a person authorised in that behalf by the Council or a police constable in uniform may alter or cause to be altered the position of a vehicle in a parking place or remove or arrange for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place.
- (4) Any person altering, or causing the alteration of, the position of a vehicle by virtue of **paragraph (1) of this Article**, or removing, or causing the removal of, a vehicle by virtue of paragraphs **(2) or (3) of this Article**, may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think reasonably necessary to enable the position of the vehicle to be altered or the vehicle to be removed.
- (5) Any person removing or arranging for the removal of a vehicle by virtue of paragraphs **(2) or (3) of this Article** shall make such arrangements as he considers to be reasonably necessary for the safety of the vehicle in the place to which it is removed.
- (6) Any expenses incurred by the Council in removing a vehicle from or altering, or causing the alteration of the position of a vehicle by virtue of paragraphs **(1), (2) and (3) of this article** or in storing a vehicle by virtue of paragraph **(5) of this Article** shall be recoverable by the Council from the driver of the vehicle summarily as a civil debt.
24. No person shall, except with the permission of a person authorised by the Council in that behalf, drive or permit to be driven any vehicle in a parking place for any purpose other than the purpose of leaving that vehicle in the parking place in

accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from the parking place.

25. The driver of a disabled person's vehicle shall be exempt for a maximum of three hours from any charge specified in Article 8 and Column Seven of the Schedule provided that there is displayed on the vehicle in a conspicuous position a disabled persons badge issued by any local authority by virtue of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000 (as amended)
26. A vehicle left in a parking place by the driver thereof shall be exempt from any charge during specified periods if there is displayed in the relevant position on that vehicle a permit issued by the Council subject to the observance of any conditions attached to such a permit
27. (1) Where the driver of a vehicle is alleged to be guilty of an contravention to which this Order applies the owner of the vehicle shall give such information as to the identity of the driver as he may be required to give by or on behalf of the Council within 14 days of the Council's request for such information and
(2) Any other person shall if required as aforesaid give any information which it is in his power to give and which may lead to the identification of the driver.
28. The Council shall not be responsible for any loss or damage to any vehicle or to anything contained therein or thereon from any cause whatsoever, whilst entering, within, or leaving a parking place.
29. Notwithstanding the provisions of this Order the Council may by notice displayed on or near a parking place close that parking place or part of the parking place for any period either generally or in respect of a particular class or classes of vehicle and the driver of any vehicle or of any such a class or classes of vehicle shall not use the parking place when it has been so closed.

PART FOUR LEGAL PROCEEDINGS

- 30.(1) For the purposes of this Order the owner shall be assumed to be the driver unless the owner can satisfy the Council or a Court that he was not in fact driving the vehicle at that time.
- (2) For the purposes of determining in the course of any proceedings brought by virtue of this Order who was the owner at any time it shall be presumed that the owner was the person in whose name the vehicle was at that time registered under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994

30. Where, in any proceedings brought by virtue of this Order, it is proved that any charge which has become due, or any part of that charge, has not been duly paid, the provisions of section 47(4) of the Act shall apply and the court shall accordingly order the payment of the sum not paid.
