## METROPOLITAN BOROUGH OF SEFTON (OFF STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER, 2025

MADE BY THE COUNCIL UNDER SECTIONS 32, 33 AND 35 OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984 AND PART 6 AND SCHEDULES 8 AND 9 OF THE TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ACT 2004 ON THE 24 DAY OF JUNE 2025

# THE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH OF SEFTON (OFF STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER, 2025

The Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Sefton ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 32, 33 and 35 (1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 (hereinafter called "the "1984 Act") and Part 6 and Schedules 8 and 9 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 (hereinafter called the "2004 Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consulting the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following order:-

#### 1.0 GENERAL

- 1.1 The Orders specified in column 1 of the First Schedule are hereby revoked to the extent as specified in column 2 of the First Schedule by this Order.
- 1.2 This Order shall come into operation on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of July 2025 and may be cited as "The Metropolitan Borough of Sefton (Off Street Parking Places) Order, 2025.
- 1.3 Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article is a reference to the Article bearing that number in this Order, and any reference in this Order to "the Schedule" is a reference to the Schedule to this Order.
- 1.4 In this Order except where the context otherwise requires the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-
  - 1.4.1 "charging hours" means any period specified in Column 5 of the Second Schedule in respect of which a charge is specified in Article 3;
  - 1.4.2 "civil enforcement officer (parking)" means a person as defined in Section 63A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 and Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act, 2004;
  - 1.4.3 "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended by The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2007 and The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations 2007, or any subsequent Regulations to those Regulations;
  - 1.4.4 "driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;
  - 1.4.5 "electric vehicle" means a motor vehicle whose main propulsion method is via electric motor(s) driven by batteries which require recharging from an external power supply.
  - 1.4.6 "Hand-held Device" means a wireless hand-held computer which is programmed to interface with the Pay by Phone parking system and

used by a civil enforcement officer to assist in carrying out parking enforcement within any parking place operated by the Council;

- 1.4.7 "Location Identification Number" means the unique number assigned to each parking place where the pay by phone system is operational;
- 1.4.8 "owner" in relation to a vehicle, means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used;
- 1.4.9 "parking bay" means any area of a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle and indicated by markings of the surface of the parking place;
- 1.4.10 "Parking Charge" means the sum specified in Article 3;
- 1.4.11 "parking place" means any area of land specified by name in Column 1 of the Schedule provided by the Council under Section 32 (1) of the Act for use as a parking place;
- 1.4.12 "parking ticket" means a ticket issued by a Pay and Display Machine installed at a Pay and Display Parking Place.
- 1.4.13 "Pay by Phone" means a system of payment whereby the charge levied in accordance with Article 3 (and any appropriate administration charge) is collected by a Council appointed service provider in accordance with instructions indicated on signs located at each parking place where the system is operational, via an arranged account, with payment being made over a mobile telephone or by other electronic system (including via the internet) by credit or debit card or any other means of secure authorised payment to facilitate a cashless and ticketless parking transaction.
- 1.4.14 "penalty charge notice" means a notice issued to the driver of a vehicle indicating any contravention of the conditions of parking as imposed by the articles of this order;
- 1.4.15 "permit" means a permit issued by the Council or authorised agent that can be used in the off street car park specified thereon;
- 1.4.16 "Police Parking bay" means any area of a parking place that is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1028.2 variant in Schedule 7 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016.
- 1.4.17 "restricted area" means an area within the car park marked out with yellow or white hatched carriageway markings;
- 1.4.18 "Service Provider" means the company authorised and appointed b the Council to operate, administer and maintain the payment of parking charges using the pay by phone parking system.

- 1.4.19 "Transaction Fee" means the fee covering any administration costs from the service provider, as specified in the Metropolitan Borough of Sefton (Parking Charges) (No.2) Order, 2018 or any amendments or variations to that Order, or any subsequent Order to that Order.
- 1.5 Any reference in this order to a masculine gender shall include reference to the feminine gender.
- 1.6 Any reference in this Order to a Singular includes the plural.
- 1.7 The interpretation Act, 1978, shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

### 2.0 USE OF LAND AND PARKING PLACES

- 2.1 The areas of land specified by name in Column 1 of the Second Schedule may be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as parking places for such classes of the vehicles, in such positions on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to those areas in the Second Schedule.
- 2.2 Any vehicle parked within the car park must do so, so that the vehicle is parked wholly within the parking bay.
- 2.3 Vehicles are not permitted to park in any restricted area.
- 2.4 Where in the Second Schedule a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place unless it is of the class and in the position so specified.
- 2.5 Where, within the parking place or parking bay, there is a sign or surface marking which indicates that the parking place or parking bay is available only for a disabled person's vehicle, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place or parking bay unless it displays a valid disabled person's badge. The badge shall be displayed in the vehicle in a conspicuous position so that it conforms to the regulations in The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended by The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended by The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2007 and The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations 2007, or any subsequent Regulations to those Regulations. The badge shall be displayed in the vehicle for the whole of the time during which such vehicle is left within the parking place or parking bay.
- 2.6 Where, within the parking place or parking bay, there is a sign or surface marking which indicates that the parking place or parking bay is available only for coaches (defined as a public service vehicle but excluding such a vehicle when it is being used to operate a local service as defined by the Transport Act

1985), the driver of a vehicle as defined in column 3 of the second schedule shall not permit it to wait in that parking place or parking bay.

- 2.7 Where, within the parking place or parking bay, there is a sign or surface marking which indicates that the parking place or parking bay is available only to electric vehicles which require recharging, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place unless it is an electric vehicle requiring charging and that the vehicle is in the immediate process of connecting to or in connection with the charging point and is at that point in the continuous process of transferring the power source to the vehicle at that time. On the completion of the recharging process the vehicle shall not be permitted to wait in the parking place and will vacate the parking place at that time.
- 2.8 Where, within the parking place or parking bay, there is a sign or surface marking which indicates that the parking place or parking bay is available only for a permit holder, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place or parking bay unless it displays a valid permit. The permit shall be displayed in the vehicle in a conspicuous position so that the details on the permit are clearly visible to a person standing at the front or nearside of such vehicle for the whole of the time during which such vehicle is left within the parking place or parking bay.
- 2.9 Where, within the parking place or parking bay, there is a sign or surface marking which indicates that the parking place or parking bay is available only as a Police Parking bay, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place or parking bay unless it is an operational, liveried Police vehicle.
- 2.10 Insofar as a vehicle is left in a parking place during the charging hours the driver thereof shall, on alighting from the vehicle, immediately make payment of the Parking Charge either:-
  - 2.10.1 by insertion of a credit card, debit card or appropriate coin or coins in

the Pay and Display Machine situated at the Pay and Display Parking Place at which the vehicle is left provided that if there is no Pay and Display Machine situated at that Parking Place or such machine is not operating properly the Parking Charge shall be paid by inserting a credit card, debit card or the appropriate coin or coins in a Pay and Display Machine which is operating properly and which is nearest to the Parking Place at which the vehicle is left or

- 2.10.2 where available, via mobile telephone using the Pay by Phone facility.
- 2.11 Pay by Phone information signs and the relevant location identification number signs will be located by each Pay & Display machine where the Pay by Phone system is in operation and will provide information in relation to the operation and use of Pay by Phone.
- 2.12 The payment of the charge using Pay by Phone will relate only to the parking places as indicated by the location identification number displayed on the location identification number sign displayed by the Pay & Display machine.

- 2.13 Where a vehicle has been left in a parking place operating Pay by Phone, an indication that the charge has been made in respect of that vehicle using Pay by Phone, together with an indication of the parking periods for which payment has been made, shall appear on the hand-held device.
- 2.14 Where a person attempts to pay the appropriate charge in accordance with Article 2.10.2 but is unable to do so, he shall pay the appropriate charge in accordance with Article 2.10.1
- 2.15 Where payment is made by credit card or debit card using the Pay by Phone system, the card owner shall disclose the following information:-

2.15.1	Call number of the mobile telephone.
2.15.2	Identification number and any other details as may be requested
	by or on behalf of the Council relating to the credit card or debit card against which the charge is being paid.
2.15.3	Location Identification Number of the Parking Place in respect of
	which payment is being made.

- 2.15.4 Registration number of the motor vehicle being parked.
- 2.16 Where payment of a charge is made in accordance with Article 2.15 :-
  - 2.16.1 the transaction fee, as specified in Article 3.7 shall be payable at the time and
  - 2.16.2 the parking period shall commence on receipt by the Council of the details specified in Article 2.15
- 2.17 At any time after a charge has been paid in accordance with Article 2.15 in respect of a parking period, that parking period may be increased on further payment of the additional charge and the appropriate transaction fee, provided that the maximum permitted parking period for that parking place is not exceeded.
- 2.18 Insofar as a vehicle is left in a parking place for which no charge is made, other than by a free ticket, the driver thereof shall, on alighting from the vehicle, immediately locate a ticket issuing machine and obtain a ticket, or where available, via mobile telephone using the Pay by Phone facility. The driver shall not permit it to wait in that parking place for longer than the maximum period of time for which a vehicle may wait as specified in the Second Schedule and shall not return to that parking place until a period of one hour has elapsed from the expiry of the maximum period of waiting referred to in this Article.
- 2.19 No vehicle shall be left in a parking place outside the charging hours where that parking place is secured so as to prevent entry and exit outside the charging hours.

# 3.0 AMOUNT OF CHARGE AT PARKING PLACE

- 3.1 This Article applies to the parking places specified by name in Column 1 of the Second Schedule.
- 3.2 The driver of a vehicle left in the parking place shall, on alighting from the vehicle, immediately locate a pay and display machine and obtain a pay and display ticket by payment of the appropriate charge, if any, or where available, via mobile telephone using the Pay by Phone facility, in accordance with the scale of charges set out in "The Metropolitan Borough of Sefton (Parking Charges) Order, 2014 and any subsequent amendments or variations to that Order, or any subsequent Orders to that Order.
- 3.3 The charge referred to in Paragraph 3.2 of this Article shall be payable:-
  - 3.3.1 by the insertion of an appropriate credit card, debit card, coin or coins into the apparatus or device provided, being an apparatus or device approved in accordance with Section 35 (3) of the Act, and the provisions of Section 47 (5) of the Act shall apply in respect of such apparatus or
  - 3.3.2 when no such apparatus as in 3.3.1 above is installed then by manual payment to a cashier or
  - 3.3.3 where available, via mobile telephone using the Pay by Phone facility.
- 3.4 If a period of free parking is permitted within the scale of charges referred to in 3.2 above then the driver of that vehicle shall, on alighting from the vehicle, immediately locate a pay and display machine and obtain a ticket. Alternatively, where available, the driver may use the Pay by Phone facility to avail himself of the free parking period. Any person taking advantage of the free parking period shall do so for no longer than the free period permits and shall not return to that car park until a period of one hour has elapsed from the expiry time on the ticket.
- 3.5 Any ticket issued on payment of the charge referred to in Paragraph 3.2 or in accordance with Paragraph 3.4 of this Article shall be displayed in the vehicle for which the charge has been paid in a conspicuous position so that the date and time recorded on the Parking Ticket are clearly visible to a person standing at the front or nearside of such vehicle for the whole of the time during which such vehicle is left at the Pay and Display Parking Place.
- 3.6 A vehicle shall not be left in a parking place if it displays an expired ticket or, where the driver has used the Pay by Phone facility, if the period for which payment was made has expired.
- 3.7 Where payment is made via a mobile telephone, an additional transaction fee covering the administration of the service provider will be charged, as specified in the Metropolitan Borough of Sefton (Parking Charges) Order, 2015, or any amendment or variation to that Order or any subsequent Order. Any

costs to the network provider or phone service, arising from the cost of the phone call, will be the responsibility of the applicant.

# 4.0 RESTRICTION ON REMOVAL OF NOTICES

4.1 When a penalty charge notice has been attached to a vehicle by a civil enforcement officer (parking), no person other than a person authorised by the Council in that behalf or the driver or a person authorised by the driver in that behalf shall remove the notice from the vehicle.

## 5.0 OTHER PROVISIONS

- 5.1 No person shall offer for sale any vehicle while it is in the parking place and no person shall use any vehicle, while it is in the parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to any person in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale or hire of his skill or services and no person shall while a vehicle is in the parking place affix or place thereon any advertisement, unless the owner of the vehicle has obtained from the Council their consent in writing for such use and observed any conditions contained therein.
- 5.2 The driver of a vehicle shall not permit that vehicle to wait in the parking place unless the vehicle is licensed in pursuance of the provisions of the Vehicle (Excise) Act, 1971, and unless there is in relation to the use of the vehicle by the driver such a policy of insurance as complies with the requirements of Part VI of the Road Traffic Act, 1988.
- 5.3 The driver of a motor vehicle using the parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle or to depart from the parking place.
- 5.4 No person shall use any part of the parking place or any vehicle left in the parking place:-
  - (a) for sleeping or camping or cooking, or
  - (b) for the purpose of servicing or washing any vehicle or part thereof other than is reasonably necessary to enable that vehicle to depart from the parking place.
- 5.5 The driver of a vehicle using the parking place shall not sound any horn or other similar instrument except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.
- 5.6 For the purpose of meeting the requirements of an emergency, a person authorised in that behalf by the Council or a Police Constable in uniform may alter or cause to be altered the position of a vehicle in the parking place or remove or arrange for the removal of a vehicle from the parking place.

- 5.7 Any person altering, or causing the alteration of, the position of a vehicle by virtue of Paragraph 5.6 of this Article, may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think reasonably necessary to enable the position of the vehicle to be altered or the vehicle to be removed.
- 5.8 Where in the parking place signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of:-
  - (a) indicating the entrance to or exit from the parking place, or
  - (b) indicating that a vehicle using the parking place shall proceed in a specified direction within the parking place,

No person shall drive or permit to be driven any vehicle (i) so that it enters the parking place other than by an entrance, or leaves the parking place other than by an exit, so indicated, or (ii) in a direction other than so specified.

- 5.9 No person shall except with the permission of a person authorised by the Council in that behalf, drive or permit to be driven any vehicle in the parking place for any purpose other than the purpose of leaving that vehicle in the parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from the parking place.
- 5.10 The charges specified in Article 2.9 of this Order shall not apply to the holders of badges issued to disabled persons or to the drivers of invalid carriages or vehicles issued to disabled persons in lieu of an invalid carriage, unless indicated otherwise in the Third Schedule to the Metropolitan Borough of Sefton (Parking Charges) Order, 2014 and any subsequent amendments or variations to that Order, or any subsequent Orders to that Order.
- 5.11 This Order shall not apply to any vehicle displaying such contract permit as the Council may from time to time issue, provided that there has been compliance with such conditions as the Council may apply to such a contract.
- 5.12 Any person contravening any of the conditions imposed by any Article in this Order shall be issued with a penalty charge notice which will indicate the appropriate contravention.

#### 6.0 EVIDENTIAL MATTERS

- 6.1 Pay and Display Parking:-
  - (a) The absence of a Parking Ticket on a vehicle left at a Pay and Display Place shall be treated as evidence of a failure to display a ticket appropriately in accordance with the regulations.
  - (b) An indication on a Parking Ticket of a date shall be treated as evidence of the date on which Parking Charge was paid.

- (c) An indication on a Parking Ticket of a sum of money shall be treated as evidence that that sum (and only that sum) was paid as a Parking Charge.
- (d) An indication on a Parking Ticket of a time shall be treated as evidence of the time of expiry of the Period for which the Parking Charge has been paid.
- (e) The absence of an indication on a hand-held device that payment of the charge has been made using Pay by Phone, or if a hand-held device indicates that the payment period for which payment was made using Pay by Phone has expired, it shall be treated as evidence that either the charge has not been duly paid in respect of that vehicle, or that that the parking period for which payment was made has expired.
- (f) An indication on a hand-held device of a date shall be treated as evidence of the date on which Parking Charge was paid.
- (g) An indication on a hand-held device of a sum of money shall be treated as evidence that a sum of money (and only that sum) was paid as a Parking Charge.
- (h) An indication on a hand-held device of a time shall be treated as evidence of the time of expiry of the Period for which the Parking Charge has been paid.
- 6.2 Permits:-
  - (a) The absence of a valid Permit on a vehicle in respect of the Parking Place at which the vehicle was left shall be treated as evidence of a failure to display a permit appropriately in accordance with the regulations.
  - (b) An indication on a Permit as to the location of a Parking Place shall be treated as evidence of the location of the Parking Places in respect of which the Permit is valid.
  - (c) An indication on a Permit as to any date, month and year shall be treated as evidence of the date, month and year on which the Permit expires.
  - (d) An indication on a Permit as to a vehicle registration mark shall be treated as evidence of the vehicle in respect of which the Permit applies.
- 6.3 Disabled person's badge:-
  - (a) The absence of a disabled person's badge on a vehicle in respect

of the Parking Place at which the vehicle was left shall be treated as evidence of a failure to display the 'blue badge' appropriately in accordance with the regulations.

(b) An indication on a disabled person's badge as to any date, month and year shall be treated as evidence of the date, month and year on which the disabled person's badge expires.
