(VARIOUS ROADS, WOODSTOCK WARD, SOUTH GLOUCESTERSHIRE) (RESIDENTS' PARKING PLACES) (DISABLED PERSONS' PARKING PLACES) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) (VARIATION NO.2) ORDER 2022

The South Gloucestershire District Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of its powers under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4(2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 46A, 49 and 51 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following order:-

1. This order shall come into operation on the 24 February 2022 and may be cited as the South Gloucestershire Council (Various Roads, Woodstock Ward, South Gloucestershire) (Residents' Parking Places) (Disabled Persons' Parking Places) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (Variation No.2) Order 2022.
2. The South Gloucestershire Council (Various Roads, Woodstock Ward, South Gloucestershire) (Residents' Parking Places) (Disabled Persons' Parking Places) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 2019 is hereby varied and shall have effect as though:-
 - a) there were inserted at the end of ARRANGEMENT OF ARTICLES the Articles specified in Schedule 1 to this order;
 - b) there were inserted in Article 2 (1) after "**residents' parking area**" and before "**the General Regulations**" the definition:-

"shared use parking place" means an area on a highway designated as a parking place by this Order for the leaving –

 - (a) free of charge of such vehicles only as are passenger vehicles, goods vehicles, motor cycles and invalid carriages by virtue of the provision of Article 60 of this order but where such vehicles may not be left for a period longer than the specified maximum period for waiting in that shared use parking place and/or
 - (b) for the leaving with a charge without time limit during the permitted hours of such vehicles as display in the manner specified in Article 13(1) of this order a valid parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle;
 - c) there were inserted after PART VIII – REVOCATIONS the PART IX – SHARED USE PARKING PLACES as set out in Schedule 2 to this order;
 - d) there were substituted for Schedule 1 thereto the Schedule 1 as set out in Schedule 3 to this order; and

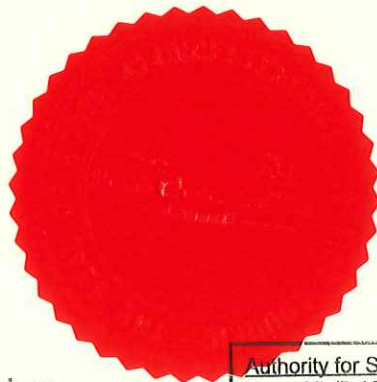
- e) there were substituted for plan **T303-1164-26 Rev A** annexed thereto the plan **T303-1164-26 Rev B** annexed to this order and there were substituted for plan **T303-1164-37** annexed thereto the plan **T303-1164-37 Rev A** annexed to this order .

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SCHEDULE 2

“PART IX – SHARED USE PARKING PLACES

Designation of Shared Used Parking Places

58. Each area of carriageway which is identified as **Mon – Sat 8 am – 6 pm Permit holders or Max Stay 1 hour No return within 2 hours** in the plans, and unless otherwise so indicated on the said plans bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway, is hereby designated to be used as a Shared Use parking place during the permitted hours, subject to the following provisions of this order.

Marking on the carriageway of Shared Use Parking Places

59. The limits of each shared use parking place shall be indicated by the Council on the carriageway by appropriate traffic signs.

Vehicles for which Shared Use Parking Places are designated

60. (1) Vehicles which may use Shared Use Parking Places

Each shared use parking place identified in the plans may be used subject to the provisions of this order for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles only –

- a) as are passenger vehicles, car derived vans, goods vehicles deemed acceptable at the discretion of the Council, invalid carriages and any other vehicle deemed acceptable at the discretion of the Council which are recorded on a database so as to cause a record of the permit:
 - i) to appear on a hand held device; or
 - ii) to be obtainable by a civil enforcement officer or parking attendant from the service provider;
- b) as is a disabled persons' vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled persons' badge issued by any local authority.■

- (2) The requirement of paragraph (1) of this Article to display a permit and the requirement to park in accordance with the manner of standing prescribed by Article 60 of this order or compliance with any limitation of time during which a vehicle may be left in such a shared use parking place specified in the foregoing provisions of this order shall not apply to motor cycles.

(3) General requirement to comply with this order

Except as otherwise prescribed by this order no vehicle may be left in a shared use parking place during the appropriate permitted hours unless that vehicle is left in accordance with the following provisions of this order.

(4) Vehicles left at times outside of permitted hours

Where a vehicle, having been left in a shared use parking place at a time which is not within the appropriate permitted hours remains there at the beginning of the appropriate permitted hours, then the vehicle shall be treated, for the purposes of this Part of this order, as if it had arrived in the Shared use parking place at the beginning of those hours.

Period for which a vehicle may be left in such a parking place

61. Without prejudice to the provisions of Article 65 no person shall cause any vehicle to be left in a shared use parking place identified on the plans during the permitted hours for a continuous period of more than two hours:-

Provided that nothing in this Article shall apply to –

- (a) a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority and/or
- (b) such vehicles as are recorded on a database so as to cause a record of the permit -
 - i) to appear on a hand held device; or
 - ii) to be obtainable by a civil enforcement officer or parking attendant from the service provider.

Interval before a vehicle may again be left in such a parking place

62. Without prejudice to the provisions of Article 65 of this order no vehicle which has been taken away from a parking space (where such parking space is provided) in a shared use parking place identified on the plans during the permitted hours shall until the expiration of four hours from the time it was taken away again be left in that parking place during the permitted hours.

Provided that nothing in this Article shall apply to –

- (a) a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority and/or
- (b) such vehicles as are recorded on a database so as to cause a record of the permit -

- i) to appear on a hand held device; or
- ii) to be obtainable by a civil enforcement officer or parking attendant from the service provider and/or

Manner of standing in Shared Use Parking Places

63. Save as provided in Article 68 of this order, the driver of a vehicle left in a shared use parking place during the appropriate permitted hours shall cause it to stand -

(a) if special provisions

in the case of a shared use parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of vehicles in that place are indicated on the carriageway by appropriate traffic signs, as to be in accordance with those provisions;

(b) if no special provisions

in the case of any other shared use parking place:-

- (i) if the shared use parking place is in a one-way street, that the left or near side of the vehicle is adjacent to the left-hand edge of the carriageway or that the right or off side of the vehicle is adjacent to the right-hand edge of the carriageway, and
- (ii) (whether or not the shared use parking place is in a one way street) that the distance between the edge of the carriageway and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than three hundred millimetres;

(c) vehicles to be within limits of Shared Use Parking Place

that every part of the vehicle is wholly within the limits of the shared use parking place.

Restriction of use of vehicles at Shared Use Parking Places

64. (1) Running of vehicle engines

Save as provided in Article 68 of this order, the driver of a vehicle using a shared use parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the shared use parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in, or to depart from, the shared use parking place.

- (2) The driver of a vehicle using a shared use parking place shall not sound any horn or other similar instrument except when about to change the position of the vehicle in, or to depart from the shared use parking place.

(3) Sales of goods and services

Save as provided in Article 68 of this order, no person shall use any vehicle while it is in a shared use parking place during the appropriate permitted hours in connection with the sale of, or the attempted sale of, any vehicle or of any other Article to any person in or near the shared use parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire his skill or services in any other capacity:

Provided that nothing in this Article shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle -

- (a) if the vehicle is one which may be left in a shared use parking place in accordance with Article 60 of this order and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected; or
- (b) if the vehicle is one to which the provisions of Article 65(1)(i) of this order apply.

Restriction of waiting of special categories of vehicles in shared use parking places

65. (1) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this order with respect to vehicles which are left in a shared use parking place in accordance with those provisions, any other vehicle may wait during the permitted hours anywhere on the carriageway within a shared use parking place, other than a shared use parking place or part of a shared use parking place the use of which has been suspended, if -
- (a) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid accident;
 - (c) the vehicle is a vehicle used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes or is a vehicle (other than a passenger vehicle) in the service of a local authority being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (d) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (e) the vehicle is to be used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets to or from premises adjacent to the shared use parking place or for the purpose of delivering to or collecting from posting boxes adjacent to that shared use parking place;
 - (f) the vehicle, not being a passenger vehicle, is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be

used for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation operations in or adjacent to the shared use parking place; or the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the shared use parking place; or the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the Shared use parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any electronic communications apparatus; or the maintenance, installation or removal in or adjacent to the Shared use parking place of any traffic sign, bus stop infrastructure or other street furniture or pay and display machine;

- (g) the vehicle, not being a passenger vehicle, is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture to or from one office, dwelling house or other premises adjacent to the shared use parking place from or to a depository, another office, dwelling house or other premises;
 - (h) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as is necessary to enable it to be used in connection with posting or removing advertising material in the form of posters on or from, or cleaning windows or chimneys in, premises adjacent to the shared use parking place in which the vehicle is waiting;
 - (i) in any other case the vehicle is waiting only for so long as is necessary for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or merchandise, including so far as a Bank is concerned, cash which cannot reasonably be carried by hand or other valuables or valuable securities which cannot reasonably be carried by hand, or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the shared use parking place in which the vehicle is waiting and the vehicle does not wait for such purpose for more than thirty minutes or for such longer period as a civil enforcement officer or a police community support officer or a police constable in uniform, or a traffic warden or may authorise; or
 - (j) the vehicle is recorded on a database so as to cause a record of a waiver -
 - i) to appear on a hand held device; or
 - ii) to be obtainable by a civil enforcement officer or parking attendant from the service provider and/or
- (2) No charge shall be payable in respect of any vehicle waiting in a shared use parking place in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Article and a valid parking permit need not be obtained or displayed on that vehicle and the provisions of Article 61 and Article 62 shall also not apply to a vehicle so waiting in a shared use parking place;
- (3) Except as provided by this Order the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a shared use parking place during the permitted hours, except in accordance with

the other provisions of this order.

- (4) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Article shall be taken as authorising anything which would be a contravention of any regulations made or having effect as if made under Section 58 of the Act of 1984.

Manner of standing by special categories of vehicles in Shared Use Parking Places

66. A person causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in a shared use parking place by virtue of the provisions of sub-paragraph (e), (f), (h), or (i) in paragraph (1) of the last preceding Article shall take all such steps as are necessary to ensure -

- (a) in the case of a shared use parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of vehicles in that place are indicated on the carriageway by appropriate traffic signs that the vehicle shall so stand -
 - (i) unless the length of the vehicle precludes compliance with this sub-paragraph, in accordance with those provisions and so that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the shared use parking place, or
 - (ii) if the length of the vehicle does preclude compliance with the last preceding sub-paragraph that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than three hundred millimetres; and
- (b) in the case of any other shared use parking place, that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than three hundred millimetres.

Power to suspend use of Shared Use Parking Places

67. (1) When Shared Use Parking Place may be suspended

Any person generally or specially authorised by the Council or a civil enforcement officer may suspend the use of a shared use parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary -

- (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
- (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation operations in or adjacent to the shared use parking place;
- (c) for the purpose of the maintenance, improvement or

reconstruction of the shared use parking place;

- (d) for the purpose of the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the shared use parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any electronic communications apparatus;
- (e) for the purpose of the maintenance, installation or removal in or adjacent to the shared use parking place of any traffic sign, bus stop infrastructure or other street furniture or pay and display machine;
- (f) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the shared use parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture or household effects to or from premises adjacent to the Shared use parking place to or from other premises;
- (g) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
- (h) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the shared use parking place at times of weddings or funerals, or on other special occasions.

(2) Suspension by other officers

A police constable in uniform, a police community support officer or a traffic warden may suspend for not longer than 7 days the use of a shared use parking place or any part thereof whenever that police constable in uniform, police community support officer or traffic warden considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of preventing or mitigating congestion or obstruction of traffic, or danger to or from traffic, in consequence of extraordinary circumstances.

(3) Duties of person suspending Shared Use Parking Place

Any person suspending the use of a shared use parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) or paragraph (2) of this Article shall thereupon in the case of a shared use parking place the use of any part or parts of which has been suspended, place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that part or those parts a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that waiting by vehicles is prohibited.

(4) Exemptions during Shared Use Parking Place suspension

Save as provided in Article 68 of this order, no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in any part of a shared use parking place during such period as there is in or adjacent to that part of the shared use parking place a traffic sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article:

Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle being used for:-

- (a) fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary to avoid an accident;
- (c) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic; or
- (d) a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets to or from premises adjacent to the Shared use parking place or for the purpose of delivering to or collecting from posting boxes adjacent to that Shared use parking place -

or if the vehicle is left with the permission of the person suspending the use of the Shared use parking place or part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article, or a person duly authorised by him.

Vehicles left in suspended Shared Use Parking Places by agreement

General provisions

68. (1) Nothing in Article 61(1), Article 63, Article 64 or paragraph (4) of Article 67 of this order shall apply to any vehicle left in a Shared use parking place or part thereof which has been suspended in accordance with Article 67(1)(b), (c), (d), (e) or (f) of this order -

Provided that the vehicle is left in accordance with a prior agreement entered into with the Council for that period and further provided that the provisions of that agreement with regard to the manner of standing and position of the vehicle have been adhered to.

- (2) Charge to be payable

In the case of a vehicle left in a Shared use parking place in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Article a daily charge shall be paid for any period during the appropriate permitted hours when the Shared use parking place or part thereof has been suspended for the leaving of that vehicle.

- (3) Amount of charge

The daily charge shall be specified by the Council at the time that the agreement referred to in this Article is entered into and will not exceed an appropriate administration charge.

- (4) Meaning of vehicle

In paragraph (1) and paragraph (2) of this Article reference to a vehicle shall include any builders skip or receptacle, any scaffolding which may overhang the Shared use parking place or part thereof and any building materials which have been left in accordance with the provisions of the aforementioned agreement.

Alteration of position of vehicle in Shared Use Parking Places

69. Where a vehicle is standing in a Shared use parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 63 or Article 64 of this order a civil enforcement officer or police community support officer or a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions.

Removal of vehicle from Shared Use Parking Places and safe custody of vehicle

70. When a vehicle is left in a Shared use parking place in contravention of any of the provisions of Part IX of this order a civil enforcement officer or police community support officer or a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden may remove or arrange for the removal of the vehicle from the Shared use parking place, and where it is so removed shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

Method of removal of vehicles from Shared Use Parking Places

71. A civil enforcement officer or police community support officer or a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden removing a vehicle by virtue of Article 70 of this order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to that vehicle as may be thought necessary to enable the removal as aforesaid.

Movement of vehicles in Shared Use Parking Places in emergencies

72. Any person generally or specially authorised by the Council, or a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden or police community support officer or a traffic warden may move or cause to be moved, in case of emergency, to any place he thinks fit, any vehicle left in a Shared use parking place.

Placing of traffic signs etc.

73. (1) The Council shall place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each Shared use parking place a traffic sign or signs indicating that such Shared use parking place may be used during the appropriate permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Article 60 of this order.
- (2) The Council shall carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a Shared use parking place.

Saving with respect to other enactments

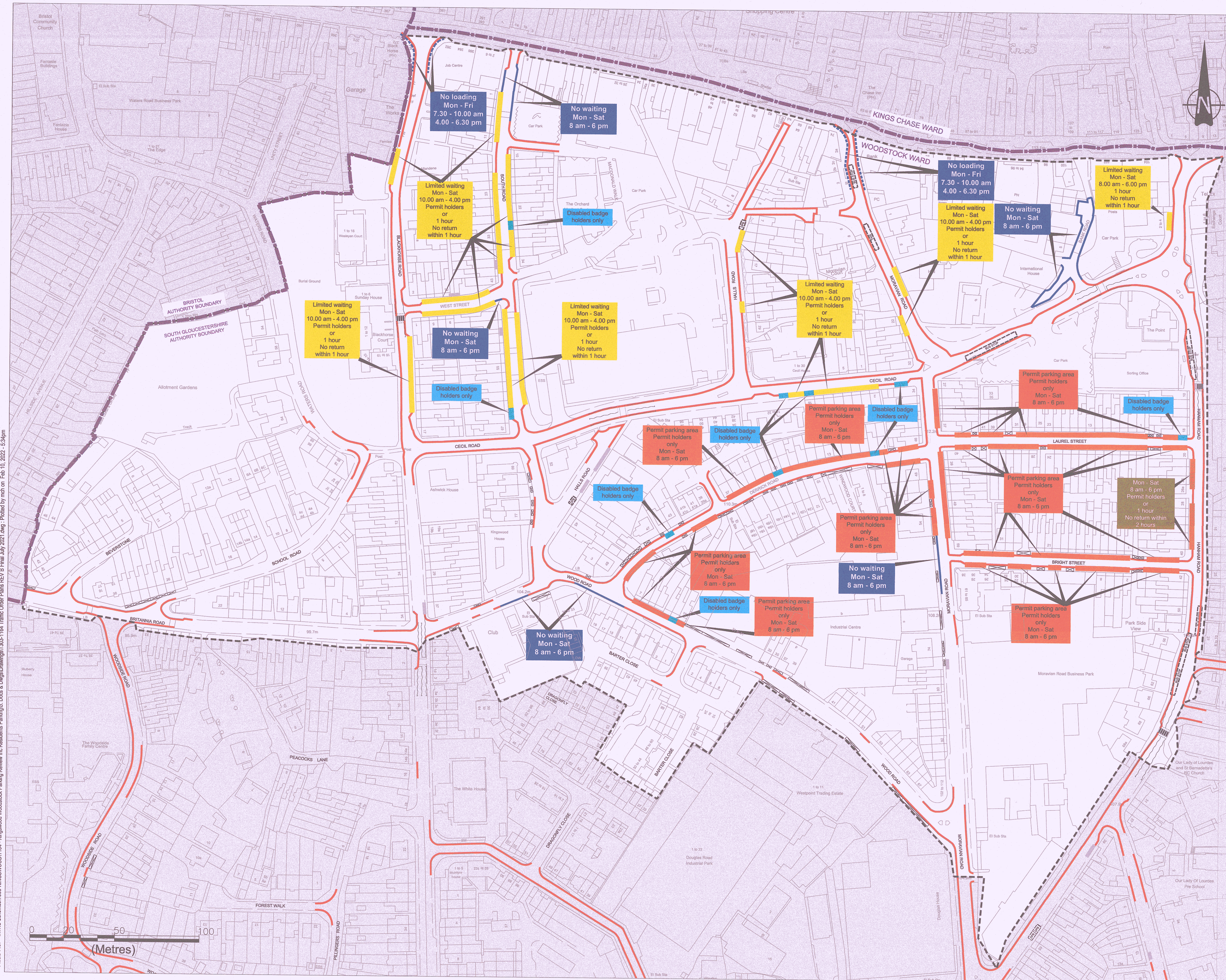
74. The provisions of this order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from the provisions of any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by any other enactment."

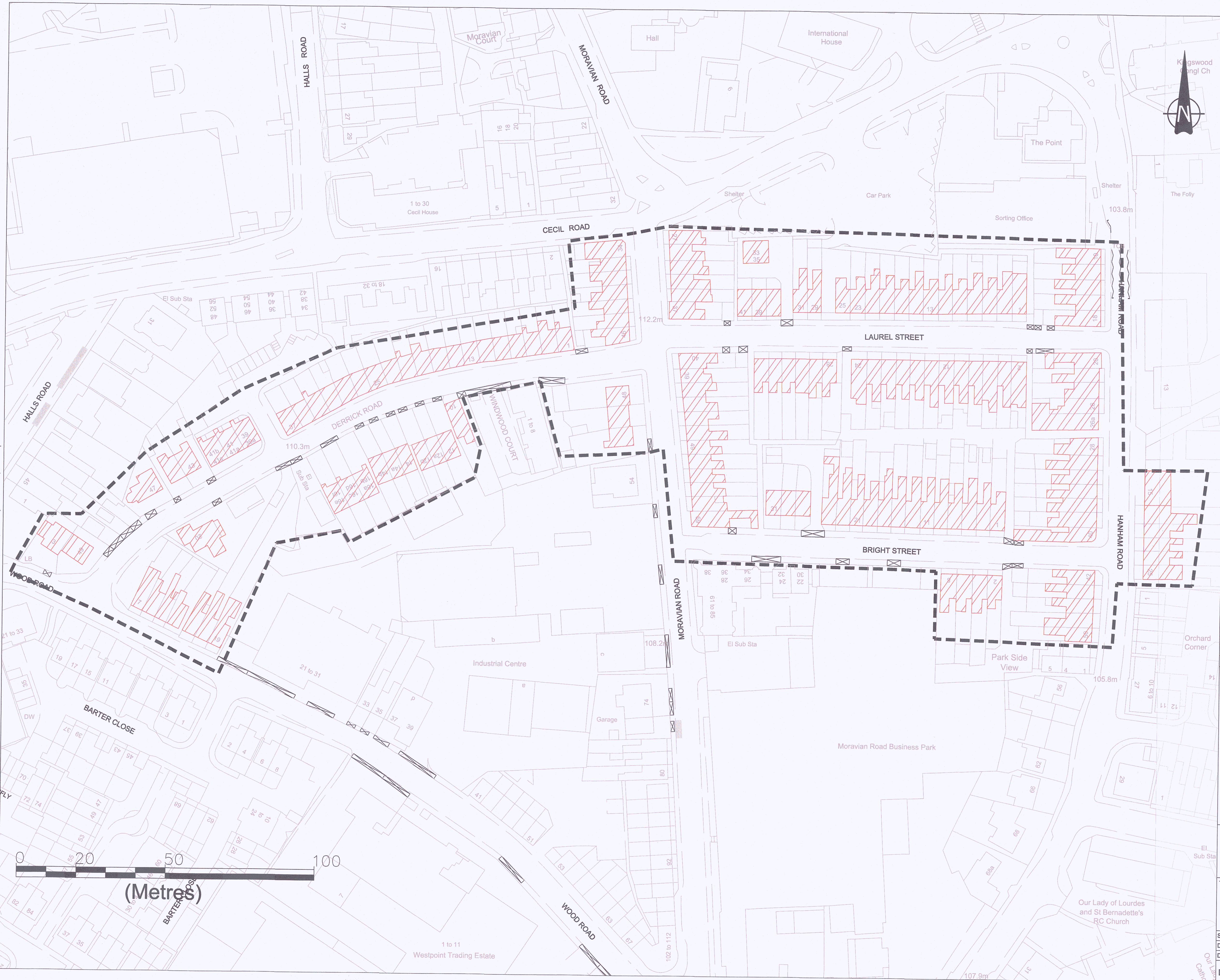
