



**THE CITY OF SOUTHAMPTON
(OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) (AMENDMENT NO 3)
TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER 2012**

Southampton City Council (hereinafter called "the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 32, 33 and 35(1), (3), (3A), (3B), (3C) and (3D) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, ("the Act") and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Office of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:

1 CITATION

This Order shall come into operation on 11th July 2012 and may be cited as The City of Southampton (Off-Street Parking Places) (Amendment No 3) Traffic Regulation Order 2012.

2 INTERPRETATION

- (a) In this Order, "the Principal Order" shall mean the City of Southampton (Off-Street Parking Places) Traffic Regulation Order 2009, as amended.
- (b) Except where the context requires otherwise, any reference in this Order to an Article or Schedule shall be construed as a reference to that Article or Schedule in this Order.

3 The following item shall be added to Article 2A of the Principal Order:-

"The Quays" means The Quays Swimming and Diving Complex leisure facility located at 27 Harbour Parade.

4 The contents of Article 26 of the Principal Order shall be deleted and replaced with the following:-

Quays Member and Quays Staff Permits

(i) Quays Member Permit

The driver of a vehicle left in accordance with the provisions of this Order in the Quays (North), Quays (South) and Harbour Parade Car Parks shall be exempt from purchasing a parking ticket, subject to a maximum stay of 3 hours in any charging period and only for a single stay with any charging period in any or all these car parks collectively. This exemption is also subject to the vehicle displaying, in the manner prescribed for parking tickets in Article 18(ii), a valid Quays Member Permit which has been issued by the Council or the Management of The Quays and is being used for the purpose of attending The Quays.

(ii) Quays Staff Permit

The driver of a vehicle left in accordance with the provisions of this Order in the Quays (North) and Quays (South) Car Parks shall be exempt from purchasing a parking ticket, if the vehicle displays, in the manner prescribed for parking tickets in Article 18(ii), a valid Quays Staff Permit which has been issued by the Council or

Management of The Quays and is being used by a member of staff for the purpose of working at The Quays. Otherwise it may be used as per the Quays Member Permit for the purpose of using facilities at the Complex, outside of work time.

- (iii) The period of validity of any permit issued under the provisions of this Article shall be marked clearly upon the permit together with an indication that the permit has been issued by the Council or by The Quays.
- (iv) The entitlement, issuing, period of validity and cancellation of Quays Member Permits and Quays Staff Permits shall be at the discretion of the Council or Management of The Quays. Permits will be issued subject to acceptance of the Terms and Conditions that apply to their use.
- (v) The Council or the Management of The Quays may at any time require an applicant for a permit issued under the provisions of this Article or a holder of such a permit to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a permit made to them as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them or in respect of any permit issued by them as they may reasonably require to verify that the permit is valid.

- 5 (i) The contents of Article 26A paragraph (vii) of the Principal Order shall be deleted and replaced with the following:-

The Manager of The Quays with the prior agreement of Southampton City Council Leisure Client Team shall be authorised to close (in whole or in part) by a Notice thereon, the Quays (North) and Quays (South) car parks and Harbour Parade car park, when, in his opinion it is appropriate to do so because of special circumstances in the operation of the said Complex.

- (ii) Article 26A (as amended) of the Principal Order shall be renumbered Article 26B.

- 6 New Article 26A shall be inserted into the Principal Order as follows:-

Crosshouse Hard Permit

- (i) The Council may at its entire discretion issue a maximum of one permit in respect of the Crosshouse Hard Car Park to any person who is the owner of a vehicle and, in the Council's opinion, needs to leave that vehicle in the car park regularly during the charging hours for the purpose of using the public hard. The period of validity of such a permit shall be 12 months and the charge for a permit shall be £13. The Council may also at its entire discretion limit the number of permits to be issued to any group of users of the public hard.
- (ii) The period of validity of any permit issued under the provisions of this Article shall be marked clearly upon the permit together with an indication that the permit has been issued by the Council.
- (iii) Where a permit has been displayed on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions Article 18(ii) no person other than the driver of that vehicle shall remove the permit from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver of that vehicle.
- (iv) The Council may, by notice in writing, served on the permit holder by sending to the permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the permit or at any other address believed to be that person's place of abode or place of business, withdraw a permit in respect of the Crosshouse Hard Road Car Park if it appears to the Council that the circumstances described in paragraph (i) above no longer apply.
- (v) The Council may at any time require an applicant for a permit issued under the provisions of this Article or a holder of such a permit to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a permit made to them as

they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them or in respect of any permit issued by them as they may reasonably require to verify that the permit is valid.
