

**THE BOROUGH OF SOUTHEND-ON-SEA
(VARIOUS ROADS)
(DISABLED PARKING BAY) ORDER 2001**

The Council of the Borough of Southend-on-Sea in exercise of its powers under Section 32 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as The Borough of Southend-on-Sea (Various Roads) (Disabled Parking Bay) Order 2001 and shall come into operation on the 1 December 2001.

2. In this Order:-

"hackney carriage" means a hackney carriage as defined in Section 38(1) of the Vehicles (Excise) Act 1971;

"authorised cab rank" means any area of carriageway which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1028.2 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1994;

"authorised parking place" means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an order made or having effect as if made under the Act;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1986;

"disabled persons badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1991;

"parking disk" means a disc issued by a local authority, 125 millimetres square, coloured blue and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins; and

"relevant position" means

- (1) A vehicle displays a disabled person's badge issued before 2nd March, 1992 in the relevant position if:-
 - (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen and with its front facing forward so as to be legible from outside the vehicle; or
 - (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle.
- (2) A vehicle displays a disabled person's badge issued on or after 2nd March, 1992 in the relevant position if:-
 - (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle; and
 - (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle.
- (3) A vehicle displays a parking disc in the relevant position if:-
 - (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; or

- (b) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.

3. No person shall cause any vehicle other than a disabled persons vehicle to wait in the parking bay described in Schedule 1 to this Order.

4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order, shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road or on the sides of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-

(a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;

(b) goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle;

(c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-

(1) building, industrial or demolition operations;

(2) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;

(3) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road, or

(4) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line;

(d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties, or

(e) the vehicle to be used for the purposes of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in The Postal Services Act 2000, or

(f) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths or sides of road; or

(g) to enable the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.

5. The prohibitions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by any other enactment.

6. The items listed in Schedule 2 are hereby revoked.

7. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

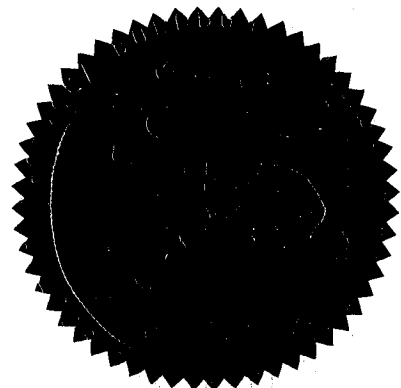

DB 63	A disabled parking bay on the carriageway of Clifftown Parade on the north side, commencing at a point on the north kerbline 2.1m east of the common boundary of Nos 29 and 30 Clifftown Parade, eastwards for a distance of 6.6m with a width throughout of 2.7m	1
DB 62	A disabled parking bay on the carriageway of Danbury Close on the west side, commencing from a point on the west kerbline 48m south of the south kerbline of Stonehill Road, southwards for a distance of 6.6m with a width throughout of 2.7m	1
DB 48	A disabled parking bay on the carriageway of Glenwood Avenue on the east side, commencing at a point on the east kerbline 8.5m south of the common boundary of Nos 94 and 96 Glenwood Avenue southwards for a distance of 6.6m with a width throughout of 2.7m	1
DB 57	A disabled parking bay on the carriageway of Macdonald Avenue on the west side, commencing at a point on the west kerbline 4.8m north of the common boundary of Nos 35 and 37 Macdonald Avenue northwards for a distance of 6.6m with a width throughout of 2.7m	1
DB 46	A disabled parking bay on the service road of Manners Way on the east side, commencing at a point on the east kerbline 5.3m south of the common boundary of Nos 186 and 188 Manners Way southwards for a distance of 6.6m with a width throughout of 2.7m	1
DB 56	A disabled parking bay on the carriageway of Percy Road on the west side, commencing at a point on the west kerbline 8.3m north of the common boundary of Nos 35 and 37 Percy Road northwards for a distance of 6.6m with a width throughout of 2.7m	1
DB 51	A disabled parking bay on the carriageway of Sandleigh Road on the east side, commencing at a point on the east kerbline 5.7m north of the common boundary of Nos 24 and 26 Sandleigh Road northwards for a distance of 6.6m with a width throughout of 2.7m	1
DB 54	A disabled parking bay on the carriageway of Seaforth Grove on the east side, commencing at a point on the east kerbline 7.3m south of the common boundary of Nos 56 and 58 Seaforth Grove southwards for a distance of 6.6m with a width throughout of 2.7m	1
DB 44	A disabled parking bay on the carriageway of Sydney Road on the east side, commencing at a point on the east kerbline 30.5m south of the south kerbline of Bailey Road southwards for a distance of 6.6m with a width throughout of 2.7m	1
