THE HERTFORDSHIRE (LEYTON ROAD, LEYTON GREEN AND AMENBURY LANE, HARPENDEN) (RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2012

The Hertfordshire County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2 and 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984"), and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:-

- 1. This Order may be cited as "The Hertfordshire (Leyton Road, Leyton Green and Amenbury Lane, Harpenden) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 2012" and shall come into operation on Monday 18 November 2013.
- 2. Save as provided in Articles 3, 4 and 5 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in those lengths of Leyton Road, Leyton Green and Amenbury Lane, Harpenden as specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 3. (1) Nothing in Article 2 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by that Article (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as "the restricted area") in relation to
 - (a) a vehicle being used for Fire and Rescue, Ambulance or Police purposes.
 - (b) anything done with the permission of or at the direction of a Police Constable in uniform; or with permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer as defined by the Traffic Management Act 2004 and appointed by St Albans City & District Council.
 - (c) a vehicle which is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the drivers control or which has stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property or when required to do so by law;
 - (d) a vehicle which is stationary in order that it may be used for one or more of the purposes specified in sub-Article (2) of this Article and which cannot reasonably be used for such a purpose without stopping in the restricted area;
 - (e) a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is stationary only for so long as may be reasonably necessary for postal packets to be delivered or collected;

In this Article -

The expressions "universal service provider", "provision of a universal postal Service" and "postal packet" shall bear the same meanings as in the Postal Services Act 2000.

- (2) The "purposes" referred to in sub-Article (1)(d) of this Article are
 - (a) any operation involving building, demolition or excavation;
 - (b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a road;
 - (d) constructing, improving, maintaining, or cleaning of any street furniture; or
 - (e) the laying, erection, alteration, repair or cleaning of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus kept or installed for the purposes of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position.

- Nothing in Article 2 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by that Article (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as "the restricted area") so as to render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait only for so long as may be reasonably necessary—
- (a) to enable goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle from or to premises adjacent to the restricted area; or
- (b) to enable a passenger to board or alight and to load and unload any luggage.
- 5. (1) Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc, to wait at any time in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule of this Order for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 3(1) of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000

"parking disc" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 8(5) of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000; and

reams Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000; and "relevant position" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 4 of The Local

Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the

7. The provisions of the following Order are hereby revoked but only in so far as they are affected by the restrictions imposed by this Order;

The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

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lengths of Leyton Road, Leyton Green and Amenbury Lane, Harpenden

Leyton Road from a point in line with the projected north west kerbline of Amenbury (south west side)

Lane north westvards for approximately 10.5 metres to a point 1 metre north west of a point in line with the south east boundary of 14 Leyton Road.

- Amenbury Lane (a) from its junction with the south west kerbline of Leyton Road south east of a point in line with the projected north east kerbline of Leyton Green (north west side)

 west access).
- (b) from a point in line with the projected south west kerbline of Leyton Green (north west access) south westwards for approximately 22 metres to a point in line with the projected north east kerbline of Leyton Green (southern access).
- (c) from a point in line with the projected north west kerbline of Leyton Green (southern access) south westwards for approximately 18 metres to a point 1.5 metres north east of a point in line with the boundary between 1 and 2 Amenbury Lane.

- (south east side) (a) from a point 7 metres south west of its junction with the south west kerbline of Leyton Road south westwards for approximately 47.5 metres to a point 3 metres south west of a point in line with the projected north east kerbline of Leyton Green (southern access).
 - (b) from a point 16 metres south west of a point in line with the projected north east kerbline of Leyton Green (southern access) south westwards for approximately 16.5 metres to a point 3 metres north east of a point in line with the boundary between 1 and 2 Amenbury Lane.
 - (c) from a point 2 metres north east of a point in line with the boundary between 7 and 8 Amenbury Lane south westwards for approximately 22 metres to a point in line with the projected north east kerbline of the access road into the car park.
 - (d) from a point in line with the projected south west kerbline of the access road into the car park south westwards for approximately 19.5 metres to a point 2 metres south west of a point in line with the projected south west kerbline of Avenue St Nicholas.

Access road into Car Park (both sides)

from its junction with the south east kerbline of Amenbury Lane south eastwards for 5.5 metres.

Leyton Green (southern access) (north west side) from its junction with the north west kerbline of Amenbury Lane north eastwards for approximately 26 metres to a point 11 metres north east of a point in line with the north east boundary of 15 Leyton Green.

(north side)

from a point 11 metres north east of a point in line with the north east boundary of 15 Leyton Green south eastwards for 6 metres.

(east side)

from its junction with the north west kerbline of Amenbury Lane northwards for approximately 12.5 metres to a point 7 metres south west of the south west kerbline of Leyton Green.

(north west access) (north east side)

from a point 1 metre south east of a point in line with the south east boundary of 7 Leyton Green south eastwards for approximately 6 metres to a point 4 metres north west of a point in line with the south east boundary of 12 Leyton Green.
