ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

**THE BOROUGH OF STEVENAGE
(WOODFIELD WARD, STEVENAGE)
(RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2016**

Stevenage Borough Council, pursuant to the arrangements made under Section 19 of the Local Government Act 2000 with Hertfordshire County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2 and 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984"), and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "The Borough of Stevenage (Woodfield Ward, Stevenage) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 2016" and shall come into operation on 5 September 2016
2. Save as provided in Articles 4, 5 and 6(1) of this Order, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in those lengths of road in Stevenage specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
3. Save as provided in Articles 4, 5 and 6(2) of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in those lengths of road in Stevenage specified in Schedule 2 to this Order on those days of the week and at those times of day specified in that schedule.
4. (1) Nothing in Articles 2 or 3 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by those Articles (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as "the restricted area") in relation to:
 - (a) a vehicle being used for Fire and Rescue, Ambulance or Police purposes;
 - (b) anything done with the permission of or at the direction of a Police Constable in uniform; or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer appointed by Stevenage Borough Council;
 - (c) a vehicle which is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the drivers control or which has stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property or when required to do so by law;
 - (d) a vehicle which is stationary in order that it may be used for one or more of the purposes specified in sub-Article (2) of this Article and which cannot reasonably be used for such a purpose without stopping in the restricted area; or
 - (e) a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is stationary only for so long as may be reasonably necessary for postal packets to be delivered or collected.

In this Article -

The expressions "universal service provider", "provision of a universal postal Service" and "postal packet" shall bear the same meanings as in the Postal Services Act 2011.

- (2) The "purposes" referred to in sub-Article (1)(d) of this Article are:

- (a) any operation involving building, demolition or excavation;
 - (b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a road;
 - (d) constructing, improving, maintaining, or cleaning of any street furniture; and
 - (e) the laying, erection, alteration, repair or cleaning of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus kept or installed for the purposes of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position.
5. Nothing in Articles 2 or 3 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by those Articles (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as "the restricted area") so as to render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait only for so long as may be reasonably necessary:
- (a) to enable goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle from or to premises adjacent to the restricted area; or
 - (b) to enable a passenger to board or alight and to load and unload any luggage.
6. (1) Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc, to wait at any time in the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 of this Order for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).
- (2) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, to wait at any time in the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 of this Order.
- (3) In this Article -
- "disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984;
- "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 3(1) of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000
- "parking disc" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 8(5) of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000; and
- "relevant position" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 4 of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000
7. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

8. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

Item number	Name of road	Side of road	Description
1	Herne Road	North-west	From a point 5 metres south-west of its junction with Herne Road (north-western spur) southwards for a distance of 12 metres.
2	Herne Road	North-west, north east and south west	From a point 15 metres north-east of the southwestern end of the carriageway southwards for its entire length including its closed end.
3	Herne Road	South-east	From a point 9 metres north-east of the southwestern end of the carriageway southwards for its entire length.

No waiting at the times and on the days specified

1	Chancellors Road (eastern spur)	East	From a point 10 metres north of its junction with the northern kerb line of Chancellors Road (spine) northwards for a distance of 8 metres	Monday to Friday 10am to 11am and 2pm to 3pm
2	Chancellors Road (eastern spur)	East	From a point 35 metres north of its junction with the northern kerb line of Chancellors Road (spine), northwards for its entire length including the northern end of the road.	Monday to Friday 10am to 11am and 2pm to 3pm
3	Chancellors Road (eastern spur)	West	From a point 10 metres north of its junction with the northern kerb line of Chancellors Road (spine), northwards for its entire length including the northern end of the road.	Monday to Friday 10am to 11am and 2pm to 3pm
4	Tates Way (spine)	South-east	From a point 9 metres north-east of its junction with the north-eastern kerbline of Tates Way (eastern spur) northwards for a distance of 19 metres.	Monday to Friday 10am to 11am and 2pm to 3pm
5	Tates Way (spine)	North-west	From a point 5 metres south-west of its junction with the south-eastern kerbline of Tates Way (western spur) southwards for a distance of 26 metres.	Monday to Friday 10am to 11am and 2pm to 3pm

6	Tates Way (northern spur)	North	From a point 4 metres north-west of its south-eastern end northwards for its entire length.	Monday to Friday 10am to 11am and 2pm to 3pm

8	Tates Way (western spur)	North-east	From a point 7 metres north-west of its junction with Tates Way (spine) northwards for a distance of 20 metres.	Monday to Friday 10am to 11am and 2pm to 3pm
9	Tates Way (western spur)	South-west and south-east	From a point 5 metres north-west of its junction with Tates Way (spine) northwards and south-westwards for a distance of 72 metres.	Monday to Friday 10am to 11am and 2pm to 3pm
10	Tates Way (eastern spur)	South-west	From a point 6 metres south-east of its junction with Tates Way (Spine) southeastwards for its entire length including the turning head.	Monday to Friday 10am to 11am and 2pm to 3pm
