# THE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL OF STOCKPORT (REDROCK, STOCKPORT) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING/LOADING AND UNLOADING, LOADING/UNLOADING ONLY BAYS) ORDER 2018

The Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Stockport ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Section 1 (1), 2(1) to (3), 4(2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act"), the Road Traffic Act 1991 ("the 1991 Act") and the Traffic Management Act 2004 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act and with the 1991 Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

## Interpretation

## 1. (1) In this Order:-

"Civil Enforcement Officer" means a person employed in accordance with section 63A of the 1984 Act as amended by the 2004 Act to carry out the functions referred to therein

"Disabled Persons" and "Disabled Person's Badge" have the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;

"Disabled Persons' Vehicle" has the same meaning as section 142 of the 1984 Act and which is a vehicle, which immediately before or after any period of waiting, has been or is to be driven by a disabled person or, as the case may be, used for carrying Disabled Person(s) as passenger(s);

"Higher Level Contravention" means the contravention of the Waiting and Loading restrictions of this Order.

"Lower Level Contravention" means the contravention of any other Articles of this Order

"Owner" in relation to a vehicle means the person by whom the vehicle is kept. In determining who was the Owner at any time it shall be presumed that the Owner was the person who is named in the vehicle registration document as the registered keeper of a goods light goods or passenger vehicle or the person who has the use of such a vehicle in the course of his employment and who is entitled to use such a vehicle as though he were the registered keeper thereof;

"Parking Disc" means a disc, issued by a Local Authority.

"Parking Place" means any road or part of road authorised by this Order as a place where specified classes of vehicles may wait;

"Penalty Charge" has the same meaning as in section 82(1) of the 1991 Act and is £70 in respect of a Higher Level Contravention and £50 in respect of a Lower Level Contravention or such other charges as may be set by the Council under the provisions of section 74 of the 1991 Act in accordance with guidance given by the Secretary of State for Transport;

- "Penalty Charge Notice" means a notice issued or served by a Civil Enforcement Officer pursuant to the provisions of section 66 of the 1991 Act;
- "Relevant Position" in respect of a Disabled Person's Badge and Parking Disc has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- (3) Unless the context otherwise requires any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to an Article or Schedule so numbered in this Order
- (4) Any reference in this Order to any Act or Regulation shall be construed as a reference to that Act or Regulation as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent Act or Regulation;
- (5) Words importing the singular meaning shall where the context so admits include the plural meaning and vice versa. Words of the masculine gender include the feminine and neuter genders

#### WAITING RESTRICTIONS

#### **Prohibition of Waiting**

2. Save as provided in Articles 5 and 6 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the sides of lengths of road specified in Schedule 1.

#### Prohibition of Loading/Unloading

3. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a Civil Enforcement Officer cause or permit any vehicle to load or unload at any time on the sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2.

#### Loading and unloading only at all times

The sides of lengths of road specified in Schedule 3 are authorised to be used, subject to the provisions of Article 5 as a loading bay area, for all classes of vehicle, in such positions and on such days and during the permitted hours as specified in relation to that part of the road for the purposes of loading and unloading only.

## **Exemptions**

- 5. Nothing in Articles 2 and 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of lengths of road referred to in those Articles for so long as it may be necessary to enable:-
  - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;

- (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
  - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
  - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
  - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of lengths of road; or
  - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair, in or on land adjacent to the said sides of lengths of road, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of and telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (d) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 125 Postal Services Act 2000;
- (e) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said sides of lengths of road;
- (f) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said sides of lengths of road for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral;
- (g) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes; or
- (h) goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle.
- Nothing in Article 2 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays, in the relevant position, a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the sides of lengths of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of length of road on the same day).

#### CONTRAVENTION OF ORDER

## 7. Contravention

If a vehicle is left in a parking place during the permitted hours or in any road or length of road in contravention or without complying with the requirements of this Order a contravention shall have occurred and the penalty charge shall be payable and/or the vehicle may be removed from that location.

# 8. Penalty Charge Notice

In the case of vehicle in respect of which a penalty charge may have been incurred, it shall be the duty of a Civil Enforcement Officer to issue a penalty charge notice which shall include the information required by the 1991 Act.

# 9. Manner of payment of Penalty Charge

The owner of the vehicle in respect of which the penalty charge has been incurred shall pay the penalty charge to the Council as indicated on the penalty charge notice.

#### 10. Indications as evidence

The particulars given in the penalty charge notice attached to a vehicle in accordance with this Article shall be treated as evidence in any proceedings relating to failure to pay such penalty charge.

#### 11. Removal of vehicle

Where a Civil Enforcement Officer has removed or caused to be removed a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 7:-

- (a) he shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle;
- (b) the Council shall be entitled to recover from the person responsible such charges in respect of the removal, storage and disposal of the vehicle as it might prescribe from time to time;
- (c) the provisions of the 1984 Act shall apply to the disposal of such vehicles removed by or on behalf of the Council pursuant to this Article.
- (d) Nothing in Article 10 shall apply in respect of a vehicle displaying in a relevant position a valid disabled person's badge.

# 12. Restriction on removal of notices

Where a penalty charge notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 8, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle, a police constable in uniform, a Civil Enforcement Officer or some other person duly authorised by the Council, shall remove the notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.

#### **COMMENCEMENT & CITATION**

13. This Order shall come into operation on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of October 2018 and may be cited as The Metropolitan Borough Council of Stockport (Redrock, Stockport) (Prohibition of Waiting/Loading and Unloading, Loading/Unloading Only Bays) Order 2018

## SCHEDULE 1 NO WAITING AT ANY TIME

Leyland Street, both sides for its entire length.

Port Street, both sides along its entire length, including the roundabout at its junction with Great Egerton Street and across the Debenhams loading bay access.

Great Egerton Street, north side between Heaton Lane roundabout and the westerly kerb line of Lancashire Hill.

Great Egerton Street, south side between Heaton Lane roundabout and the westerly kerb line of Port Street.

Great Egerton Street, south side from the projected easterly kerb line of Port Street for a distance of 57 metres in an easterly direction.

Great Egerton Street, south side from a point 150 metres east of the projected easterly kerbline of Port Street to its junction with Little Egerton Street in a westerly direction.

Great Egerton Street, south side from the easterly kerb line of Little Egerton Street to the projected easterly kerbline of Lancashire Hill.

Walker Street, both sides along its entire length.

Serveway 4, west side from its junction with Prince's Street for a distance of 22 metres in a southerly direction.

Serveway 5, east side from the southerly kerb line of Prince's Street for a distance of 23 metres in a southerly direction.

Serveway 5, west side from the southerly kerb line of Prince's Street for a distance of 18 metres in a southerly direction.

Hatton Street, both sides along its entire length.

Bridgefield Street north side, from a point 4 metres west of projected westerly kerb line of Hatton Street for a distance of 7 metres in an easterly direction.

Bridgefield Street north side, from the westerly kerb line of the Bridgefield Street car park access to the westerly kerb line of Little Egerton Street.

Bridge field Street south side, from a point 4 metres west of the westerly kerb line of Hatton Street for a distance of 25 metres in an easterly direction.

Tiviot Dale, west wide, from the northerly kerb line of Prince's Street for a distance of 6 metres in a northerly direction.

Bridgefield Street south side, from a point 34.5 metres east of the easterly kerb line of Hatton Street for a distance of 10 metres in an easterly direction.

Bridgefield Street, south side from a point 66 metres east of the easterly kerb line of Hatton Street to the westerly kerb line of Little Egerton Street.

Bridgefield Street car park access road, both sides along its entire length.

Little Egerton Street, both sides, along its entire length.

Bridgefield Street, north side from a point 15 metres east of the easterly kerb line of Port Street to a point 4 metres west of the westerly kerb line of Hatton Street.

Bridgefield Street, south side from a point 17 metres east of the easterly kerb line of Port Street to a point 4 metres west of the westerly kerb line of Hatton Street.

Serveway 5, both sides along its entire length and cul-de-sac end.

Serveway 4, both sides along its entire length and cul-de-sac end.

Serveway 3, both sides along its entire length and cul-de-sac end.

# SCHEDULE 2 NO LOADING/UNLOADING AT ANY TIME

Leyland Street, both sides for its entire length.

Port Street, both sides along its entire length, including the roundabout at its junction with Great Egerton Street and across the Debenhams loading bay access.

Great Egerton Street, north side between Heaton Lane roundabout and the westerly kerb line of Lancashire Hill.

Great Egerton Street, south side between Heaton Lane roundabout and the westerly kerb line of Port Street.

Great Egerton Street, south side from the projected easterly kerb line of Port Street for a distance of 57 metres in an easterly direction.

Great Egerton Street, south side from a point 150 metres east of the projected easterly kerbline of Port Street to its junction with Little Egerton Street in a westerly direction.

Great Egerton Street, south side from the easterly kerb line of Little Egerton Street to the projected easterly kerbline of Lancashire Hill.

Walker Street, both sides along its entire length.

Serveway 4, west side from its junction with Prince's Street for a distance of 22 metres in a southerly direction.

Serveway 5, east side from the southerly kerb line of Prince's Street for a distance of 23 metres in a southerly direction.

Serveway 5, west side from the southerly kerb line of Prince's Street for a distance of 18 metres in a southerly direction.

Hatton Street, both sides along its entire length.

Bridgefield Street north side, from a point 4 metres west of projected westerly kerb line of Hatton Street for a distance of 7 metres in an easterly direction.

Bridgefield Street north side, from the westerly kerb line of the Bridgefield Street car park access to the westerly kerb line of Little Egerton Street.

Bridgefield Street south side, from a point 4 metres west of the westerly kerb line of Hatton Street for a distance of 25 metres in an easterly direction.

Tiviot Dale, west wide, from the northerly kerb line of Prince's Street for a distance of 6 metres in a northerly direction.

Bridgefield Street south side, from a point 34.5 metres east of the easterly kerb line of Hatton Street for a distance of 10 metres in an easterly direction.

Bridgefield Street, south side from a point 66 metres east of the easterly kerb line of Hatton Street to the westerly kerb line of Little Egerton Street.


Bridgefield Street car park access road, both sides along its entire length.

# SCHEDULE 3 LOADING/UNLOADING BAY ONLY

Bridgefield Street, south side from a point 45 metres east of the easterly kerb line of Hatton Street for a distance of 21 metres in an easterly direction.

Great Egerton Street, south side from a point 57 metres east of the projected eastern kerbline of Port Street for a distance of 90 metres in an easterly direction.
