

**The Surrey County Council
(Various Roads in Reigate and Banstead)
(Amendment of Waiting Loading and Unloading Prohibition and On-Street
Parking Places Orders) Order 2018 (Amendment No.3) Order 2021**

Surrey County Council in exercise of their powers under 1(1), 2 (1) to (3), 4(2), 32, 35, 36, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 51, 52 and 53 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter called "The Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to The Act hereby make the following Order:-

Citation and commencement

1. THIS Order may be cited as "The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Reigate and Banstead) (Amendment of Waiting Loading and Unloading Prohibition and On-Street Parking Places Orders) (Amendment No.3) Order 2021" and shall come into operation on 1 November 2021

Interpretation

2. (1) In this Order unless the context otherwise requires the following expressions shall have the same meanings hereby respectively assigned to them –

"enactment" means any enactment whether public general or local and includes any order bylaw rule regulation scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment

"Principal Orders" means each of the relevant principal Orders listed in Article 3(a) Article 3(b) Article 3(c) Article 3(d) Article 3(e) Article 3(f) Article 3(g) Article 3(h) Article 3(i) Article 3(j) Article 3(k) Article 3(l) Article 3(m) Article 3(n) and Article 3(o)

- (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended applied consolidated re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment
- (3) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article shall unless the context otherwise requires be construed as a reference to the Article bearing that number in this Order
- (4) Unless the context otherwise requires any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Principal Order shall have the same meaning as in that Principal Order

Amendment of the Principal Orders

3. WITHOUT prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order:-

- (a) "THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS IN REIGATE AND BANSTEAD) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING LOADING AND UNLOADING AND REVOCATION) ORDER 2013" shall have effect as though for the List of Plans in the Second Schedule to the said Order there was substituted the List of Plans set out in the Third Schedule to this Order
- (b) "THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS IN REIGATE AND BANSTEAD) (CONSOLIDATION OF FREE STREET PARKING PLACES AND REVOCATION) ORDER 2013" shall have effect as though for the List of Plans in the Schedule to the said Order there was substituted the List of Plans set out in the Third Schedule to this Order

- (c) "THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS IN REIGATE AND BANSTEAD) (FREE STREET PARKING PLACES) (DISABLED PERSONS) ORDER 2013" shall have effect as though for the List of Plans in the Second Schedule to the said Order there was substituted the List of Plans set out in the Third Schedule to this Order
- (d) "THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL (GARDENS ESTATE HORLEY CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND FREE STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2013" shall have effect as though for the List of Plans in the Second Schedule to the said Order there was substituted the List of Plans set out in the Third Schedule to this Order
- (e) "THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS IN REIGATE CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING, LOADING AND UNLOADING AND FREE STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2013" shall have effect as though for the List of Plans in the Second Schedule to the said Order there was substituted the List of Plans set out in the Third Schedule to this Order
- (f) "THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS IN REIGATE AND BANSTEAD) (RESIDENTS' ON-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2013" shall have effect as though –
- (i) for the List of Plans in the Second Schedule to the said Order there was substituted the List of Plans set out in the Third Schedule to this Order
 - (ii) for the First Schedule to the said Order there was substituted the First Schedule set out in the First Schedule to this Order

(g) "THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS IN REDHILL CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING LOADING AND UNLOADING AND FREE STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2013" shall have effect as though –

- (i) for the List of Plans in the Second Schedule to the said Order there was substituted the List of Plans set out in the Third Schedule to this Order
- (ii) for the Arrangement of Articles there was inserted the following part immediately after Part III

(iii) in Article 2(1) there were added the following expressions and the meanings assigned to them –

““loading bay” means the part of a road authorised by this Order to be used as a free on-street loading bay or a goods vehicles’ loading bay

(iv) there were added the following Articles immediately after Article 24

“Authorisation of loading bays

24A EACH area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a road identified on the plans as a free on-street loading bay within the areas marked with a black broken line and labelled as Redhill Controlled Parking Zone and bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a minimum width throughout of 1.8 metres is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order as a free on-street loading bay for use on such days and during such hours as identified on the plans

Vehicles for which free on-street loading bays

are authorised

24B THE loading bays may be used free of charge subject to the provisions of this Order for the leaving during the permitted hours of all classes of vehicle specified in Section 136 of the Act and includes any trailer which is being drawn by such a vehicle

PROVIDED THAT the vehicle left in the loading bay is actually in the process of being used for the purpose of collecting goods or burden of any description from or delivering goods or burden of any description to any premises situated adjacent to or in the vicinity of that loading bay

FOR the avoidance of doubt it is hereby stated by the Council that the provisions of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 (S.I. 2000/683) shall not apply to this Article

Authorisation of goods vehicles' loading bays

24C EACH area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a road identified on the plans as a goods vehicles' free on-street loading bay within the areas marked with a black broken line and labelled as Redhill Controlled Parking Zone and bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a minimum width throughout of 1.8 metres is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order as a goods vehicles' loading bay for use on such days and during such hours as identified on the plans

Vehicles for which such goods vehicles' loading bays are authorised

24D THE goods vehicles' loading bays may be used free of charge subject to the provisions of this Order for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles only as are goods vehicles and includes any trailer which is being drawn by such a vehicle

PROVIDED THAT the vehicle left in the goods vehicles' loading bay is actually in the process of being used for the purpose of collecting goods or burden of any description from or delivering goods or burden of any description to any premises situated adjacent to or in the vicinity of that loading bay

FOR the avoidance of doubt it is hereby stated by the Council that the provisions of the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000 (S.I. 2000/683) shall not apply to this Article

Period for which a vehicle may be left in a loading bay

24E WITHOUT prejudice to the provisions of Article 24K no person shall cause any vehicle to be left during the permitted hours in a time limited loading bay for longer than the maximum period permitted for waiting specified in relation to that parking place and as identified on the plans

Interval before a vehicle may again be left in a loading bay

24F WITHOUT prejudice to the provisions of Article 24L no vehicle which has been taken away from a loading bay specified in the plans during the permitted hours shall until the expiration of the

period of time indicated on the said plans from the time it was taken away again be left in that parking place during the permitted hours

Manner of standing/waiting in a loading bay

24G THE driver of a vehicle standing in a loading bay during the permitted hours in accordance with the provisions of this Order or waiting in a loading bay in accordance with sub-paragraph (1)(e) (f) (g) (h) (i) or (j) of Article 24L of this Order shall cause it so to stand or wait so that:-

- (a) (i) if the said loading bay is not in a one-way road that the left or near side or right or off side of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle or
- (ii) if the said loading bay is in a one-way road that the left or near side of the vehicle is adjacent to the left-hand edge of the carriageway or that the right or off side of the vehicle is adjacent to the right-hand edge of the carriageway and
- (iii) that the distance between the edge of the carriageway and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres

(b) every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a loading bay

PROVIDED THAT in relation to paragraphs (a) and (b) of this Article any person causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in a loading bay by virtue of the provisions of sub-paragraph (1)(e) (f) (g) (h) (i) or (j) of Article 24L where if the length of the vehicle precludes

compliance with these paragraphs that person shall cause the vehicle to wait so that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres

(c) that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting

Alteration of position of a vehicle in a loading bay

24H WHERE any vehicle is standing in a loading bay in contravention of the provisions of Article 24G a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer or a person duly authorised by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions

Restriction on the use of loading bay

24I DURING the permitted hours no person shall use a loading bay or any vehicle while it is in the loading bay in connection with the sale or offering or exposing for sale of any goods to any person in or near the loading bay or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of his skill in handicraft or his services in any other capacity PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle if the vehicle is one which may wait in the loading bay in accordance with Article 24B and the goods are immediately delivered and taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected

24J THE driver of a motor vehicle using a loading bay shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the loading bay and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the loading bay

Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in a loading bay

24K (1) A duly authorised civil enforcement officer a police constable in uniform a person acting under the instructions (whether general or specific) of the Chief Officer of Police or a person duly authorised by the Council or the Borough Council may suspend the use of a loading bay or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:

- (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety
- (b) for the purpose of any building demolition or excavation operations adjacent to the loading bay the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to the loading bay the laying erection alteration or repair in or adjacent to the loading bay of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas water or electricity or of any electronic communications apparatus or the placing maintenance or removal of any traffic sign
- (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the loading bay on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent

to the loading bay from or to a depository another office
or dwelling-house

(d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some
special attraction that any road will be thronged or
obstructed or

(e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to
the loading bay at times of weddings or funerals or on
any other special occasions

(2) Subject to paragraph (1) of this Article a police constable in
uniform may suspend for not longer than twenty-four hours the use
of the loading bay or any part thereof whenever he considers such
suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the
movement of traffic or promoting its safety

(3) On suspension of the use of the loading bay or any part thereof
in accordance with the provisions of this Article the person
authorising or causing such suspension shall place or cause to be
placed in or adjacent to the loading bay or that part thereof as the
case may be a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that the waiting
by vehicles is prohibited

(4) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the
loading bay or any part thereof at any time during the permitted
hours during which there is displayed or adjacent to the loading bay
or that part thereof as the case may be a traffic sign or traffic signs
placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article:-

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this paragraph shall apply -

- (i) in respect of any vehicle being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 24L (1) (b) (d) or (e) or
- (ii) to anything done with the permission of the person suspending the use of the loading bay or part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article or a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer acting in the exercise of lawful authority

Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in a loading bay

24L (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours anywhere in any part of a loading bay if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:

- (a) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident
- (b) the vehicle is being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or not being a passenger vehicle a motor-cycle or an invalid carriage is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties of the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting

- (c) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic
- (d) the vehicle is waiting -
 - (i) while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the loading bay in which the vehicle is waiting are being unloaded from the vehicle or having been unloaded therefrom are being delivered or
 - (ii) while postal packets are being collected for loading on the vehicle from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the loading bay in which the vehicle is waiting or having been so collected are being loaded thereon
- (e) the vehicle not being a passenger vehicle a motor-cycle or an invalid carriage is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 24K
- (1) (b)
- (f) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the loading bay in which the vehicle is waiting from or to a depository another office or dwelling-house

(g) the vehicle is displaying in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid waiver certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Council to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate no waiver certificate needs to be displayed on the vehicle PROVIDED THAT a waiver certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid and that a notification of such cancellation shall be sent by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council

(2) Except as provided by this Order the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in the loading bay during the permitted hours

Movement of a vehicle in the loading bay in an emergency

24M ANY person duly authorised by the Council a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may move or cause to be moved in case of emergency to any place he thinks fit any vehicle left unattended in a loading bay

Removal of vehicles from a loading bay

24N (1) When a vehicle is left in a loading bay in contravention of any of the provisions contained in this Order a person authorised in that behalf by the Council or a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be moved from the loading bay

BUT PROVIDED THAT civil enforcement officers shall not exercise the powers in this Article other than in accordance with the 1986 Regulations

(2) Where it appears to the Borough Council or a police constable in uniform that a vehicle left in the loading bay has been abandoned a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform may in such manner as they consider necessary for the purpose remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be moved from the loading bay

PROVIDED THAT where the Borough Council or a police constable in uniform propose to move such a vehicle which in the opinion of the Council or the Chief Constable is in such a condition that it ought to be destroyed then they shall not less than twenty-four hours before removing it cause to be affixed to the vehicle a notice stating that they propose to remove it for destruction at the end of that period

24O WHEN a person authorised by the Council or a police constable in uniform removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a loading bay by authority of Article 24N he shall except in the case of a vehicle which in the opinion of the Council or the Chief Constable is in such condition that it ought to be destroyed make such arrangements as may be deemed reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle

Charges for the removal and storage of vehicles

24P WHERE a vehicle is removed by the Council or a police constable in uniform from a loading bay in pursuance of Article 24N there shall be payable to the Council or the Chief Constable pursuant to Section 102 of the Act and the Removal, Storage and Disposal of Vehicles (Prescribed Sums and Charges etc) Regulations 1989 charges for the removal storing and disposal of the said vehicle in accordance with the provisions of the said Regulations

Placing of traffic signs etc

24Q THE Council shall -

- (a) place and maintain a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating the limits of each loading bay and
- (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each loading bay referred to in the plans a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that such loading bay may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving

only of the vehicles specified in Article 24B or

Article 24D as the case may be and

- (c) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a loading bay"

(h) "THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL REIGATE AND BANSTEAD (ON-STREET CAR CLUB PARKING PLACES ORDER 2016" shall have effect as though for the List of Plans in the Second Schedule to the said Order there was substituted the List of Plans set out in the Third Schedule to this Order

(i) "THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS IN REDHILL CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING LOADING AND UNLOADING AND FREE STREET PARKING PLACES) (NO.2) ORDER 2016" shall have effect as though for the List of Plans in the First Schedule to the said Order there was substituted the List of Plans set out in the Third Schedule to this Order

(j) "THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS IN REIGATE AND BANSTEAD) (PROHIBITION OF STOPPING OUTSIDE SCHOOLS) ORDER 2013" shall have effect as though for the List of Plans in the Third Schedule to the said Order there was substituted the List of Plans set out in the Third Schedule to this Order

(k) "THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL PERMIT HOLDERS ON-STREET PARKING PLACE (PERMIT ZONE) IN THE BOROUGH OF REIGATE AND BANSTEAD ORDER 2015" shall have effect as though –

- (i) for the List of Plans in the Second Schedule to the said Order there was substituted the List of Plans set out in the Third Schedule to this Order
- (ii) for the First Schedule to the said Order there was substituted the First Schedule set out in the Second Schedule to this Order
- (l) "THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS IN REIGATE AND BANSTEAD) (FREE ON-STREET LOADING BAYS) ORDER 2013" shall have effect as though for the List of Plans in the Schedule to the said Order there was substituted the List of Plans set out in the Third Schedule to this Order
- (m) "THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL (D1175) QUALITY STREET AND OLD MILL LANE MERSTHAM IN THE BOROUGH OF REIGATE AND BANSTEAD (ON-STREET PARKING PLACE) ORDER 2013" shall have effect as though –
 - (i) for the List of Plans in the Second Schedule to the said Order there was substituted the List of Plans set out in the Third Schedule to this Order
 - (ii) for the Arrangement of Articles there was inserted the following part immediately after Part II –

DESIGNATION OF SHARED USE PARKING PLACES

Designation of such parking places

11A EACH area on a highway comprising the lengths of carriageway of a road identified on the plans as a shared use parking place (within the lengths of roads specified in Part III of the First Schedule) and unless otherwise so specified bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 1.83 metres is hereby designated as a shared use parking place

Vehicles for which such parking places are designated

11B EACH shared use parking (within the lengths of roads specified in Part III of the First Schedule) identified on the plans may be used subject to the provisions of this Order for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles only -

- (a) as are passenger vehicles goods vehicles motor cycles or invalid carriages
- (b) as display in the manner specified in Articles 21 25 27 or 27(e) a valid Parking Permit issued in respect of that vehicle
- (c) as is a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority

Period for which a vehicle may be left in such a parking place

11C WITHOUT prejudice to the provisions of Article 11J no person shall cause any vehicle to be left in a shared use parking place identified on the plans (within the lengths of roads specified in Part III of the First Schedule) during the permitted hours for longer than the maximum period permitted for waiting specified in relation to that parking place as identified on the key relating to the plans:-

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall apply to -

- (a) a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority and/or

(b) such vehicles as display in the manner specified in Articles 21 25 27 or 27(e) a valid Parking Permit issued by the Council in respect of that vehicle and/or

(c) such vehicles as display in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid Waiver Certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Council to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate

PROVIDED THAT a Waiver Certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid and that a notification of such cancellation shall be sent by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council

Interval before a vehicle may again be left in such a parking place

11D WITHOUT prejudice to the provisions of Article 11J no vehicle which has been taken away from a parking space (where such parking space is provided) in a shared use parking place (within the lengths of roads specified in Part III of the First Schedule) identified on the plans during the permitted hours shall until the expiration of the period of time as is identified on the key on the said plans from the time it was taken away again be left in that parking place during the permitted hours:-

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall apply to -

(a) a vehicle waiting in such a parking place pursuant to the provisions of Article 11J or displaying in the manner specified in Articles 21 25 27 or 27(e) a valid Permit issued in respect of that vehicle

(b) a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority

(c) such vehicles as display in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid Waiver Certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Council to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate

PROVIDED THAT a Waiver Certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid and that a notification of such cancellation shall be sent by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council

Manner of standing in such a parking place

11E THE driver of a vehicle waiting in a shared use parking place during the permitted hours in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order shall cause it so to stand:-

(a) in the case of a shared use parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are identified on the plans so as to be in accordance with those provisions

(b) in the case of any other shared use parking place -

(i) if the said parking place is not in a one-way road that the left or near side or right or off side of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle or

(ii) if the said parking place is in a one-way road that the left or near side of the vehicle is adjacent to the left-hand edge of the carriageway or that the right or off side of the vehicle is adjacent to the right-hand edge of the carriageway and

(iii) that the distance between the edge of the carriageway and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres and

(c) (i) that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a parking space and/or

(ii) that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a shared use parking place and

(d) that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting

Alteration of position of a vehicle in such a parking place

11F WHERE any vehicle is standing in a shared use parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 12(e) or of the

provisions of Article 12(k) a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in Order that its position shall comply with those provisions

Power to suspend the use of such a parking place

12G (1) Subject to the following persons or organisations being able to exercise the function described below in this Article by virtue of legislation, a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform, a person acting under the instructions (whether general or specific) of the Chief Officer of Police, or a person duly authorised by the Council or the Borough Council may suspend the use of a shared use parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:-

- (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety
- (b) for the purpose of any building operation demolition or excavation adjacent to the said parking place the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to that parking place the laying erection alteration or repair in or adjacent to that parking place of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas water or electricity or of any electronic communications apparatus or the placing maintenance or removal of any traffic sign
- (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the said parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to

or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to that parking place
from or to a depository another office or dwelling-house

(d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some
special attraction that any road will be thronged or obstructed or

(e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to
the said parking place at times of weddings or funerals or on other
special occasions

(2) Subject as set out in paragraph (1) of this Article a police
constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may suspend for
not longer than twenty-four hours the use of a shared use parking
place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension
reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement
of traffic or promoting its safety

(3) On the suspension of the use of a shared use parking place or
any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Article the
person authorising or causing such suspension shall place or cause
to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof
as the case may be a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that the
waiting by vehicles is prohibited

(4) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in a shared
use parking place or any part thereof during such period as there is
in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof as the case
may be a traffic sign or traffic signs placed in pursuance of
paragraph (3) of this Article:

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this paragraph shall apply -

(i) in respect of any vehicle being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 11G(1)(b) (d) or (e) or

(ii) to anything done with the permission of the person suspending the use of that parking place or that part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article or a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer acting in the exercise of lawful authority

Restriction on the use of such a parking place or a vehicle in such a parking place

11H DURING the permitted hours no person shall use any shared use parking place or any vehicle while it is in a shared use parking place in connection with the sale or offering or exposing for sale of any goods to any person in or near the shared use parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of his skill in handicraft or his services in any other capacity:

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle -

(a) if the vehicle is one which may wait in a shared use parking place in accordance with Article 12B and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected or

(b) if the vehicle is one to which the provisions of Article 11J (1)(h) or (i) apply

11I THE driver of a motor vehicle using a shared use parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the said parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from that parking place

Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in such a parking place

11J (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours anywhere in any part of a shared use parking place if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:-

(a) the vehicle is waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes or such longer period as a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer acting in accordance with lawful authority may approve to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage

PROVIDED THAT if the said person is a person suffering from any disability or injury which seriously impairs his ability to walk or who is blind the vehicle may wait for as long as may be necessary to enable that person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage

(b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in Order to avoid an accident

(c) the vehicle is being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or not being a passenger vehicle a motor cycle or

an invalid carriage is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting

(d) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic

(e) the vehicle is waiting -

(i) while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the shared use parking place in which the vehicle is waiting are being unloaded from the vehicle or having been unloaded therefrom are being delivered or

(ii) while postal packets are being collected for loading on the vehicle from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the shared use parking place in which the vehicle is waiting or having been so collected are being loaded thereon

(f) the vehicle not being a passenger vehicle a motor cycle or an invalid carriage is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 11G(1)(b)

(g) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the shared use parking place in which the vehicle is waiting from or to a depository another office or dwelling-house

(h) in any other case the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the shared use parking place in which the vehicle is waiting and the vehicle does not wait for such purpose for more than twenty minutes or for such longer period as a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may approve

(i) the vehicle is waiting otherwise than in a parking space (where such parking space is provided) if goods are being sold or offered or exposed for sale from the vehicle by a person who is licensed by the Council or the Borough Council to sell goods from a stationary vehicle on a pitch situated in the shared use parking place or

(j) the vehicle is displaying in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid Waiver Certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Council or the Borough Council to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate

PROVIDED THAT a Waiver Certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council or the Borough Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid and that a notification of such cancellation shall be sent by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Council or the Borough Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council or the Borough Council

(2) Except as provided by this Order the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a shared use parking place during the permitted hours

Manner of waiting in such a parking place

11K NO person shall cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a shared use parking place by virtue of the provisions of sub-paragraph (1)(e) (f) (g) (h) (i) or (j) of the last preceding Article otherwise than:-

(a) in the case of a shared use parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are identified on the plans so that the vehicle shall stand -

(i) unless the length of the vehicle precludes compliance with this sub-paragraph in accordance with those provisions and so that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the shared use parking place or

(ii) if the length of the vehicle does preclude compliance with the last preceding sub-paragraph so that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres and

(b) in the case of any other shared use parking place so that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the

said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres and

(c) so that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting

For the purposes of the last foregoing paragraph the expression "premises" shall not include any premises to or from which any furniture is being removed by virtue of the provisions of sub-paragraph (1)(g) of the last preceding Article or to or from which goods are being delivered or collected by virtue of the provisions of sub-paragraph (1)(h) of that Article

Placing of traffic signs etc

11L THE Council shall -

(a) place and maintain a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating the limits of each shared use parking place and/or each parking space and

(b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each shared use parking place identified on the plans a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that such parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Article 11B and

(c) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a shared use parking place"
