

**THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL
(VARIOUS ROADS IN TANDRIDGE)
(REVOCATION AND CONSOLIDATION OF
FREE ON-STREET PARKING PLACES)
ORDER 2024**

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SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL in exercise of their powers under Sections 32 35 36 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter called "The Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to The Act hereby make the following Order:-

PART I
GENERAL

Citation and commencement

- 1 This Order may be cited as "The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Tandridge) (Revocation and Consolidation of Free On-Street Parking Places) Order 2024" and shall come into operation on 22 August 2024

Interpretation

- 2 (1) In this Order except where the context otherwise requires the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-
 - "agents" means any person or persons authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise and/or enforce any parking place or loading bay.
 - "carriageway" has the same meaning as in Section 329 of the Highways Act 1980
 - "civil enforcement officer" has the same meaning as in Section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004
 - "Council" means Surrey County Council or its appointed agents
 - "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 (S.I. 2000 No. 682)
 - "disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000 (S.I. 2000 No. 683)
 - "District Council" means the Tandridge District Council
 - "driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place.
 - "electronic communications apparatus" has the same meaning as in Section 151 of the Communications Act 2003
 - "enactment" means any enactment whether public general or local and includes any order byelaw rule regulation scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment.

“free parking ticket” means a ticket issued free of charge by a ticket machine indicating vehicle registration mark of the vehicle, the date and time on which the ticket is valid and the date and time that the ticket expires obtained in accordance with Article 9 of this Order and for use in such a parking place as specified in Article 7 of this Order”

“goods” means goods of any kind whether animate or inanimate and “delivering” and “collecting” in relation to any goods or postal packets includes checking the goods or postal packets for the purpose of their delivery or collection

“goods vehicle” means a motor vehicle the maximum gross weight of which does not exceed 5 tonnes and which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description and is not drawing a trailer

“hand held device” is a device used by a civil enforcement officer which is updated from time to time with information on valid and invalid (expired) virtual parking transactions

“maximum gross weight” has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 (SI. 2016 No. 362)

“motor cycle” “motor vehicle” and “invalid carriage” have the same meanings as in Section 136 of the Act

“one-way road” means a highway in which the driving of vehicles otherwise than in one direction is prohibited

“Owner” has the same meaning as defined in sub-section (1) of Section 92 of the Traffic Management Act 2004

“parking disc” has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000 (SI. 2000 No 683)

“parking place” means an area on a highway designated as a free on street parking place by this Order

“Parking Space” means a space in a parking place which is provided for the leaving of vehicles

“parking ticket” has the same meaning as a “free parking ticket”

“Penalty Charge” has the same meaning as defined in Section 92 of the Traffic Management Act 2004

“permitted hours” means the hours identified on the plans

“plans” means the drawings listed in the First Schedule to this Order created and retained by the Council for the purpose of this Order the drawing number of each of those drawings being given in the first column of that Schedule

“postal packets” has the same meaning as in Sub-section (1) of Section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000

“registration mark” has the same meaning as in Section 23(1) of the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 (c.22)

“road” includes part of a road and has the same meaning as in Section 142 of the Act

“street parking place” has the same meaning as in Section 142 of the Act and authorised to be used as a street parking place by this Order

“the 1986 Regulations” means The Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986 (SI. 1986/183)

“ticket machine” for the purpose of this Order means an apparatus designed to issue free parking tickets

“trailer” has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Act and includes a trailer any part of which is superimposed on the drawing vehicle

“virtual parking transaction” is amongst other things a virtual waiver certificate

“virtual waiver certificate” means a waiver certificate that is electronically issued and verified by the Council

“waiver certificate” means a paper or virtual certificate issued on behalf of the Council for the purposes of Articles 13(b) and 20(1)(j) permitting a specified vehicle to wait in special circumstances on a length or lengths of roads where the waiting of that vehicle would otherwise be restricted or prohibited

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying -
- (a) a disabled person’s badge in the prescribed manner when -
 - (i) the badge is exhibited thereon on the dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or
 - (ii) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or fascia the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle.
 - (b) a parking disc in the relevant position if -
 - (i) the disc is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or
 - (ii) where the vehicle does not have a dashboard or fascia the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that when

marked to show the quarter-hour period during which a period of waiting began that period is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle

- (3) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended applied consolidated re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment
- (4) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Part or Article or Schedule shall unless the context otherwise requires be construed as a reference to the Part or Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order
- (5) For the purposes of sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (4) of Article 17 and of Article 20 a vehicle and any trailer drawn thereby shall be deemed to be a single vehicle
- (6) Any reference in this Order to a length of a road shall unless otherwise specified be construed as a reference to the whole width of that length of road

PART II

AUTHORISATION OF FREE ON-STREET PARKING PLACES

Authorisation of parking places

- 3 EACH part of a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a road specified on the plans as a free on-street parking place and unless otherwise so specified bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of no less than 1.8 metres is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order as a parking place for use on such days and during such hours as identified on the aforesaid plans

Vehicles for which parking places are authorised to be used

- 4 EACH parking place may be used subject to the provisions of this Order for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles only as are passenger vehicles goods vehicles motor cycles or invalid carriages

PART III

AUTHORISATION OF FREE ON-STREET PARKING PLACES

IN WESTWAY (D1399) CATERHAM ON THE HILL

Authorisation of parking places

- 5 EACH part of that length of Westway (D1399) Caterham on the Hill which lies between the north-western kerb-line of Chaldon Road and the south-eastern kerb-

line of Avenue Road and which comprises a length of carriageway of that road which is identified on the plans and bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 2.75 metres is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order as a parking place for use on such days and during such hours as identified on the aforesaid plans

Vehicles for which parking places are authorised to be used

- 6 EACH parking place may be used subject to the provisions of this Order for the leaving during the permitted hours of all classes of vehicle and any type of vehicle PROVIDED THAT no vehicle shall be left in a parking place if the overall width of that vehicle together with the load (if any) carried thereon exceeds 2.75 metres

PART IV

**DESIGNATION OF PARKING PLACES
FOR WHICH A PARKING TICKET IS REQUIRED**

Authorisation for such parking places

- 7 EACH part of a highway comprising the lengths of carriageway of the roads identified on the plans as a parking place for which a parking ticket is required and unless otherwise so specified bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of no less than 1.8 metres is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order as a parking place for which a parking ticket is required for use with such conditions on such days and during such hours as identified on the aforesaid plans

Vehicles for which such parking places are designated

- 8 EACH parking place for which a ticket is required may be used subject to the provisions of this Order for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles only as are passenger vehicles goods vehicles motor cycles or invalid carriages

Parking tickets to be displayed on vehicles left in such parking places

- 9 (1) AT all times during which a vehicle is left in such a parking place during the permitted hours in the roads and lengths of roads specified in Article 7 the driver thereof before leaving the vehicle shall –
- (a) Validate their parking by entering the Vehicle Registration Mark at the nearest ticket machine and obtain a free parking ticket and
 - (b) Either -

- (i) cause to be displayed in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen a valid parking ticket so that the side containing the date and time of expiry is directed outwards from immediately behind the windscreen or the window nearest to the edge of the carriageway and to be clearly visible to a person outside the vehicle or
 - (ii) cause to be displayed in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen a valid parking ticket so that the side containing the date and time of expiry is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle
- (2) WITHOUT PREJUDICE to the provisions in this Article, if at any time while a vehicle is left in a parking places referred to in Article 7 and no indication appears in the vehicle's windscreen that the vehicle was validated or an indication that the parking period for which that vehicle was validated has expired then it shall be presumed unless contrary is provided that either –
- (a) the parking has not been validated in respect of that vehicle or
 - (b) the parking period for which that vehicle was validated has already expired

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall apply to a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority or to such vehicles as display in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid waiver certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Council to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate

No parking tickets to be displayed other than those obtained by validating the parking at the ticket machine

10 NO person shall display on a vehicle left in a parking place referred to in Article 7 during the permitted hours any ticket issued by a ticket machine situated near to that parking place other than the ticket issued by such a ticket machine upon validating the parking in respect of that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 9

Indications by ticket machine and parking tickets as evidence

11 (1) if at any time while the vehicle is left in a parking place in Article 7 during the permitted hours no free parking ticket issued by a ticket machine situated near

to that parking place is displayed on the vehicle it shall be presumed unless the contrary is proved that the parking has not been validated

- (2) if at any time while a vehicle is left in a parking place referred to in Article 7 during the permitted hours the free parking ticket issued by a ticket machine situated near to that parking place and displayed on the vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 9 the free parking ticket issued by that ticket machine gives the indication that the period for which the parking was validated has expired and shall be presumed unless the contrary is proved that the parking has been validated and that the period of validity has already expired
- (3) any free parking ticket issued by a ticket machine situated near to that parking place shall be presumed unless the contrary is proved to have been issued on the day and at the time shown thereon

Exemptions from validating parking at the ticket machine

- 12 WITHOUT PREJUDICE to Article 13 and Article 14 in the case of such a parking place as specified in Article 7 if on the leaving of a vehicle during the permitted hours in a parking bay (if such a parking bay is provided) in that parking place there is on every ticket machine situated in or in the vicinity of that parking place a notice placed by a civil enforcement officer or any person duly authorised by the Council or the District Council indicating that the ticket machine is out of order that vehicle shall be exempt from validating the parking in accordance with provisions specified in Article 9

PART V

SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS

RELATING TO THE USE OF FREE ON-STREET PARKING PLACES

Period for which a vehicle may be left in a parking place

- 13 WITHOUT prejudice to the provisions of Article 20, no person shall cause any vehicle to be left during the permitted hours in a time limited parking place for longer than the maximum period permitted for waiting specified in relation to that parking place and as identified on the plans

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall apply to

- (a) a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority
- (b) such vehicles as display in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the

vehicle a valid waiver certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Council to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate OR as have been recorded by the hand held device as having a valid virtual waiver certificate in which case no waiver certificate needs to be displayed on the vehicle

PROVIDED THAT a waiver certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid and that a notification of such cancellation shall be sent electronically or by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council

Interval before a vehicle may again be left in a parking place

14 WITHOUT prejudice to the provisions of Article 20 no vehicle which has been taken away from a parking place specified in the plans during the permitted hours shall until the expiration of the period of time indicated on the said plans from the time it was taken away again be left in that parking place during the permitted hours

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall apply to a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority

Manner of standing / waiting in a parking place

15 THE driver of a vehicle standing in a parking place during the permitted hours in accordance with the provisions of this Order or waiting therein in accordance with sub-paragraph (1)(e) (f) (g) (h) (i) or (j) of Article 20 of this Order shall cause it so to stand or wait so that:-

- (a) in the case of a parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are identified on the plans so as to be in accordance with those provisions
- (b) in the case of any other parking place –
 - (i) if the said parking place is not in a one-way road that the left or near side or right or off side of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle or
 - (ii) if the said parking place is in a one-way road that the left or near side of the vehicle is adjacent to the left-hand edge of the carriageway or that the

tight or off side of the vehicle is adjacent to the right-hand edge of the carriageway and

- (iii) that the distance between the edge of the carriageway and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres
- (c) every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a parking space and/or a parking place
- (d) that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting

PROVIDED THAT in relation to paragraphs (b) and (c) of this Article any person causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in a parking place by virtue of the provisions of sub-paragraph (1)(e) (f) (g) (h) (i) or (j) of Article 20 where if the length of the vehicle precludes compliance with these paragraphs that person shall cause the vehicle to wait so that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres

Alteration of position of a vehicle in a parking place

- 16 WHERE any vehicle is standing or waiting in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 15 a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer or a person duly authorised by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions

Power to suspend the use of a parking place

- 17 (1) A duly authorised civil enforcement officer or police constable in uniform or a person under the instructions (whether general or specific) of the Chief Officer of Police or a person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary
- (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety
 - (b) for the purpose of any building demolition or excavation operations the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to the parking place the laying erection alteration or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas water or electricity or of

any electronic communications apparatus or the placing maintenance or removal of any traffic sign

- (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the parking place from or to a depository or another office or dwelling-house
 - (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any road will be thronged or obstructed or
 - (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals or on other special occasions
- (2) Subject to paragraph (1) of this Article a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer or any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend for not longer than twenty-four hours the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety
- (3) On the suspension of the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Article the person authorising or causing such suspension shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof as the case may be a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that the waiting by vehicles is prohibited
- (4) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in a parking place or part thereof during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof a traffic sign or traffic signs placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this paragraph shall apply –

- (a) in respect of any vehicle being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 20(1)(b) (d) or (e) or
- (b) to anything done with the permission of the person suspending the use of the parking place or part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article or a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer acting in the exercise of lawful authority

Restriction on the use of a parking place or a vehicle in a parking place

18 DURING the permitted hours no person shall use any parking place or any vehicle while it is in a parking place in connection with the sale or offering or exposing for sale of any goods to any person in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of their skill in handicraft or their services in any other capacity:

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle-

- (a) if the vehicle is one which may wait in a parking place in accordance with Article 4 or Article 6 and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected or
- (b) if the vehicle is one to which the provisions of Article 20(1)(h) or (i) apply.

19 THE driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place

Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in a parking place

20 (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours anywhere in any part of a parking place if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:

- (a) the vehicle is waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes or such longer period as a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer acting in accordance with lawful authority may approve to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom their personal luggage:

PROVIDED THAT if the said person is a person suffering from any disability or injury which seriously impairs their ability to walk or who is blind the vehicle may wait for as long as may be necessary to enable that person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom their personal luggage

- (b) the driver is being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond their control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident
- (c) the vehicle is being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably

necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting

- (d) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic
- (e) the vehicle is waiting:
 - (i) while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting are being unloaded from the vehicle or having been unloaded therefrom are being delivered or
 - (ii) while postal packets are being collected from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting or having been so collected are being loaded thereon
- (f) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 17 (1)(b).
- (g) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting from or to a depository or another office or dwelling-house
- (h) in any other case the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting and the vehicle does not wait for such purpose for more than twenty minutes or for such longer period as a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may approve
- (i) goods are being sold or offered or exposed for sale from the vehicle by a person who is licensed by the Council or the Borough Council to sell goods from a stationary vehicle on a pitch situated in the parking place or
- (j) vehicle is displaying in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid waiver certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Council to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate OR as have been recorded by the hand held device as having a valid virtual waiver certificate in which case no waiver certificate needs to be displayed on the vehicle

PROVIDED THAT a waiver certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to

be valid and that a notification of such cancellation shall be sent by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council

- (2) Except as provided by this Order the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a parking place during the permitted hours

Movement of a vehicle in a parking place in an emergency

- 21 ANY person duly authorised by the Council a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may move or cause to be moved in case of emergency to any place he thinks fit any vehicle left unattended in a parking place Removal of a vehicle from a parking place

Removal of a vehicle from a parking place

- 22 (1) When a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in this Order a person authorised in that behalf by the Council or a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be moved from that parking place.

BUT PROVIDED THAT civil enforcement officers shall not exercise the powers in this Article other than in accordance with the 1986 Regulations

- (2) Where it appears to the Council or a police constable in uniform that a vehicle left in a parking place has been abandoned a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform may in such manner as they consider necessary for the purpose remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be moved from that parking place

PROVIDED THAT where the Council or a police constable in uniform propose to move such a vehicle which in the opinion of the Council or the Chief Constable is in such a condition that it ought to be destroyed then they shall not less than twenty-four hours before removing it cause to be affixed to the vehicle a notice stating that they propose to remove it for destruction at the end of that period

- 23 WHEN a person authorised by the Council or a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by authority of Article 14 he shall except in the case of a vehicle which in the opinion of the Council or the Chief Constable is in such condition that it ought to be destroyed make such arrangements as may be deemed reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle

Charges for the removal and storage of a vehicle from a parking place

24 WHERE a vehicle is removed by the Council or a police constable in uniform from a parking place in pursuance of Article 20 there shall be payable to the Council or the Chief Constable pursuant to Section 102 of the Act and the Removal, Storage and Disposal of Vehicles (Prescribed Sums and Charges etc.) Regulations 2008 charges for the removal storing and disposal of the said vehicle in accordance with the provisions of the said Regulations

Placing of traffic signs etc

25 THE Council Shall -

- (a) place and maintain a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating the limits of a parking space and/or each parking place and
- (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place referred to in Article 3 or Article 5 or Article 7 of this Order a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that such parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Article 4 or Article 6 or Article 8 and
- (c) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a parking place
- (d) install and maintain in proper working order at least one ticket machine in or in the vicinity of each such parking place referred to in Article 7

PART VI

SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS

Saving with respect of pedestrian crossings

26 NOTHING in the foregoing provisions of this Order shall be taken as authorising anything which would be a contravention of any Regulations made or having effect as if made under Section 25 of the Act

Saving with respect of bus stop clearways

27 INSOFAR as any provision contained in PART II conflicts with a provision which is contained in paragraph 1 of Part 6 and item 9 of Part 4 to Schedule 7 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 (SI. 2016 No. 362) then the provision contained in the said paragraphs of the said Regulations shall prevail

Saving with respect to waiting restrictions

28 INsofar as any provision contained in PART II conflicts with a provision which is contained in The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Spelthorne) (Revocation and Consolidation of Waiting, Loading and Unloading Prohibition and Restriction) Order 2024 and its amendments thereto or in any other enactment existing at the time when this Order comes into operation and which imposes or has the effect of imposing any restriction or prohibition on –

- (a) the waiting loading and/or unloading by vehicles and/or
 - (b) the delivering or collecting of goods by vehicles, or
 - (c) grants an exemption from any such restriction or prohibition
- then the provisions contained in PART IV shall prevail

Saving with respect to other enactments

29 SUBJECT to the provisions contained in Articles 20 21 or 22 the prohibitions restrictions and requirements imposed by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any prohibition restriction or requirement imposed by any other enactment and any exception or exemption from the provisions of this Order is without prejudice to the provisions of any other enactment

PART VII REVOCATION

Revocation

30 WITHOUT prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order the Orders specified in the Second Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked in their entirety
