THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS LAY-BYS IN TANDRIDGE) (REVOCATION AND CONSOLIDATION OF FREE ON-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2024

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ARRANGEMENT OF THE SCHEDULES

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SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL in exercise of their powers under Sections 32 35 36 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter called "The Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to The Act hereby make the following Order:-

PART I

GENERAL

Citation and commencement

This Order may be cited as "The Surrey County Council (Various Lay-Bys in Tandridge) (Revocation and Consolidation of Free On-Street Parking Places) Order 2024" and shall come into operation on 22 August 2024

Interpretation

- 2 (1) In this Order except where the context otherwise requires the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-
 - "agents" means any person or persons authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise and/or enforce any parking place or loading bay.
 - "carriageway" has the same meaning as in Section 329 of the Highways Act 1980
 - "civil enforcement officer" has the same meaning as in Section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004
 - "Council" means Surrey county Council or its appointed agents
 - "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 (S.I. 2000 No. 682)
 - "disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000 (S.I. 2000 No. 683)
 - "District Council" means the Tandridge District Council
 - "driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place.
 - "electronic communications apparatus" has the same meaning as in Section 151 of the Communications Act 2003
 - "enactment" means any enactment whether public general or local and includes any order byelaw rule regulation scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment.

"goods" means goods of any kind whether animate or inanimate and "delivering" and "collecting" in relation to any goods or postal packets includes checking the goods or postal packets for the purpose of their delivery or collection "goods vehicle" means a motor vehicle the maximum gross weight of which does not exceed 5 tonnes and which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description and is not drawing a trailer "hand held device" is a device used by a civil enforcement officer which is updated from time to time with information on valid and invalid (expired) virtual parking transactions

"lay-by" means any area of carriageway not forming part of a main carriageway and which for the purposes of this Order is either

- (a) authorised to be used for the time being as a street parking place by this Order or any other Order made or having effect as if made under Sections 1(1) and (2) and 2(1) to (3) and 4 and/or 32 and 35 and 36 of and/or Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act within the District of Tandridge in the County of Surrey and/or
- (b) an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles and which is bounded partly by a traffic sign of the type shown in Diagram 1010 in Part IV to Schedule 11 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 (S.I. 2016 No. 363) and partly by the outer edge of the carriageway on the same side of the road as that on which the traffic sign is placed

"main carriageway" means any carriageway used primarily by through traffic but excludes any lay-by

"maximum gross weight" has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2021 (SI. 2021 No. 362)

"motor cycle" "motor vehicle" and "invalid carriage" have the same meanings as in Section 136 of the Act

"one-way road" means a highway in which the driving of vehicles otherwise than in one direction is prohibited

"Owner" has the same meaning as defined in sub-section (1) of Section 92 of the Traffic Management Act 2004

"parking disc" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000 (SI. 2000 No 683)

"parking place" means an area on a highway designated as a free on street parking place by this Order

"Parking Space" means a space in a parking place which is provided for the leaving of vehicles

"Parking Space" means a space in a parking place which is provided for the leaving of vehicles

"permitted hours" means the hours identified on the plans

"plans" means the drawings listed in the First Schedule to this Order created and retained by the Council for the purpose of this Order the drawing number of each of those drawings being given in the first column of that Schedule "postal packets" has the same meaning as in Sub-section (1) of Section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000

"road" includes part of a road and has the same meaning as in Section 142 of the Act

"street parking place" has the same meaning as in Section 142 of the Act and authorised to be used as a street parking place by this Order

"the 1986 Regulations" means The Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986 (SI. 1986/183)

"trailer" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Act and includes a trailer any part of which is superimposed on the drawing vehicle

"virtual parking transaction" is amongst other things a virtual waiver certificate "virtual waiver certificate" means a waver certificate that is electronically issued and verified by the Council

"waiver certificate" means a paper or virtual certificate issued on behalf of the Council for the purposes of Article 20(h) permitting a specified vehicle to wait in special circumstances on a length or lengths of roads where the waiting of that vehicle would otherwise be restricted or prohibited

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying -
 - (a) a disabled person's badge in the prescribed manner when -
 - (i) the badge is exhibited thereon on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle or
 - (ii) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or facia the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle.
 - (b) a parking disc in the relevant position if -

- (i) the disc is exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle or
- (ii) where the vehicle does not have a dashboard or facia the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that when marked to show the quarter-hour period during which a period of waiting began that period is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle
- (3) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended applied consolidated re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment
- (4) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Part or Article or Schedule shall unless the context otherwise requires be construed as a reference to the Part or Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order
- (5) For the purposes of sub-paragraph (a) of the proviso to paragraph (4) of Article 19 and of Article 20 a vehicle and any trailer drawn thereby shall be deemed to be a single vehicle
- (6) Any reference in this Order to a length of a road shall unless otherwise specified be construed as a reference to the whole width of that length of road

PART II

AUTHORISATION OF FREE ON-STREET PARKING PLACES

Authorisation of parking places

3 EACH part of a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a road or the area of carriageway adjacent to a road or a lay-by and which is identified on the plans and described in the First Schedule is authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Part of this Order as a parking place

Vehicles for which parking places are authorised to be used

4 EACH parking place referred to in Article 3 may be used subject to the provisions of this Order for the leaving during the permitted hours of all classes of vehicle

Period for which a vehicle may be left in a parking place

WITHOUT prejudice to the provisions of Article 20 no person shall cause any vehicle to be left during the permitted hours in a parking place referred to in Article 3 for longer than the maximum period permitted for waiting specified in relation to that parking place and as identified on the plans:

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall apply to a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority

Interval before a vehicle may again be left in a parking place

WITHOUT prejudice to the provisions of Article 20 no vehicle which has been taken away from a parking place identified on the plans and described in the First Schedule during the permitted hours shall until the expiration of the period of time indicated on the plans from the time it was taken away again be left in that parking place during the permitted hours:

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall apply to a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority

Condition of use of a parking place

- THE driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the motor vehicle is in position in that parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the motor vehicle in or to depart from that parking place
- 8 EVERY vehicle left in a parking place shall be left in such a position as will not obstruct any other vehicle from entering or leaving that parking place
- 9 NO person shall use any parking place in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skills or services -
 - PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall apply to a vehicle waiting anywhere in any part of a parking place if the use of that part has not been suspended if goods are being sold or offered or exposed for sale from that vehicle by a person who is licensed by the Council or the District Council to sell goods from a stationary vehicle on a pitch situated in that parking place whether or not that pitch is situated within a parking space or part thereof or not as the case may be
- 10 NO person shall use any part of a parking place or cause or permit any vehicle to be left in a parking place -
 - (a) for sleeping or camping purposes
 - (b) for cooking purposes
 - (c) for lighting or causing to be lit any fire

- (d) for the purposes of servicing or washing any vehicle or part thereof other than is reasonably necessary to enable that vehicle to depart from a parking place
- 11 NO person shall drive any vehicle in a parking place other than for the purpose of leaving that vehicle in that parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from that parking place
- 12 IN a parking place no person shall erect or cause or permit to be erected any tent booth stand building or other structure
- 13 WHERE in a parking-place signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of indicating -
 - (a) the entrance to or exit from that parking place no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle so that it enters that parking place otherwise than by an entrance or leaves that parking place otherwise than by an exit so indicated
 - (b) parking spaces for the leaving of vehicles within that parking place no person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in that parking place unless the vehicle is left wholly within the limits of a parking space PROVIDED THAT nothing in this paragraph of this Article shall apply to a vehicle to which the provisions of the proviso to Article 9 apply
- 14 ARTICLES 7 8 9 10 11 12 and 13 shall not apply to any person or vehicle with the written permission of the Council
- 15 THE driver of a vehicle shall not permit that vehicle to wait in a parking place -
 - (a) unless the vehicle is licensed in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of the Vehicles Excise and Registration Act 1994 and
 - (b) unless there is in relation to the use of the vehicle by the driver such a policy of insurance as complies with the requirements of Part VI of the Road Traffic Act 1988
- 16 THE driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall not sound any horn or other similar instrument except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from that parking place
- 17 NO person shall in a parking place wantonly shout or otherwise make any loud noise to the disturbance or annoyance of users of that parking place
- NO person shall in a parking place use any threatening abusive or insulting language gesture or conduct with intent to put any person in fear or so as to occasion a breach of the peace or whereby a breach of the peace is likely to be occasioned

Power to suspend the use of a parking place

- 19 (1) A duly authorised civil enforcement officer or police constable in uniform or a person under the instructions (whether general or specific) of the Chief Officer of Police or a person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary
 - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety
 - (b) for the purpose of any building demolition or excavation operations the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to the parking place the laying erection alteration or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas water or electricity or of any electronic communications apparatus or the placing maintenance or removal of any traffic sign
 - (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the parking place from or to a depository or another office or dwelling-house
 - (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any road will be thronged or obstructed or
 - (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals or on other special occasions
 - (2) Subject to paragraph (1) of this Article a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer or any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend for not longer than twenty-four hours the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety
 - (3) On the suspension of the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Article the person authorising or causing such suspension shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof as the case may be a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that the waiting by vehicles is prohibited

(4) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in a parking place or part thereof during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof a traffic sign or traffic signs placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this paragraph shall apply -

- (a) in respect of any vehicle being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 20(1)(b) (d) or (e) or
- (b) to anything done with the permission of the person suspending the use of the parking place or part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article or a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer acting in the exercise of lawful authority

Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in a parking place

- 20 (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Part of this Order any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours anywhere in any part of a parking place referred to in this Part if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:
 - (a) the vehicle is waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes or such longer period as a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer acting in accordance with lawful authority may approve to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom their personal luggage:
 - PROVIDED THAT if the said person is a person suffering from any disability or injury which seriously impairs their ability to walk or who is blind the vehicle may wait for as long as may be necessary to enable that person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom their personal luggage
 - (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident
 - (c) the vehicle is being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or not being a passenger vehicle a motor cycle or an invalid carriage is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary

- in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting
- (d) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic
- (e) the vehicle is waiting:
 - (i) while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting are being unloaded from the vehicle or having been unloaded therefrom are being delivered or
 - (ii) while postal packets are being collected for loading on the vehicle from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting or having been so collected are being loaded thereon
- (f) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 19 (1)(b)
- (g) in any other case the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting and the vehicle does not wait for such purpose for more than twenty minutes or for such longer period as a police constable in uniform or a parking attendant may approve or
- (h) vehicle is displaying in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid waiver certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Council to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate OR as have been recorded by the hand held device as having a valid virtual waiver certificate in which case no waiver certificate needs to be displayed on the vehicle

PROVIDED THAT a waiver certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid and that a notification of such cancellation shall be sent by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council

(2) EXCEPT as provided by this Order the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a parking place referred to in Part III during the permitted hours

Movement of a vehicle in a parking place in an emergency

21 ANY person duly authorised by the Council a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may move or cause to be moved in case of emergency to any place he thinks fit any vehicle left unattended in a parking place Removal of a vehicle from a parking place

Removal of a vehicle from a parking place

- When a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in Articles 4 5 6 8 9 20 and 15(a) a person authorised in that behalf by the Council or a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be moved from that parking place. BUT PROVIDED THAT civil enforcement officers shall not exercise the powers in this Article other than in accordance with the 1986 Regulations BUT PROVIDED ALSO THAT where a vehicle is waiting in a parking place in contravention of the provision of Article 13(b) a person authorised in that behalf by the Council or its Agents or a police constable in uniform may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with that provision
 - (2) Where it appears to the Council or a police constable in uniform that a vehicle left in a parking place has been abandoned a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform may in such manner as they consider necessary for the purpose remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be moved from that parking place PROVIDED THAT where the Council or a police constable in uniform propose to move such a vehicle which in the opinion of the Council or the Chief Constable is in such a condition that it ought to be destroyed then they shall not less than twenty-four hours before removing it cause to be affixed to the vehicle a notice stating that they propose to remove it for destruction at the end of that period
- 23 ANY person removing a vehicle by authority of Article 22 may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in other such manner as he may think necessary to enable him to remove it as aforesaid

24 WHEN a person authorised by the Council or a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by authority of Article 22 he shall except in the case of a vehicle which in the opinion of the Council or the Chief Constable is in such condition that it ought to be destroyed make such arrangements as may be deemed reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

Charges for the removal and storage of a vehicle from a parking place

25 WHERE a vehicle is removed by the Council or a police constable in uniform from a parking place in pursuance of Article 22 there shall be payable to the Council or the Chief Constable pursuant to Section 102 of the Act and the Removal, Storage and Disposal of Vehicles (Prescribed Sums and Charges etc.) Regulations 2008 charges for the removal storing and disposal of the said vehicle in accordance with the provisions of the said Regulations

Placing of traffic signs etc

- 26 THE Council Shall -
 - (a) place and maintain a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating the limits of a parking space and/or each parking place and
 - (b) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a parking place

Responsibility of driver for Offences

27 WHEN a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of or in non-compliance with any of the provisions contained in Articles 4 5 6 7 8 11 13 15 16 and 19(4) the driver shall be deemed the person responsible for the contravention of or non-compliance with the said Articles

PART III

SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS

Saving with respect of bus stop clearways

28 INSOFAR as any provision contained in PART II conflicts with a provision which is contained in paragraph 1 of Part 6 and item 9 of Part 4 to Schedule 7 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2021 (SI. 2021 No. 362) then the provision contained in the said paragraphs of the said Regulations shall prevail

Saving with respect to waiting restrictions

- 29 INSOFAR as any provision contained in PART II conflicts with a provision which is contained in The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Tandridge) (Revocation and Consolidation of Waiting, Loading and Unloading Prohibition and Restriction) Order 2024 and its amendments thereto or in any other enactment existing at the time when this Order comes into operation and which imposes or has the effect of imposing any restriction or prohibition on
 - (a) the waiting loading and/or unloading by vehicles and/or
 - (b) the delivering or collecting of goods by vehicles, or
 - (c) grants an exemption from any such restriction or prohibition then the provisions contained in PART II shall prevail

Saving with respect to other enactments

30 SUBJECT to the provisions contained in Articles 28 and 29 the prohibitions restrictions and requirements imposed by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any prohibition restriction or requirement imposed by any other enactment and any exception or exemption from the provisions of this Order is without prejudice to the provisions of any other enactment

PART IV REVOCATION

Revocation

31 WITHOUT prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order the Orders specified in the Second Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked in their entirety
