**VARIOUS ROADS IN DORKING TOWN CENTRE IN THE**  
**DISTRICT OF MOLE VALLEY (PERMIT ZONE)**  
**(ON-STREET PARKING PLACE) ORDER 2017**  
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- FIRST PART - Specified premises for the purpose of the issue of residents' parking permits (see Article 2)
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SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL in exercise of their powers under Sections 32 35 36 45 46 49 51 and 53 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter called "the 1984 Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act hereby make the following Order:-

## **PART I**

### **GENERAL**

#### **Citation and commencement**

1 THIS Order may be cited as "The Surrey County Council Various Roads in Dorking Town Centre in the District of Mole Valley (Permit Zone) (On-Street Parking Place) Order 2017" and shall come into operation on 15 May 2017

#### **Interpretation**

2 (1) In this Order except where the context otherwise requires the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

"agents" means any person or persons authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise and/or enforce any parking place

"business" means an organisation occupying business premises which are also liable for an individual business rate

"business parking permit" means a business parking permit issued by the Council or the District Council pursuant to Article 34

"business parking permit holder" means a person to whom a business parking permit has been issued

"business premises" has the same meaning as in Regulation 1 of Part II of Schedule 3 of the Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) Regulations 1982 (S. I. 1982/666)

"business user" means a person who occupies business premises for business purposes the postal address of which is within the roads or lengths of roads specified in the first Schedule

"Carer" means a person who looks after another person who is either elderly disabled or in ill health and is unable to manage and/or cope by themselves without assistance

"Carer's Parking Permit" means a Carer's Parking Permit issued by the Borough Council under the provisions of Article 28

"Carers Parking Permit Holder" means a person to whom a carers parking permit has been issued"

"carriageway" has the same meaning as in Section 329 of the Highways Act 1980

"civil enforcement officer" has the same meaning as in Section 76 of the traffic Management Act 2004

"Council" means Surrey County Council or its appointed agents

"community care personnel" means persons who are employed by or who are members of an official carers organisation operating through Surrey County Council or the National Health Service

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 (S.I. 2000 No. 682)

"disabled person's vehicle" means a motor vehicle being driven by a disabled person or being used for the carriage of a disabled person or disabled persons

"District Council" means Mole Valley District Council or any person acting on behalf thereof

"doctor" means a registered medical practitioner who is a fully registered person within the meaning of the Medical Act 1983 who holds a licence to practice under that Act

"driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place

"electronic communications apparatus" has the same meaning as in paragraph 1 of Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984 and Sections 106 and 151 of the Communications Act 2003

"enactment" means any enactment whether public general or local and includes any order bye-law rule regulation scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment

"goods" means goods of any kind whether animate or inanimate and

"delivering" and "collecting" in relation to any goods or postal packets includes checking the goods or postal packets for the purpose of their delivery or collection

"goods vehicle" means a motor vehicle the maximum gross weight of which does not exceed 5 tonnes and which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description and is not drawing a trailer

"maximum gross weight" has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 (S.I. 2016 No. 362)

"medical personnel" means doctors nurses healthcare and community visitors and other categories of medical personnel operating through Surrey County Council or the National Health Service or private healthcare organisations who make house visits

"motor cycle" "motor vehicle" and "invalid carriage" have the same meanings as in Section 136 of the Act

"nurse" means in relation to a nurse or a midwife a nurse or midwife who is registered in the register maintained under Article 5 of the Nursing and Midwifery Order 2001 (S.I. 2002 No. 1771)

"one-way road" means a highway in which the driving of vehicles otherwise than in one direction is prohibited

"operational parking permit" means an operational parking permit issued by the Council of the District Council under the provisions of Article 27

"operational parking permit holder" means a person to whom an operational parking permit has been issued under the provisions of Article 27

"owner" has the same meaning as defined in sub-section (1) of Section 92 of the Traffic Management Act 2004

"parking permit" means a resident's parking permit inter alia bearing only the appropriate identifying letter in accordance with the provisions of Article 20 and issued by the Council pursuant to the provisions of Article 16

"parking permit holder" means a person to whom a parking permit has been issued

"parking place" means the area on a highway designated as a street parking place by this Order

"parking space" means a space in the parking place which is provided for the leaving of vehicles

"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle or invalid carriage) constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of not more than eight passengers (exclusive of the driver) and their effects and not drawing a trailer

"permitted hours" means the hours identified as such in the key relating to the Plans

"Plans" means the drawings listed in the Third Schedule created and retained by the Council for the purpose of this Order the drawing number of each of those drawings being given in the first column of that Schedule

"postal packets" has the same meaning as in Sub-section (1) of Section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000

"registration mark" has the same meaning as in Section 31 of the Vehicles (Crime) Act 2001

"resident" means a person whose usual place of abode is at premises the postal address of which is in any road or part of a road specified and described in the First Part of the Second Schedule

"resident's parking" permit means a resident's parking permit issued by the Council pursuant to Article 16

"resident's parking permit holder" means a person to whom a resident's parking permit has been issued under the provisions of this Order

"residents' parking place" means the area of highway authorised to be used as a parking place for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles as display in the manner specified in Article 21 or in the manner specified in Article 25 or in the manner specified in

paragraph (7) of Article 27 or in the manner specified in Article 33 or in the manner specified in Article 36 a valid permit issued in respect of that vehicle

"resident's visitor's parking permit" means a resident's visitor's parking permit issued by the Council pursuant to the provisions of Article 23

"road" includes part of a road and has the same meaning as in Section 142 of the Act

"street parking place" has the same meaning as in Section 142 of the Act

"the 1986 Regulations" means the Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986 (S.I. 1986/183)

"traffic sign" means a sign of any size colour and type prescribed or authorised under or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under Section 64 of The Act

"trailer" has the same meaning as in Section 136 of the Act and includes a trailer any part of which is superimposed on the drawing vehicle

"usual place of abode" means premises where a person ordinarily resides and shall not include premises where a person is occupying with other persons in circumstances where those premises have separate residential accommodation for each person but with shared bathroom and/or kitchen facilities

"valid permit" means a resident's parking permit or a resident's visitor's parking permit or an operational parking permit or a carer's parking permit or a business parking permit issued and used in accordance with the provisions of this Order

"visitor" means a person who is visiting a resident and who is not ordinarily resident or resident at that resident's usual place of abode being premises the postal address of which is in the road specified and described in Part I of the Second Schedule

"Waiver Certificate" means a certificate issued on behalf of the Council for the purposes of paragraph (i) of Article 10 permitting a specified vehicle to wait in special circumstances on a length or lengths of roads where the waiting of that vehicle would otherwise be restricted or prohibited

(2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying -

(a) a disabled person's badge in the prescribed manner when -

(i) the badge is exhibited thereon on the dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or

(ii) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or fascia the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle

so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle

(b) a parking disc in the relevant position if -

(i) the disc is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or

(ii) where the vehicle does not have a dashboard or facia the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that when marked to show the quarter-hour period during which a period of waiting began that period is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle

(3) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article Part Schedule or Section shall unless the context otherwise requires be construed as a reference to the Article Part Schedule or Section bearing that number in this Order

(4) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended applied consolidated re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment

(5) For the purposes of sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (4) of Article 7 and of Article 10 a vehicle and any trailer drawn thereby shall be deemed to be a single vehicle

## **PART II**

### **DESIGNATION OF A RESIDENTS' PARKING PLACE**

#### **Designation of such a parking place**

3 EACH area on a highway comprising the lengths of carriageway of the roads specified in The First Schedule and identified on the Plans as a residents' parking place is hereby designated as a residents' parking place

#### **Vehicles for which such a parking place is designated**

4 THE residents parking place may be used subject to the provisions of this Order for the leaving during the permitted hours of such passenger vehicles or goods vehicles or motorcycles only as display in the manner specified in Article 21 or in the manner specified in Article 25 or in the manner specified in paragraph (7) of Article 27 or in the manner specified in Article 32 or in the manner specified in Article 36 a valid parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall apply to a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority which may be left anywhere in the residents parking place described in Article 3 and identified on the plans free of any charge imposed by this Order and without any limit on the period of time that that disabled person's vehicle may be left in the aforesaid residents parking place

#### **Manner of standing in such a parking place**

5 THE driver of a vehicle waiting in the residents parking place during the permitted



hours in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order shall cause it so to stand so that -

- (a) the vehicle does not obstruct in any way whatsoever the passing and re-passing of all traffic (including pedestrians) on the highway which comprises the said residents parking place or any part thereof and
- (b) the vehicle is adjacent to the edge of the carriageway on the side of the highway on which the vehicle is waiting and
- (c) the vehicle is left wholly within the limits of the said residents parking place

#### **Alteration of position of a vehicle in such a parking place**

6 WHERE any vehicle is standing in the residents parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 5 a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions

#### **Power to suspend the use of such a parking place**

7 (1) A duly authorised civil enforcement officer or police constable in uniform or a person under the instructions (whether general or specific) of the Chief Officer of Police or a person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a residents' parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:

- (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety
  - (b) for the purpose of any building operation demolition or excavation adjacent to the residents parking place the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to that parking place the laying erection alteration or repair in or adjacent to that parking place of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas water or electricity or of any telecommunication system or the placing maintenance or removal of any traffic sign
  - (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the residents parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to that parking place from or to a depository another office or dwelling-house
  - (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any road will be thronged or obstructed or
  - (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the residents parking place at times of weddings or funerals or on other special occasions
- (2) Subject as set out in sub-article (1) of this Article a police constable in uniform or a

civil enforcement officer may suspend for not longer than twenty-four hours the use of the residents parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety

(3) On the suspension of the use of the residents parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Article the person authorising or causing such suspension shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof as the case may be a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that the waiting by vehicles is prohibited

(4) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the residents parking place or any part thereof during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof a traffic sign or traffic signs placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article:

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this paragraph shall apply -

- (i) in respect of any vehicle being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 10(1)(b) (d) or (e) or
- (ii) to anything done with the permission of the person suspending the use of that parking place or that part thereof in pursuance of sub-article (1) of this Article or a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer acting in the exercise of lawful authority

#### **Restriction on the use of such a parking place or a vehicle in such a parking place**

8 DURING the permitted hours no person shall use the residents parking place or any vehicle while it is in that parking place in connection with the sale or offering or exposing for sale of any goods to any person in or near the said parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of his skill in handicraft or his services in any other capacity:

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle -

- (a) if the vehicle is one which may wait in the residents parking place in accordance with Article 4 and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected or
- (b) if the vehicle is one to which the provisions of Article 10(1)(h) apply

9 THE driver of a motor vehicle using the residents parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the said parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from that parking place

### **Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in such a parking place**

10 (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours anywhere in any part of the residents parking place if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:-

- (a) the vehicle is waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes or such longer period as a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer acting in accordance with lawful authority may approve to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage:

PROVIDED THAT if the said person is a person suffering from any disability or injury which seriously impairs his ability to walk or who is blind the vehicle may wait for as long as may be necessary to enable that person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage

- (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident
- (c) the vehicle is being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or not being a passenger vehicle a motor cycle or an invalid carriage is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting
- (d) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic
- (e) the vehicle is waiting -
  - (i) while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the residents parking place in which the vehicle is waiting are being unloaded from the vehicle or having been unloaded therefrom are being delivered or
  - (ii) while postal packets are being collected for loading on the vehicle from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the residents parking place in which the vehicle is waiting or having been so collected are being loaded thereon
- (f) the vehicle not being a passenger vehicle a motor cycle or an invalid carriage is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 7(1)(b)

- (g) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the residents parking place in which the vehicle is waiting from or to a depository another office or dwelling-house
- (h) in any other case the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the residents parking place in which the vehicle is waiting and the vehicle does not wait for such purpose for more than twenty minutes or for such longer period as a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may approve or
- (i) the vehicle is displaying in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid waiver certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Council to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate

PROVIDED THAT a waiver certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid and that a notification of such cancellation shall be sent by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council

- (2) No charge specified in Section II and/or Section III and/or Section IV and/or Section V and/or Section VI of Part III shall be payable in respect of any vehicle waiting in the residents parking place in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (a) to (h) inclusive of this Article and a valid parking permit need not be displayed on such a vehicle so waiting in the residents parking place

#### **Placing of traffic signs etc**

- 11 THE Council and/or its agents (if any) shall -
- (a) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of the residents parking place a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that such parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Article 4 and
- (b) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of the residents parking place

### **PART III SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS**

**SECTION I - MOVEMENT OF AND/OR  
REMOVAL OF VEHICLES FROM  
THE RESIDENTS' PARKING PLACE**

**Movement of a vehicle in such a parking place in an emergency**

12 A civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform or any person duly authorised by the Council may move or cause to be moved in case of emergency to any place he thinks fit any vehicle left unattended in the residents parking place

**Removal of a vehicle from such a parking place**

13 (1) When a vehicle is left in the residents parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in this Order a person authorised in that behalf by the Council or a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be moved from that parking place

BUT PROVIDED THAT civil enforcement officers shall not exercise the powers in this Article other than in accordance with the 1986 Regulations

(2) Where it appears to the District Council or a police constable in uniform that a vehicle left in the residents parking place has been abandoned a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform may in such manner as they consider necessary for the purpose remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be moved from that parking place:

PROVIDED THAT where the District Council or a police constable in uniform propose to move such a vehicle which in the opinion of the District Council or a police constable in uniform is in such a condition that it ought to be destroyed then they shall not less than twenty-four hours before removing it cause to be affixed to the vehicle a notice stating that they propose to remove it for destruction at the end of that period

14 WHEN a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform or a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from the residents parking place by authority of Article 13 he shall except in the case of a vehicle which in the opinion of the District Council or the police constable is in such condition that it ought to be destroyed make such arrangements as may be deemed reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle

**Charges for the removal and storage of a vehicle from such a parking place**

15 WHERE a vehicle is removed by the Council or a police constable in uniform from

the residents parking place in pursuance of Article 13 there shall be payable to the Council the District Council or the Surrey Police pursuant to Section 102 of the 1984 Act and the Removal, Storage and Disposal of Vehicles (Prescribed Sums and Charges etc.) Regulations 1989 charges for the removal storing and disposal of the said vehicle in accordance with the provisions of the said Regulations

## **SECTION II - RESIDENTS' PARKING PERMITS**

### **Application for and issue of a residents parking permit**

- 16 (1) (a) Any resident who is the owner of a vehicle or vehicles of the following class that is to say a passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle or a motorcycle may apply to the Council or District Council in accordance with the following provisions for the issue to him of a resident's parking permit in respect of that vehicle or those vehicles
- (b) The number of residents' parking permits that may be issued by the Council or District Council in respect of each separate place of abode shall be calculated as the sum of the number of vehicles registered to residents therein minus the total number of off-street parking spaces available to that place of abode

PROVIDED that where the Council or District Council is of the opinion that the off-street parking space is large enough for the leaving of a motor car or goods vehicle or any number of those vehicles or a combination thereof but cannot be used for that purpose due to alternative use being made of that space by any member of the household then the District Council may count the number of such off-street parking spaces in the calculation for the total number of residents' parking permits to be issued to any resident of that particular place of abode

- (2) At premises where there is more than one resident applications from the residents will be treated on the basis that paragraph (1) of Article 16 shall apply to the first resident who applies
- (3) The Council may at any time require an applicant for a parking permit or any parking permit holder to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a parking permit made to them as they may reasonably call for to verify any particulars or information given to them or in respect of any parking permit issued by them to that person as they may reasonably call for to verify that the parking permit is valid
- (4) Upon receipt of an application duly made -
- (a) under the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article in respect of the

first nominated vehicle the Council upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident and is the owner of a vehicle of the classes specified in paragraph (1) of this Article may in its absolute discretion issue to the applicant therefor one parking permit the parking permit being for the leaving without time limit during the permitted hours in such residents' parking place located in any length of road indicated in the First Schedule as relates to the usual place of abode of the applicant as indicated in Part I of the Second Schedule of the vehicle to which such parking permit relates by the owner of such vehicle or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the owner other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward

- (b) under the provisions paragraph (1) of this Article in respect of the second or other subsequent nominated vehicle (where applicable) the Council upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident and is the owner of a vehicle of the classes specified in paragraph (1) of this Article may in its absolute discretion issue to the applicant therefor one parking permit the parking permit being for the leaving without time limit during the permitted hours in such residents' parking place located in any length of road indicated in the First Schedule as relates to the usual place of abode of the applicant as indicated in Part I of the Second Schedule by the owner of such vehicle or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the owner other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward

- (5) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article the Council shall not in any circumstances issue a parking permit to any resident which would be valid for any period during which any other parking permit issued to that resident by the Council and/or the District Council for the leaving of a vehicle in a street parking place pursuant to the provisions of any other enactment is valid
- (6) If the Council is either unable or decides not to issue a parking permit to an applicant therefor any remittance paid shall be refunded to the said applicant
- (7) The fee referred to in paragraph (1) of this Article payable to the Council shall be the sum of -

- (a) fifty pounds in respect of a parking permit issued under the provisions of paragraph (4) of this Article in respect of the first nominated vehicle which subject to the provisions of this Order shall be valid for a period of twelve months running from the first day of the month in which it first becomes valid
  - (b) seventy-five pounds in respect of a parking permit issued under the provisions of paragraph (4) of this Article in respect of the second or other subsequent nominated vehicle which subject to the provisions of this Order shall be valid for a period of twelve months running from running from the day of the month in which it first becomes valid
- (8) It is hereby stated by the Council that -
- (a) the issuing of a parking permit to a parking permit holder does not guarantee that any parking space within the residents' parking place will be available for use by the parking permit holder aforesaid during the permitted hours and
  - (b) the parking permit remains at all times whilst it is issued to a parking permit holder the property of the Council

**Surrender withdrawal and validity of residents parking permits**

- 17 (1) A residents parking permit holder may surrender a residents parking permit to the Council or the District Council at any time and shall surrender it to the Council or the District Council on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article or in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (5) of this Article
- (2) The Council or the District Council may by notice in writing served on a residents parking permit holder by sending the same by the recorded delivery service to that person at the address shown by that person on the application for the residents parking permit or at any other address believed to be that person's usual place of abode withdraw a residents parking permit if it appears to the Council or the District Council that any one of the events set out in paragraph (3)(a) (b) (d) (e) or (f) of this Article has occurred and that person shall surrender the residents parking permit to the Council or the District Council within 48 (forty-eight) hours of the receipt of the afore-mentioned notice
- (3) The events referred to in the foregoing provisions of this Article are -
- (a) the residents parking permit holder ceasing to be a resident



- (b) the residents parking permit holder ceasing to be the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the residents parking permit was issued
  - (c) the withdrawal of the residents parking permit by the Council or the District Council under the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Article
  - (d) the vehicle in respect of which the residents parking permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of a class specified in paragraph (1) of Article 16
  - (e) the residents parking permit having been obtained by fraud and/or deception or as a result of incorrect material information supplied by the applicant therefor
  - (f) the residents parking permit bearing a letter other than that indicated by the Council or the District Council pursuant to the provision of paragraph (1) of Article 2 relating to a residents parking permit
  - (g) the residents parking permit ceasing to be valid pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (4) of this Article
- (4) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this Article a residents parking permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period stated thereon or on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article whichever is the earlier
- (5) Where a residents parking permit is issued pursuant to paragraph (4) of Article 16 to any person upon receipt of a cheque and the cheque is subsequently dishonoured the residents parking permit shall cease to be of any effect and the Council or the District Council shall by notice in writing served on the person to whom such residents parking permit was issued by sending the same by the recorded delivery service to him at the address shown by that person on the application for the residents parking permit or at any other address believed to be that person's usual place of abode require that person to surrender the residents parking permit to the Council or the District Council within 48 (forty-eight) hours of the receipt of the aforementioned notice

#### **Application for and issue of duplicate residents parking permits**

- 18 (1) If a residents parking permit is mutilated or torn or accidentally defaced or the figures or particulars thereon have become illegible or the colour of the residents parking permit has become altered by fading or otherwise the residents parking permit holder shall either surrender it to the Council or the District Council or apply to the Council or the District Council for the issue to

him of a duplicate residents parking permit and the Council or the District Council upon receipt of the residents parking permit shall issue a duplicate residents parking permit so marked and upon such issue the first mentioned residents parking permit shall become invalid

- (2) If a residents parking permit is lost or destroyed the residents parking permit holder may apply to the Council or the District Council for the issue to him of a duplicate residents parking permit and the Council or the District Council upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction shall issue a duplicate residents parking permit so marked and upon such issue the first mentioned residents parking permit shall become invalid
- (3) The provisions of this Order shall apply to a duplicate residents parking permit and an application therefor as if it were a residents parking permit or as the case may be an application therefor
- (4) The charge for the issue of a duplicate residents parking permit shall be fifteen pounds for each duplicate residents parking permit issued pursuant to paragraph (1) or paragraph (2) of this Article

**Application for the re-issue of a residents parking permit upon a change of vehicle with a different registration mark**

19 WHERE a resident or a resident parking permit holder applies for the issue of a further resident parking permit due to that resident or that resident parking permit holder changing the vehicle in respect of which the original resident parking permit was issued so that the original resident parking permit no longer bears the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which that original residents parking permit was first issued under the provisions of paragraph (4) of Article 16 then the original residents parking permit shall be surrendered to the Council or the District Council and immediately a further residents parking permit will be issued to that resident or resident parking permit holder bearing the registration mark of the new vehicle

PROVIDED THAT there shall then be payable to the Council or the District Council a sum of fifteen pounds for the issue of that further residents parking permit which shall be valid for the remainder of the period stated on the original residents parking permit under the provisions of paragraph (b) of Article 20

**Form of residents parking permits**

20 A residents parking permit shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:-

- (a) the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the residents parking permit has been issued and
- (b) the period during which subject to the provisions of paragraph (4) of Article 17 the residents parking permit shall remain valid and
- (c) an indication that the residents parking permit has been issued by the Council and/or the District Council and
- (d) the letter "J"

#### **Display of residents parking permits**

- 21 AT all times during which a vehicle of a class specified in paragraph (1) of Article 16 is left in the residents parking place during the permitted hours a valid residents parking permit shall be displayed on the vehicle in respect of which it was issued on the front or near side of the vehicle so that all the particulars on the residents parking permit are readily visible from the front or near side of the vehicle
- PROVIDED THAT no such residents parking permit need be so displayed if the vehicle is waiting in such a parking place pursuant to the provisions of Article 10 or Article 25 or paragraph (7) of Article 27 or Article 32 or Article 36 or is a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority

#### **Refund of fee paid in respect of a residents parking permit**

- 22 (1) A residents parking permit holder who surrenders a residents parking permit to the Council or the District Council before the residents parking permit becomes valid shall be entitled to a refund of the fee paid in respect thereof
- (2) A residents parking permit holder who surrenders a residents parking permit to the Council or the District Council after the residents parking permit has become valid shall be entitled to a refund of part of the charge paid in respect thereof calculated in accordance with the provisions of the next following paragraph
- (3) The part of the charge which is refundable under the provisions of the last foregoing paragraph shall be calculated as one-twelfth of the sum paid in respect thereof in respect of each complete month of the period specified thereon as the period during which it shall be valid which remains unexpired at the time when the residents parking permit is surrendered to the Council or the District Council

### **SECTION III - RESIDENTS' VISITOR'S PARKING PERMITS**

### **Application for and issue of a residents' visitor's parking permit**

- 23      (1)      Any resident may apply to the Council or the District Council for the issue of a residents' visitor's parking permit for the leaving without time limit during the permitted hours in the residents parking place of a vehicle of a class referred to in paragraph (1) of Article 16 owned by and/or being used by a visitor and any application for such a residents' visitor's parking permit shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council or the District Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by a remittance for the appropriate fee in respect of a residents' visitor's parking permit hereinafter specified
- (2)      The Council or the District Council may at any time require an applicant for a residents' visitor's parking permit or any residents' visitor's parking permit holder to produce to an officer of the Council or the District Council such evidence in respect of an application for a residents' visitor's parking permit made to them as they may reasonably call for to verify any particulars or information given to them or in respect of any resident's visitor's parking permit issued by them to that person as they may reasonably call for to verify that the residents' visitor's parking permit is valid
- (3)      Upon receipt of an application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this Article and the appropriate fee specified in paragraph (6) of this Article the Council or the District Council upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident may in its absolute discretion issue to the applicant therefor one residents' visitor's parking permit the parking permit aforesaid being for the leaving without time limit during the permitted hours in the residents parking place of a vehicle owned by and/or being used by a person visiting the applicant therefor
- PROVIDED THAT subject to the provisions of paragraph (4) of this Article the Council or the District Council may in its absolute discretion limit the number of residents' visitor's parking permits that are issued at any one time in respect of a particular usual place of abode and may require the production and/or surrender of a used residents' visitor's parking permit or used residents' visitor's parking permits before issuing a further such permit
- (4)      The number of residents' visitor's parking permits issued in respect of each separate usual place of abode shall not exceed one hundred and twenty in each calendar year
- PROVIDED THAT this paragraph shall have effect subject to the proviso

that in certain exceptional circumstances the number of residents' visitor's parking permits issued in respect of each separate place of abode may exceed one hundred and twenty in each calendar with no upper limit on the number of such permits so issued provided that in each case the exceptional circumstances referred to above are met and/or fully complied with

- (5) If the Council or the District Council is either unable or decides not to issue a residents' visitor's parking permit to an applicant therefor any remittance paid shall be refunded to the said applicant
- (6) The fee referred to in paragraph (3) of this Article payable to the Council or the District Council in respect of a residents' visitor's parking permit shall be two pounds for each such parking permit and that the residents' visitor's parking permit shall be valid for a period of one day only
- (7) No refund shall be payable by the Council or the District Council in respect of any unused residents' visitor's parking permits or any such parking permits which are or have been lost or destroyed by the resident to whom those residents' visitor's parking permits have been issued or which residents' visitor's parking permits have been mutilated or torn or accidentally defaced in any way whatsoever whilst those residents' visitor's parking permits have been issued to a resident and are actually held by that resident for the time being
- (8) For the avoidance of doubt it is hereby stated by the Council and/or the District Council that -
  - (a) the issuing of a residents' visitor's parking permit to a resident does not guarantee that any parking space within the residents parking place will be available for use by the visitor to that resident during the permitted hours and
  - (b) the residents' visitor's parking permit remains at all times whilst it is issued to the resident the property of the Council or the District Council

#### **Form of residents' visitor's parking permits**

24 A residents' visitor's parking permit shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars -

- (a) a space for the insertion of the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the residents' visitor's parking permit is to be displayed on and used
- (b) an indication that the residents' visitor's parking permit has been issued by

the Council and/or the District Council

- (c) a figure stating the number of the residents' visitor's parking permit
- (d) the letter "J"
- (e) a set of figures and/or words indicating the days of the month and the calendar year and/or years when the residents' visitor's parking permit may be used

#### **Display of residents' visitor's parking permits**

25 AT all times during which a vehicle of a class referred to in paragraph (1) of Article 16 is left in the residents parking place pursuant to Article 23 during the permitted hours a valid residents' visitors parking permit shall be displayed on the vehicle in respect of which it is to be used on the front or near-side of the vehicle so that all the particulars on the residents' visitor's parking permit are readily visible from the front or near-side of the vehicle

PROVIDED THAT no such residents' visitor's parking permit need be so displayed if the vehicle is waiting in the residents parking place pursuant to the provisions of Article 10 or Article 21 or paragraph (7) of Article 27 or Article 32 or Article 36 or is a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority

#### **Validation of residents' visitor's parking permits**

26 A residents' visitor's parking permit shall be validated by the resident to whom it has been issued or by the visitor by whom it is to be used by indicating by whatever means provided on that residents' visitor's parking permit the date of the day of the month and the year on which that residents' visitor's parking permit is to be used and by marking on the residents' visitor's parking permit the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which that residents' visitor's parking permit is to be used

### **SECTION IV**

#### **PROVISIONS APPLYING TO THE ISSUE AND USE OF OPERATIONAL PARKING PERMITS**

##### **Application for and issue of an Operational Parking Permit**

- 27 (1) ANY person falling within the definition of medical personnel in paragraph (1) of Article 2 may apply to the Council or the District Council for the issue of an Operational Parking Permit for the leaving in the residents parking place during the permitted hours of either a passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle or a motorcycle belonging to or being used by a person attending in the course

of medical or community care duties at any premises the postal address of which is specified in Part I of the Second Schedule and any such application shall be made in accordance with formal guidance issued by and obtainable from the Council or the District Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such guidance to be supplied and the Council or the District Council may in its absolute discretion issue an Operational Parking Permit to such categories of medical personnel

- (2) THE Council or the District Council may at any time require an applicant for an Operational Parking Permit or an Operational Parking Permit holder to produce to an Officer of that Council such evidence in respect of an application for an Operational Parking Permit made to them as they may reasonably call for to verify any particulars or information given to them or in respect of any Operational Parking Permit issued by them to that person as they may reasonably call for to verify that the Operational Parking Permit is valid
- (3) UPON receipt of an application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this Article and upon being satisfied that the applicant is employed as one of the specific categories of medical personnel and is either the owner of either a passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle or a motorcycle or a person authorised by the owner of such a vehicle the Council or the District Council may in its absolute discretion issue to the applicant therefor one Operational Parking Permit and a protective cover for the display therein of that Operational Parking Permit the Operational Parking Permit being for the leaving without time limit and free of charge during the permitted hours in the residents parking place described in Article 3 and identified on the plans of a vehicle belonging to or being used by medical personnel visiting a resident in the course of their duties
- (4) IN any respect not specifically mentioned in paragraphs (1), (2), (3), (5) and (6) of this Article the procedure validity and terms of use of an Operational Parking Permit shall be the same as the procedure validity and terms of use of a residents parking permit and this paragraph shall be construed accordingly
- (5) NO charge shall be payable in respect of an Operational Parking Permit which subject to the provisions of this Order shall be valid for a period of twelve months running from the first day of the month in the year in which it first becomes valid
- (6) AN Operational Parking Permit shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:-

- (a) a serial number identifiable in the office of issue
  - (b) the registration mark or marks of the vehicle or the two vehicles in respect of which the Operational Parking Permit has or have been issued PROVIDED THAT if the permit holder has the use of a pool vehicle from his/her employer then the said permit need not display the registration mark of a vehicle
  - (c) the period during which subject to the provisions of paragraph (5) of this Article the Operational Parking Permit shall remain valid
  - (d) an indication that the Operational Parking Permit has been issued by the Council or the District Council
- (7) AT all times during which either a passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle or a motorcycle which is being used only for the purposes specified in paragraph (1) of this Article is left in the residents parking place during the permitted hours a valid Operational Parking Permit shall be displayed on the vehicle in respect of which it was issued on the front or nearside of that vehicle so that all the particulars on the operational parking permit are readily visible from the front or nearside of the vehicle

PROVIDED THAT no such parking permit need be so displayed if the vehicle is waiting in the residents parking place pursuant to the provisions of Article 10 Article 21 Article 25 Article 32 and Article 36 or is a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority

## **SECTION V**

### **PROVISIONS APPLYING TO THE ISSUE AND USE OF CARER'S PARKING PERMITS**

#### **Application for and issue of Carer's Parking Permits**

- 28 (1) ANY person -
- (a) who is resident or ordinarily resident at any premises the postal address of which is specified in Part I of the Second Schedule and
  - (b) is housebound and
  - (c) in need of regular short term visits from carers or community care personnel

may apply to the Council or the District Council for the issue of a Carer's Parking Permit for the leaving in the residents parking place during the permitted hours of either a passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle or a motorcycle and belonging to or being used by a person visiting that resident at



those premises to carry out carer's duties and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council or the District Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and the Council or the District Council may in its absolute discretion issue a Carer's Parking Permit to such carers or community care personnel

- (2) THE Council or the District Council may at any time require an applicant for a Carer's Parking Permit or a Carer's Parking Permit holder to produce to an Officer of that Council such evidence in respect of an application for a Carer's Parking Permit made to them as they may reasonably call for to verify any particulars or information given to them or in respect of any Carer's Parking Permit issued by them to that person as they may reasonably call for to verify that the Carer's Parking Permit is valid
- (3) UPON receipt of an application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this Article and upon being satisfied that the applicant is housebound and in need of such short term visits by carers or community care personnel and that the carer or the community care personnel is or are either the owner of either a passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle or a motorcycle or a person authorised to use such a vehicle by the owner thereof the Council or the District Council may in its absolute discretion issue to the applicant therefor one Carer's Parking Permit and a protective cover for the display therein of that Carer's Parking Permit the Carer's Parking Permit being for the leaving without time limit during the permitted hours in the residents parking place of a vehicle belonging to or being used by a person visiting that resident as a carer or as community care personnel in the course of their duties
- PROVIDED THAT the Carer's Parking Permit is only valid in respect of any resident's premises that are specified in Part I of the Second Schedule
- (4) IN any respect not specifically mentioned in paragraphs (1), (2) and (3) of this Article and in Articles 29, 30, 31 and 32 the procedure validity and terms of use of a Carer's Parking Permit shall be the same as the procedure validity and terms of use of a residents parking permit and this paragraph shall be construed accordingly

#### **Fee to be paid in respect of a Carer's Parking Permit**

29 THE fee payable to the Council or the District Council in respect of a Carer's Parking Permit shall be ten pounds per permit which subject to the provisions of this Order shall be valid for a period of twelve months running from the first day of the month in the year in which

the said Carer's Parking Permit first becomes valid

#### **Refund of the fee paid in respect of a Carer's Parking Permit**

- 30 (1) A Carer's Parking Permit holder who surrenders their Carer's Parking Permit to the Council or the District Council before the said parking permit becomes valid shall be entitled to a refund of the fee paid in respect thereof
- (2) A Carer's Parking Permit holder who surrenders their Carer's Parking Permit to the Council or the District Council after the said parking permit has become valid shall not be entitled to a refund

#### **Form of Carer's Parking Permits**

- 31 (1) A Carer's Parking Permit shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:-
- (a) a serial number identifiable in the office of issue
  - (b) the word "CARER"
  - (c) the period during which subject to the provisions of Article 29 the Carer's Parking Permit shall remain valid
  - (d) an indication that the Carer's Parking Permit has been issued by the Council or the District Council
  - (e) the letter "J"

#### **Display of a Carer's Parking Permit**

32 AT all times during which a passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle which is being used for the purposes specified in paragraph (1) of Article 28 is left in the residents parking place during the permitted hours a valid Carer's Parking Permit shall be displayed on the vehicle in respect of which it was issued on the front or nearside of the vehicle so that all the particulars on the carer's parking permit are readily visible from the front or nearside of the vehicle PROVIDED THAT no such parking permit need be so displayed if the vehicle is waiting in the residents parking place pursuant to the provisions of Article 10 Article 21 Article 25 paragraph (7) of Article 27 or Article 36 or is a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority

### **SECTION VI**

#### **BUSINESS PARKING PERMITS**

##### **Application for and issue of a business parking permit**

- 33 (1) Any business user who is the owner of a vehicle of the following class that

is to say a passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle or a motorcycle may apply to the Council or the District Council for the issue of a business parking permit in respect of that vehicle and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council or the District Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied

- (2) The Council or the District Council may at any time require an applicant for a business parking permit or a business parking permit holder to produce to an officer of the Council or the District Council (as the case may be) such evidence in respect of an application for a business parking permit made to them as they may reasonably call for to verify any particulars or information given to them or in respect of any business parking permit issued by them to as they may reasonably call for to verify that the business parking permit is valid
- (3) On receipt of an application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this Article the Council or the District Council upon being satisfied that the applicant is a business user and is the owner of a vehicle of the class specified in paragraph (1) of this Article shall issue to the applicant therefor upon receipt of the fee of one hundred and fifty pounds one business parking permit and a protective cover for the display therein of that business parking permit the business parking permit being for the leaving during the permitted hours in the residents parking place, the postal address of the business premises occupied by the aforesaid business user being within the roads or parts of the roads specified in the First Schedule and which postal address is for the avoidance of doubt specified in the Second Part of The Second Schedule to which such business permit relates by the owner of such vehicle or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the owner -

PROVIDED THAT the Council or the District Council shall not issue a business parking permit to any business user which would be valid during any period during which any two other business parking permits issued to that business user are or would be valid

AND PROVIDED ALSO THAT officers of the District Council or the Council have the absolute discretion to permit the issue of extra business parking permits where it is considered that special circumstances exist

- (4) It is hereby stated by the Council and the District Council that -
- (a) the issuing of a business parking permit to a business parking permit

- holder does not guarantee that any parking space within the residents parking place will be available for use by the business permit holder aforesaid during the permitted hours and
- (b) the business parking permit remains at all times whilst it is issued to a business permit holder the property of the Council or the District Council

**Surrender withdrawal and validity of business parking permits**

- 34 (1) A business parking permit holder may surrender a business parking permit to the Council or the District Council at any time and shall surrender it to the Council or the District Council on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article or in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (5) of this Article
- (2) The Council or the District Council may by notice in writing served on a business parking permit holder by sending the same by the recorded delivery service to that person at the address shown by that person on the application for the business parking permit or at any other address believed to be that person's usual place of abode or that person's business premises withdraw a business parking permit if it appears to the Council or the District Council that any one of the events set out in paragraph (3)(a) (b) (d) (e) or (f) of this Article has occurred and that person shall surrender the business parking permit to the Council or the District Council within 48 (forty-eight) hours of the receipt of the afore-mentioned notice
- (3) The events referred to in the foregoing provisions of this Article are -
- (a) the business parking permit holder ceasing to be a business user
  - (b) the business parking permit holder ceasing to be the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the business parking permit was issued
  - (c) the withdrawal of the business parking permit by the Council or the District Council under the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Article
  - (d) the vehicle in respect of which the business parking permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of a class specified in paragraph (1) of Article 33
  - (e) the business parking permit having been obtained by fraud and/or deception or as a result of incorrect material information supplied by the applicant therefor
  - (f) the business parking permit bearing a letter other than that indicated by the Council or the District Council pursuant to the provision of

paragraph (d) of Article 35

- (g) the issue of a duplicate business parking permit
  - (h) the business parking permit ceasing to be valid pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (4) of this Article
- (4) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this Article a business parking permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period stated thereon or on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article whichever is the earlier
- (5) Where a business parking permit is issued pursuant to paragraph (3) of Article 33 to any person upon receipt of a cheque and the cheque is subsequently dishonoured the business parking permit shall cease to be of any effect and the Council or the District Council shall by notice in writing served on the person to whom such business parking permit was issued by sending the same by the recorded delivery service to him at the address shown by that person on the application for the business parking permit or at any other address believed to be that person's usual place of abode or business premises require that person to surrender the business parking permit to the Council within 48 (forty-eight) hours of the receipt of the aforementioned notice

#### **Form of business parking permits**

- 35 A business parking permit shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:-
- (a) the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the business parking permit has been issued and
  - (b) the period during which subject to the provisions of paragraph (4) of Article 34 the business parking permit shall remain valid and
  - (c) an indication that the business parking permit has been issued by the Council or the District Council
  - (d) the letter "J"

#### **Display of business parking permits**

- 36 AT all times during which a vehicle of a class specified in paragraph (1) of Article 33 is left in the residents parking place pursuant to Article 33 during the permitted hours a valid business parking permit shall be displayed on the vehicle in respect of which it was issued on the front or near side of the vehicle so that all the particulars on the business parking permit are readily visible from the front or near side of the

vehicle

PROVIDED THAT no such business parking permit need be so displayed if the vehicle is waiting in such a parking place pursuant to the provisions of Article 10, Article 261, Article 25, paragraph (7) of Article 27 or Article 36 or is a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner as disabled person's badge issued by any local authority

**Application for and issue of duplicate business parking permits**

- 37 (1) If a business parking permit is mutilated or torn or accidentally defaced or the figures or particulars thereon have become illegible or the colour of the business parking permit has become altered by fading or otherwise the business parking permit holder shall either surrender it to the Council or the District Council or apply to the Council or the District Council for the issue to him of a duplicate business parking permit and the Council or the District Council upon receipt of the business parking permit shall issue a duplicate business parking permit so marked and upon such issue the first mentioned business parking permit shall become invalid
- (2) If a business parking permit is lost or destroyed the business parking permit holder may apply to the Council or the District Council for the issue to him of a duplicate business parking permit and the Council or the District Council upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction shall issue a duplicate business parking permit so marked and upon such issue the first mentioned business parking permit shall become invalid
- (3) The provisions of this Order shall apply to a duplicate business parking permit and an application therefor as if it were a business parking permit or as the case may be an application therefor
- (4) The charge for the issue of a duplicate business parking permit shall be fifteen pounds for each duplicate business parking permit issued pursuant to paragraph (1) or paragraph (2) of this Article

**Refund of fee paid in respect of a business parking permit**

- 38 (1) A business parking permit holder who surrenders a business parking permit to the Council or the District Council before the business parking permit becomes valid shall be entitled to a refund of the fee paid in respect thereof
- (2) A business permit holder who surrenders a business parking permit to the Council or the District Council after the business parking permit has become

- valid shall be entitled to a refund of part of the fee paid in respect thereof calculated in accordance with the provisions of the next following paragraph
- (3) The part of the fee which is refundable under the provisions of the last foregoing paragraph shall be calculated as one twelfth of the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds in respect of each complete month of the period specified thereon as the period during which it shall be valid which remains unexpired at the time when the business parking permit is surrendered to the Council or the District Council

## **SECTION VII - GENERAL**

### **Saving with respect to waiting restrictions**

39 WHERE within the residents parking place any prohibition on the waiting by vehicles is imposed by The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Mole Valley) (Revocation and Consolidation of Waiting, Loading and Unloading Prohibition and Restriction) Order 2017 or by any other enactment and traffic signs are placed indicating the effect of that and/or those prohibitions then that provision or those provisions (as the case may be) shall prevail over all the provisions of this Order and no vehicle shall be left or shall wait in any area or areas of the parking place so affected by that prohibition or by those prohibitions on the waiting by vehicles -

PROVIDED THAT any exemption provided in the said Order of 2017 or in any other enactment (as the case may be) from the effect of that prohibition or any of those prohibitions on the waiting by vehicles specified above shall apply as stated in the Order of 2017 or in that other enactment as the case may be

### **Saving with respect to other enactments**

40 SUBJECT to the provisions contained in Article 39 the prohibitions restrictions and requirements imposed by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any prohibition restriction or requirement imposed by any other enactment and any exception or exemption from the provisions of this Order is without prejudice to the provisions of any other enactment

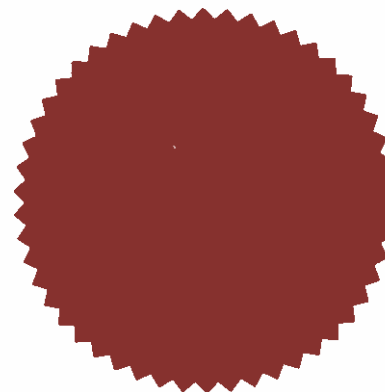
