THE SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1) and 2(1) to 3 and 4 and 32 35 36 45 46 49 51 and 53 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

**Citation and commencement**

1 THIS Order may be cited as "The Surrey County Council Woking Controlled Parking Zone (Consolidation of Waiting Loading and Unloading Restrictions and On-Street Parking Places) Order 2005 (Amendment No.8) Order 2013" and shall come into operation on 29 April 2013

**Interpretation**

2 (1) In this Order the expression "the Order of 2005" means The Surrey County Council Woking Controlled Parking Zone (Consolidation of Waiting Loading and Unloading Restrictions and On-Street Parking Places) Order 2005

(2) In this Order the expression "enactment" means any enactment whether public general or local and includes any order bye-law rule regulation scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment

(3) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended applied consolidated re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment

(4) Unless the context otherwise requires any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2007 shall have the same meaning as in that Order

**Amendment of the Order of 2005**

3 WITHOUT prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in

respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order the Order of 2005 shall have effect as though -

- (a) in the ARRANGEMENT OF ARTICLES there were substituted as PART III SECTION III AND PART IV SECTION II AND SECTION III the following similarly numbered and lettered PARTS and SECTIONS -

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SECTION III

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(b) in paragraph (1) of Article 2 there were added/or substituted the following expressions which shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

"doctor" means a registered medical practitioner who is a fully registered person within the meaning of the Medical Act 1983 who holds a licence to practice under that Act

"dual use parking place" means an area on a highway designated as a parking place by this Order for the leaving only -

(a) of such vehicles as display a valid parking ticket (unless exempted therefrom by virtue of the provisions of Article 51(P) in the manner specified in Article 51(N) or is a registered driver who has paid the relevant fee via the telephone payment parking system or

(b) with a charge without time limit during the permitted hours of such vehicles as display in the manner specified in Article 61 a valid residents parking permit or in the manner specified in Article 65 a valid residents' visitor's parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 67 a valid operational permit issued in respect of that vehicle

"hand held device" means a wireless hand-held computer used by a civil enforcement officer which is programmed to interface with the telephone payment parking system

"location identification number" means the unique number assigned to each pay and display parking place or certain parking bays within that parking place within a road where the telephone payment parking system is operational

"medical personnel" means doctors nurses healthcare and community visitors and other categories of medical personnel operating through Surrey County Council or the National Health Service or private healthcare organisations who make house visits

"nurse" means in relation to a nurse or a midwife a nurse or midwife who is

registered in the register maintained under Article 5 of the Nursing and Midwifery Order 2001 (S.I. 2002 No. 1771)

"operational parking permit" means an Operational Parking Permit issued by the Borough Council under the provisions of Article 66

"permit", without more, means a residents' parking permit or, as the case may be, a residents' visitor's parking permit or, as the case may be, an operational parking permit or, as the case may be, a carers permit or, as the case may be, a business permit

"parking ticket" means a ticket issued by a ticket machine relating to any dual use parking place which is identified on the plans annexed to this Order

"registered driver" means the driver of a vehicle who has prior to leaving his or her vehicle in a dual use parking place registered so many of his or her personal details with a service provider as that service provider may require to enable the telephone payment parking system to be activated in favour of the said driver

"shared use parking place" means an area on a highway designated as a parking place by this Order for the leaving -

- (a) free of charge of such vehicles only as are passenger vehicles goods vehicles motor cycles and invalid carriages by virtue of the provision of paragraph (a) of Article 50 but where such vehicles may not be left for a period longer than the specified maximum period for waiting in that shared use parking place and/or
- (b) for the leaving with a charge without time limit during the permitted hours of such vehicles as display in the manner specified in Article 61 a valid parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or as display in the manner specified in Article 65 a valid residents visitors parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 67 a valid operational permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 68 a valid business permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in

Article 57 a valid carers permit issued in respect of that vehicle

"service charge" means any charge payable to the service provider (in addition to the parking charge payable in accordance with the provisions of Article 51(M) for drivers of vehicles using the telephone payment parking system

"service provider" means a wireless hand-held computer used by a civil enforcement officer which is programmed to interface with the telephone payment parking system

"telephone payment parking system" means a system to facilitate and monitor the payment of parking charges (together with any service charge) using any telephone or internet enabled device via communication with the service provider in accordance with instructions indicated on signs located at each parking place for which a charge is made where the system is operational

"ticket machine" means an apparatus of a type and design approved by the Secretary of State for Transport for the purposes of this Order being apparatus designed to issue parking tickets indicating the payment of a charge and the date and time at which the ticket expires

- (c) there was substituted as SECTION III in PART III the following similarly numbered SECTION

### **"PART III**

#### **SECTION III**

#### **DESIGNATION OF PARKING PLACES FOR WHICH A CHARGE IS MADE**

##### **Designation of such parking places**

- 33 EACH area on a highway comprising the lengths of carriageway of the roads identified on the plans (within the area shown marked by black broken line and labelled as Working Controlled Parking Zone) and unless otherwise so specified bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a minimum width throughout of 1.8 metres is designated as a parking place for which a charge is made for use with such conditions on such days and during such hours as are identified on the plans and such charge to be as set out in the scale of charges stated in the Fourth Schedule to this Order

##### **Vehicles for which such parking places are designated**

- 34 EACH parking place may be used subject to the provisions of this Order for the leaving of such vehicles only as are passenger vehicles goods vehicles motorcycles or invalid carriages



### **Payment in connection with the use of such parking places**

- 35 (1) The charge for any vehicle left in a parking place referred to in Article 33 shall be identified as having been paid by the display on the vehicle in accordance with Article 36 of one valid parking ticket or one or more parking vouchers indicating the date and time at which the vehicle is due to leave or if using the telephone payment parking system, an indication that payment has been made and the parking period for which payment has been made shall appear on the hand-held device
- (2) No refund shall be payable in respect of any parking ticket or parking voucher surrendered to those persons bodies or agents appointed by or on behalf of the Borough Council or any payment for a parking ticket made using the telephone payment parking system

### **Parking Tickets to be displayed on vehicles left in such parking places**

- 36 (1) THE charges in respect of the use of the parking places referred to in the Fourth Schedule shall be payable in any parking place in the roads and lengths of roads identified on the plans by the insertion of an appropriate coin or coins or debit or credit card in the nearest ticket machine provided or by using the telephone payment parking system
- (2) AT all times during which a vehicle is left in such a parking place during the permitted hours in the roads and lengths of roads identified on the plans having paid for a parking ticket at the ticket machine the driver thereof before leaving the vehicle shall cause to be displayed:-
- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen a valid parking ticket so that the side containing the date and time of expiry is directed outwards from immediately behind the windscreen or the window nearest to the edge of the carriageway and to be clearly visible to a person outside the vehicle
- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen a valid parking ticket so that the side containing the date and time of expiry is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle

WITHOUT PREJUDICE to the provisions in this Article, if at any time while a vehicle is left in a parking place referred to in Article 33 and no indication appears in the vehicle's windscreen or on a hand-held device that payment of the parking charge has been made using the telephone payment parking system, or an indication that the parking period for which payment was made has expired, it shall be presumed, unless contrary is provided that either

- (a) the parking charge has not been duly paid in respect of that vehicle; or
- (b) the parking period for which payment was made has already expired

### **Parking vouchers to be displayed on vehicles left in such parking places**

- 37 AT all times during which a vehicle is left in a parking place for which are charge is made specified in Article 33 during the permitted hours the driver thereof before leaving shall cause to be displayed -
- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen a valid parking voucher or two or three valid parking vouchers with identical indications and placed alongside each other so that the obverse side is directed outwards from

- immediately behind the window adjacent to the windscreen and nearest to the edge of the carriageway to be clearly visible to a person outside the vehicle or
- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen a valid parking voucher or two or three valid parking vouchers with identical indications and placed alongside each other so that the obverse side is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle

PROVIDED THAT in the event that a parking voucher is displayed on vehicles left in parking places referred to in Article 33 in accordance with sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) above Article 36 shall not apply

#### **Restriction on use of valid parking vouchers**

- 38 (1) Where a vehicle has been left in a parking place during the permitted hours displaying the necessary number of valid parking vouchers neither the driver nor any other person shall remove the said vouchers and substitute any other parking voucher
- (2) No refund shall be payable in respect of any valid parking voucher or ticket surrendered

#### **Exemptions for Disabled Persons**

- 39 (1) NOTWITHSTANDING the provisions of Articles 36 and 38 the following vehicles may be left during the permitted hours in a parking place referred to in Article 33 and identified on the plans provided that the use of that parking place in which the vehicle is left has not been suspended and any such vehicle shall be exempt from payment of the initial charge or penalty charge specified in this Order:-
- (a) an invalid carriage or
- (b) a disabled person's vehicle displaying in the relevant position a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority
- (2) A vehicle which is so exempted from the payment of the initial charge or the penalty charge shall stand in the said parking place in accordance with the provisions of Article 41 (a) or (b) and wholly within the limits of that parking place

#### **Restriction on returning to park in such a parking place after the initial period**

- 40 WHERE a vehicle is left during the permitted hours in a parking place referred to in Article 33 and identified on the plans for the initial period for which payment has been made the driver or person in charge of the vehicle shall not cause or permit the vehicle to return to wait in the same parking place until the expiration of the time specified in on the key to the plans from the time it was taken away

#### **Manner of standing in such a parking place**

- 41 THE driver of a vehicle waiting during the permitted hours in a parking place referred to in Article 33 in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order shall cause it so to stand
- (a) in the case of a parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are specified in the plans so as to be in accordance with those provisions

- (b) in the case of any other parking place
  - (i) if the said parking place is not in a one way road that the left or near side or right or off side of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle or
  - (ii) if the said parking place is in a one way road that the left or near side of the vehicle is adjacent to the left hand edge of the carriageway or that the right or off side of the vehicle is adjacent to the right hand edge of the carriageway and
  - (iii) that the distance between the edge of the carriageway and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres
- (c) (i) that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a parking space and/or
- (ii) that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a parking place and
- (d) that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting

**Alteration of position of a vehicle in such a parking place**

42 WHERE any vehicle is standing in a parking place referred to in Article 33 and identified on the plans in contravention of the provisions of Article 41 or of the provisions of Article 47 a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions

**Power to suspend the use of such a parking place**

43 (1) A civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform, a person acting under the instructions (whether general or specific) of the Chief Officer of Police, or a person duly authorised by the Council or the Borough Council may suspend the use of such a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:-

- (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety
- (b) for the purpose of
  - (i) any building operation demolition or excavation adjacent to the said parking place
  - (ii) the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to that parking place
  - (iii) the laying erection alteration or repair in or adjacent to that parking place of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas water or electricity or of any electronic communication apparatus or
  - (iv) the placing maintenance or removal of any traffic sign
- (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the said parking

place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwellinghouse adjacent to that parking place from or to a depository another office or dwellinghouse

- (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any road will be thronged or obstructed or
  - (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the said parking place at times of weddings or funerals or on other special occasions
- (2) Subject to sub-article (1) of this Article a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform may suspend for not more than twenty four hours the use of such a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety
- (3) ON the suspension of the use of such a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Article the person authorising or causing such suspension -
- (a) shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof as the case may be a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that the waiting by vehicles is prohibited AND
  - (b) shall place or cause to be placed over any ticket machine a hood or other cover indicating that the use of or any part of the Parking Place is suspended and that waiting by vehicles is prohibited
- (4) NO person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in such a parking place or any part thereof during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof a traffic sign or traffic signs placed in pursuance of Paragraph (3) of this Article:-

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Paragraph shall apply -

- (i) in respect of any vehicle being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 43 (1) (b), (d) or (e) or
- (ii) to anything done with the permission of the person suspending the use of that parking place or that part thereof in pursuance of Paragraph (1) of this Article or a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform acting in the exercise of lawful authority

**Restriction on the use of such a parking place or a vehicle in such a parking place**

44 (1) DURING the permitted hours no person shall use any such parking place or any vehicle while it is in such a parking place in connection with the sale or offering or exposing for sale of any goods to any person in or near the said parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale his skill in handicraft or his services in any other capacity

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle -

- (a) if the vehicle is one which may wait in a parking place in accordance with Article 33 and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected or

- (b) if the vehicle is one to which the provisions of Article 46 (1) (i) or (j) apply
- (2) A vehicle left during the permitted hours in any parking place referred to in Article 33 shall not
- (a) be left for longer than the period for which payment has been made or
  - (b) shall not be left again in that parking place until the expiration of the return period specified in respect of that parking place as stated in the key to the plans or
  - (c) be of a class not authorised to be left in such a parking place as specified in Article 34 or
  - (d) wait in such a parking place other than in accordance with Article 47 or
  - (e) be parked other than in accordance with Article 41 or
  - (f) wait in such a parking place which has been suspended in accordance with Article 43 or
  - (g) be left in such a parking place without a valid disabled person's badge being displayed or
  - (h) be left in a pay and display only parking place without a valid parking ticket being displayed or show on a hand-held device that payment of the parking charge for the current period of parking in that parking place has been made using the telephone payment parking system

**Requirement for driver to stop engine of the vehicle whilst in position in such a parking place**

45 THE driver of a motor vehicle using such a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the said parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from that parking place

**Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in such a parking place**

46 (1) NOT WITHSTANDING the foregoing provisions of this Order any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours anywhere in any part of a pay and display parking place referred to in Article 33 and identified on the plans if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:-

- (a) the vehicle is waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes or such longer period as a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform acting in accordance with lawful authority may approve to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage

PROVIDED THAT if the said person is a person suffering from any disability or injury which seriously impairs his ability to walk or who is blind the vehicle may wait for as long as may be necessary to enable that person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage

- (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by

circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary to avoid an accident

- (c) the vehicle is being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or not being a passenger vehicle a motor cycle or an invalid carriage is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting
- (d) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic
- (e) the vehicle is waiting -
  - (i) while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting are being unloaded from the vehicle or having been unloaded therefrom are being delivered or
  - (ii) while postal packets are being collected for loading on the vehicle from premises or postal boxes adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting or having been so collected are being loaded thereon
- (f) the vehicle not being a passenger vehicle a motor cycle or an invalid carriage is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 43 (1) (b)
- (g) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwellinghouse adjacent to the parking place from or to a depository another office or dwellinghouse
- (h) in any other case the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting and the vehicle does not wait for such purpose for more than twenty minutes or for such longer period as a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may approve or
- (i) the vehicle is waiting otherwise than in a parking space (where such parking space is provided) if goods are being sold or offered or exposed for sale from the vehicle by a person who is licensed by the Borough Council to sell goods from a stationary vehicle on a pitch situated in the parking place or
- (j) a vehicle is displaying in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid waiver certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Borough Council to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate

PROVIDED THAT a waiver certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Borough Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid and that a notification of such cancellation shall be sent by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Borough Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Borough Council

- (2) NO charge specified in the foregoing provisions of Article 35 shall be payable in respect of any vehicle waiting in such a parking place in accordance with foregoing provisions of this Article and a valid parking ticket need not be displayed on that vehicle or in respect of payment made using the telephone parking payment system receipt of payment need not be displayed on the hand held device
- (3) EXCEPT as provided by this Order the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a parking place for which a charge is made during the permitted hours

**Manner of waiting in such a parking place**

47 NO person shall cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a parking place referred to in Article 33 and identified on the plans by virtue of the provisions of Paragraph (1) (e), (f), (g), (h) (i) or (j) of the last preceding Article otherwise than:-

- (a) in the case of a parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are specified in the plans so that the vehicle shall stand -
- (i) unless the length of the vehicle precludes compliance with this sub-paragraph in accordance with those provisions and so that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the aforesaid parking place
- (ii) if the length of the vehicle does preclude compliance with the last preceding sub-paragraph so that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres and
- (b) in the case of any other parking place so that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres and
- (c) so that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting

For the purposes of the foregoing sub-paragraph the expression "premises" shall not include any premises to or from which any furniture is being removed by virtue of the provisions of Paragraph (1) (g) of the last preceding Article or to or from which goods are being delivered or collected by virtue of Paragraph (1) (h) of that Article

**Exemptions from charges**

48 In the case of a parking place for which a charge is made or dual use parking place if on the leaving of a vehicle during the permitted hours in a parking bay (if such a parking bay is provided) in that parking place there is on every ticket machine situated in or in the vicinity of that parking place a notice placed by a civil enforcement officer or any person duly authorised by the Council or the Borough Council indicating that the ticket machine is out of order that vehicle shall be exempt from any initial charge

PROVIDED THAT if at least one of the said ticket machines is rectified or replaced not later than the maximum period for which vehicles may wait in respect of that parking place for which payment is made before the expiration of the permitted hours the vehicle is

removed within that maximum period of such rectification or replacement. If the vehicle is not so removed the initial charge for the maximum period for which vehicles may wait in respect of that parking place shall be deemed to have been incurred and paid at the time when the vehicle was first left in the parking bay (within the said parking place) either by the insertion of a coin or coins or a debit or credit card for the amount of that initial charge in the appropriate slot in a ticket machine relating to that parking place and all the provisions of this Order shall apply accordingly

BUT ALSO PROVIDED THAT if the driver of that vehicle is a registered driver as defined in Article 2 and the telephone payment parking system is fully operational in respect of that parking place then the provisions of this Article shall not apply to that driver and shall also not apply to a vehicle which displays in the manner specified in Article 61 a valid residents parking permit or the or in the manner specified in Article 65 a valid residents' visitors parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 67 a valid Operational parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 68 a valid business permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 57 a valid carers permit issued in respect of that vehicle

**Placing of traffic signs etc.**

49 THE Council and/or its agents (if any) shall -

- (a) place and maintain a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating the limits of each parking place for which a charge is made and/or each parking bay within such a parking place and
- (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place for which a charge is made referred to in Article 5 and identified on the plans a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that such parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of such vehicles specified in Article 3 and
- (c) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a parking place for which a charge is made
- (d) place and maintain a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that such parking place may be used by vehicles making payment of the parking charge using the telephone payment parking system and the location identification number of such a parking place and parking bay
- (e) Install and maintain in proper working order at least one ticket in or in the vicinity of each parking place for which a charge is made

**DESIGNATION OF SHARED USE PARKING PLACES**

**Designation of such parking places**

50 EACH area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a road identified on the plans as a shared use parking place within the area shown marked by a black broken line and labelled as Woking Controlled Parking Zone on any of the plans and unless otherwise so specified bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 1.83 metres is hereby designated as a



shared use parking place

**Vehicles for which such parking places are designated**

51 EACH shared use parking place identified on the plans may be used subject to the provisions of this Order for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles only -

- (a) as are passenger vehicles goods vehicles motor cycles or invalid carriages
- (b) as display in the manner specified in Articles 61 65 or 67 a valid parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle
- (c) as is a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority

**Period for which a vehicle may be left in such a parking place**

51(A) WITHOUT prejudice to the provisions of Article 51 (H) no person shall cause any vehicle to be left in a shared use parking place identified on the plans during the permitted hours for a continuous period of more than specified on the key to the plans with such conditions on such days and during such hours as identified on the plans:-

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall apply to -

- (a) a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority and/or
- (b) such vehicles as display in the manner specified in Articles 61 65 or 67 a valid parking permit issued by the Council in respect of that vehicle and/or
- (c) such vehicles as display in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid waiver certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Council to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate

PROVIDED THAT a waiver certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid and that a notification of such cancellation shall be sent by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Council believes to be that person's address

and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council

**Interval before a vehicle may again be left in such a parking place**

51(B) WITHOUT prejudice to the provisions of Article 51 (H) no vehicle which has been taken away from a parking space (where such parking space is provided) in a shared use parking place identified on the plans during the permitted hours shall until the expiration of the time specified on the key to the plans from the time it was taken away again be left in that parking place during the permitted hours:-

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall apply to -

- (a) a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority and/or
- (b) such vehicles as display in the manner specified in Articles 61 65 or 67 a valid parking permit issued by the Council in respect of that vehicle and/or
- (c) such vehicles as display in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid waiver certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Council to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate

PROVIDED THAT a waiver certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid and that a notification of such cancellation shall be sent by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council

**Manner of standing in such a parking place**

51(C) THE driver of a vehicle waiting in a shared use parking place during the permitted hours in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order shall cause it so to stand:-

- (a) in the case of a shared use parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are identified on the plans so as to be in accordance with those provisions
- (b) in the case of any other shared use parking place -

- (i) if the said parking place is not in a one-way road that the left or near side or right or off side of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle or
  - (ii) if the said parking place is in a one-way road that the left or near side of the vehicle is adjacent to the left-hand edge of the carriageway or that the right or off side of the vehicle is adjacent to the right-hand edge of the carriageway and
  - (iii) that the distance between the edge of the carriageway and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres
- and
- (c) (i) that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a parking space and/or
  - (ii) that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a shared use parking place and
- (d) that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting

**Alteration of position of a vehicle in such a parking place**

51(D) WHERE any vehicle is standing in a shared use parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 51 (C) or of the provisions of Article 51(H) a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions

**Power to suspend the use of such a parking place**

51(E) (1) Subject to the following persons or organisations being able to exercise the function described below in this Article by virtue of legislation, a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform, a person acting under the instructions (whether general or specific) of the Chief Officer of Police, or a person duly authorised by the Council or the Borough Council may suspend the use of a shared use parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:-

- (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety

- (b) for the purpose of any building operation demolition or excavation adjacent to the said parking place the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to that parking place the laying erection alteration or repair in or adjacent to that parking place of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas water or electricity or of any electronic communications apparatus or the placing maintenance or removal of any traffic sign
  - (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the said parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to that parking place from or to a depository another office or dwelling-house
  - (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any road will be thronged or obstructed or
  - (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the said parking place at times of weddings or funerals or on other special occasions
- (2) Subject as set out in paragraph (1) of this Article a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may suspend for not longer than twenty-four hours the use of a shared use parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety
- (3) On the suspension of the use of a shared use parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Article the person authorising or causing such suspension shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof as the case may be a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that the waiting by vehicles is prohibited
- (4) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in a shared use parking place or any part thereof during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof as the case may be a traffic sign or traffic signs placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article:

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this paragraph shall apply -

- (i) in respect of any vehicle being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 51(1)(b) (d) or (e) or
- (ii) to anything done with the permission of the person suspending the use of that parking place or that part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article or a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer acting in the exercise of lawful authority

**Restriction on the use of such a parking place or a vehicle in such a parking place**

51(F) DURING the permitted hours no person shall use any shared use parking place or any vehicle while it is in a shared use parking place in connection with the sale or offering or exposing for sale of any goods to any person in or near the shared use parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of his skill in handicraft or his services in any other capacity:

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle -

- (a) if the vehicle is one which may wait in a shared use parking place in accordance with Article 50 and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected or
- (b) if the vehicle is one to which the provisions of Article 51(H) (1)(h) or (i) apply

51(G) THE driver of a motor vehicle using a shared use parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the said parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from that parking place

**Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in such a parking place**

51(H) (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours anywhere in any part of a shared use parking place if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:-

- (a) the vehicle is waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes or such longer

period as a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer acting in accordance with lawful authority may approve to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage

PROVIDED THAT if the said person is a person suffering from any disability or injury which seriously impairs his ability to walk or who is blind the vehicle may wait for as long as may be necessary to enable that person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage

- (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident
- (c) the vehicle is being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or not being a passenger vehicle a motor cycle or an invalid carriage is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting
- (d) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic
- (e) the vehicle is waiting -
  - (i) while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the shared use parking place in which the vehicle is waiting are being unloaded from the vehicle or having been unloaded therefrom are being delivered or
  - (ii) while postal packets are being collected for loading on the vehicle from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the shared use parking place in which the vehicle is waiting or having been so collected are being loaded thereon

- (f) the vehicle not being a passenger vehicle a motor cycle or an invalid carriage is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 51(E) (1)(b)
- (g) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the shared use parking place in which the vehicle is waiting from or to a depository another office or dwelling-house
- (h) in any other case the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the shared use parking place in which the vehicle is waiting and the vehicle does not wait for such purpose for more than twenty minutes or for such longer period as a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may approve
- (i) the vehicle is waiting otherwise than in a parking space (where such parking space is provided) if goods are being sold or offered or exposed for sale from the vehicle by a person who is licensed by the Council or the Borough Council to sell goods from a stationary vehicle on a pitch situated in the shared use parking place or
- (j) the vehicle is displaying in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid waiver certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Council or the Borough Council to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate

PROVIDED THAT a waiver certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council or the Borough Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid and that a notification of such cancellation shall be sent by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Council or the Borough Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council or the Borough

Council

(2) Except as provided by this Order the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a shared use parking place during the permitted hours

**Manner of waiting in such a parking place**

51(l) NO person shall cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a shared use parking place by virtue of the provisions of sub-paragraph (1)(e) (f) (g) (h) (i) or (j) of the last preceding Article otherwise than:-

- (a) in the case of a shared use parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are identified on the plans so that the vehicle shall stand -
  - (i) unless the length of the vehicle precludes compliance with this sub-paragraph in accordance with those provisions and so that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the shared use parking place or
  - (ii) if the length of the vehicle does preclude compliance with the last preceding sub-paragraph so that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres and
- (b) in the case of any other shared use parking place so that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres and
- (c) so that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting

For the purposes of the last foregoing paragraph the expression "premises" shall not include any premises to or from which any furniture is being removed by virtue of the provisions of sub-paragraph (1)(g) of the last preceding Article or to or from which goods



are being delivered or collected by virtue of the provisions of sub-paragraph (1)(h) of that Article

**Placing of traffic signs etc**

51(J) THE Council shall -

- (a) place and maintain a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating the limits of each shared use parking place and/or each parking space and
- (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each shared use parking place identified on the plans a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that such parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Article 51 and
- (c) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a shared use parking place

**DESIGNATION OF DUAL USE PARKING PLACES**

**Designation of such parking places**

51(K) EACH area on a highway comprising the lengths of carriageway of the roads identified on the plans and unless otherwise so specified bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a minimum width throughout of 1.83 metres is designated as a dual use parking place for which a charge is made and for use in such positions on such days and during such hours as are identified on the plans and such charge to be as set out in the scale of charges stated in the Fourth Schedule to this Order

**Vehicles for which such parking places are designated**

51(L) EACH dual use parking place may be used subject to the provisions of this Order for the leaving of such vehicles only as are passenger vehicles (8 seats or less) goods vehicles motorcycles or invalid carriages

**Payment in connection with the use of such parking places**

51(M) (1) The charge for any vehicle left in a dual use parking place referred to in Article 51(K) shall be identified as having been paid by the display on the vehicle in

accordance with Article 51(N) of either -

- (a) one valid parking ticket indicating the date and time at which the vehicle is due to leave that dual use parking place or
  - (b) or using the telephone payment parking system, an indication that payment has been made and the parking period for which payment has been made shall appear on the hand-held device
- (2) No refund shall be payable in respect of any parking ticket surrendered to those persons bodies or agents appointed by or on behalf of the Borough Council or for any payment made for a parking ticket using the telephone payment parking system

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall apply to any vehicle waiting in a dual use parking place provided that that vehicle -

- (a) displays in the manner specified in Article 61 a valid residents parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or
- (b) displays in the manner specified in Article 65 a valid residents' visitor's parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or
- (c) displays in the manner specified in Article 67 a valid operational parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or
- (d) displays in the manner specified in Article 68 a valid business parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or
- (e) displays in the manner specified in Article 57 a valid carers parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or

**Parking Tickets to be displayed on vehicles left in such parking places**

51(N) (1) The charges in respect of the use of a dual use parking places referred to in The Fourth Schedule shall be payable in respect of any of the said parking places in the roads and lengths of roads identified on the plans annexed to this Order by the insertion of an appropriate coin or coins or debit or credit card in the appropriate slot in the nearest ticket machine provided or by using the telephone payment parking system

(2) At all times during which a vehicle is left in such a parking place during the permitted hours in the roads and lengths of roads identified on the plans annexed to this Order and has paid for a parking ticket at the nearest ticket machine the driver thereof before leaving the vehicle shall cause to be displayed -

(a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen a valid parking ticket so that the side containing the date and time of expiry is directed outwards from immediately behind the windscreen or the window nearest to the edge of the carriageway and to be clearly visible to a person outside the vehicle or

(b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen a valid parking ticket so that the side containing the date and time of expiry is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall apply to a vehicle waiting in a dual use parking place which displays in the manner specified in Article 61 a valid residents parking permit or in the manner specified in Article 65 a valid residents' visitor's parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or displays in the manner specified in Article 67 a valid operational parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 68 a valid business permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 57 a valid carers permit issued in respect of that vehicle

**Indications by ticket machine and tickets issued thereby as evidence**

51(O) WITHOUT prejudice to the provisions in this Article if at any time while a vehicle is left in a dual use parking place and no indication appears in the vehicle's windscreen or on a hand-held device that payment of the parking charge has been made using the telephone payment parking system, or an indication that the parking period for which payment was made has expired, it shall be presumed, unless the contrary is proved, that either -

- (c) the parking charge has not been duly paid in respect of that vehicle; or
- (d) the parking period for which payment was made has already expired

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall apply to a vehicle waiting in a dual use parking place which displays in the manner specified in Article 61 a valid residents parking permit or in the manner specified in Article 65 a valid residents' visitor's parking permit or displays in the manner specified in Article 67 a valid operational parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 68 a valid business permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 57 a valid carers permit issued in respect of that vehicle

### **Exemptions for Disabled Persons**

51(P) (1) NOTWITHSTANDING the provisions of Article 51(P) the following vehicles may be left during the permitted hours in a dual use parking place referred to in Article 51(K) and identified on the plans annexed to this Order provided that the use of that parking place in which the vehicle is left has not been suspended and any such vehicle shall be exempt from payment of the initial charge or penalty charge specified in this Order and shall also be exempt from the requirement to display either a valid residents parking permit in the manner specified in Article 61 or a valid residents visitors parking permit in the manner specified in Article 65 or displays in the manner specified in Article 67 a valid operational parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 68 a valid business permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 57 a valid carers permit issued in respect of that vehicle :-

- (a) an invalid carriage or
  - (b) a disabled person's vehicle displaying in the relevant position a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority
- (2) A vehicle which is so exempted from the payment of the initial charge or the penalty charge shall stand in the said parking place in accordance with the provisions of Article 51(R) and wholly within the limits of that parking place

### **Restriction on returning to park in such a parking place after the initial period**

51(Q) WHERE a vehicle is left during the permitted hours in a dual use parking place referred to in Article 51(K) and identified on the plans annexed to this Order for the initial period for which payment has been made the driver or person in charge of the vehicle shall not cause or permit the vehicle to return to wait in the same parking place until the expiration of the time specified in the key to the plans from the time it was taken away from that parking place

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall apply to a vehicle which has been left in a dual use parking place which displays in the manner specified in Article 61 a valid residents parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 65 a valid residents' visitor's parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 68 a valid business permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 57 a valid carers permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 67 a valid operational parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or is a vehicle waiting in such a parking place to which the provisions of Article 51(P) apply

### **Manner of standing in such a parking place**

51(R) THE driver of a vehicle waiting during the permitted hours in a dual use parking place referred to in Article 51(K) and identified on the plans in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order shall cause it so to stand -

- (a) in the case of such a parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are specified in the plans annexed to this Order so as to be in accordance with those provisions
- (b) in the case of any other such parking place
  - (i) if the said parking place is not in a one way road that the left or near side or right or off side of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle or
  - (ii) if the said parking place is in a one way road that the left or near side

of the vehicle is adjacent to the left hand edge of the carriageway or that the right or off side of the vehicle is adjacent to the right hand edge of the carriageway and

- (iii) that the distance between the edge of the carriageway and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres
- (c) (i) that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a parking bay and/or
- (ii) that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of such a parking place and
- (d) that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting

**Alteration of position of a vehicle in such a parking place**

51(S) WHERE any vehicle is standing in a dual use parking place and identified on the plans annexed to this Order in contravention of the provisions of Article 51(R) or of the provisions of Article 51(X) a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions

**Power to suspend the use of such a parking place**

51(T) (1) Subject to the following persons or organisations being able to exercise the function described below in this Article by virtue of legislation, a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform, a person acting under the instructions (whether general or specific) of the Chief Officer of Police, or a person duly authorised by the Council or the Borough Council may suspend the use of a dual use parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:-

- (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety
- (b) for the purpose of -
  - (i) any building operation demolition or excavation adjacent to the said

- parking place
- (ii) the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to that parking place
  - (iii) the laying erection alteration or repair in or adjacent to that parking place of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas water or electricity or of any electronic communication apparatus or
  - (iv) the placing maintenance or removal of any traffic sign
- (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the said parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to that parking place from or to a depository another office or dwelling-house
- (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any road will be thronged or obstructed or
- (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the said parking place at times of weddings or funerals or on other special occasions
- (2) Subject as set out in sub-article (1) of this Article a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform may suspend for not more than twenty four hours the use of such a parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety
- (3) On the suspension of the use of such a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Article the person authorising or causing such suspension -
- (a) shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof as the case may be a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that the waiting by vehicles is prohibited and
  - (b) shall place or cause to be placed over any ticket machine a hood or other cover indicating that the use of or any part of that parking place

is suspended and that waiting by vehicles is prohibited

- (4) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in such a parking place or any part thereof during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof as the case may be a traffic sign or traffic signs placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this Article:-

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this paragraph shall apply -

- (i) in respect of any vehicle being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 51(T) (1) (b), (d) or (e) or
- (ii) to anything done with the permission of the person suspending the use of that parking place or that part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article or a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform acting in the exercise of lawful authority

**Restriction on the use of such a parking place or a vehicle in such a parking place**

- 51(U) (1) During the permitted hours no person shall use any dual use parking place or any vehicle while it is in such a parking place in connection with the sale or offering or exposing for sale of any goods to any person in or near the said parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale his skill in handicraft or his services in any other capacity

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle -

- (a) if the vehicle is one which may wait in such a parking place in accordance with Article 51(K) and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected or
  - (b) if the vehicle is one to which the provisions of Article 51(W)(1) (h) or (i) apply
- (2) A vehicle left during the permitted hours in any dual use parking place referred to in Article 51(K) shall not -



- (a) be left for longer than the period for which payment has been made or
- (b) shall not be left again in that parking place until the expiration of the return period specified in respect of that parking place as stated in the key to the plans or
- (c) be of a class not authorised to be left in such a parking place as specified in Article 51(L) or
- (d) wait in such a parking place other than in accordance with Article 51(X) or
- (e) be parked other than in accordance with Article 51(R) or
- (f) wait in such a parking place which has been suspended in accordance with Article 51(T) or
- (g) be left in such a parking place without a valid disabled person's badge being displayed or
- (h) be left in such a parking place without a valid parking ticket being displayed or shown on a hand held device that payment of the parking charge for the current period of parking in that parking place has been made using the telephone payment parking system or displays in the manner specified in Article 61 a valid residents parking permit or in the manner specified in Article 65 a valid residents' visitor's parking permit or displays in the manner specified in Article 67 a valid operational parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 68 a valid business permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 57 a valid carers permit issued in respect of that vehicle

**Requirement for driver to stop engine of the vehicle whilst in position in such a parking place**

51(V) THE driver of a motor vehicle using a dual use parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the said parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from that parking

place

**Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in such a parking place**

51(W) (1) NOTWITHSTANDING the foregoing provisions of this Order any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours anywhere in any part of a dual use parking place referred to in Article 51(K) and identified on the plans annexed to this Order if the use of that part has not been suspended and if -

(a) the vehicle is waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes or such longer period as a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform acting in accordance with lawful authority may approve to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage

PROVIDED THAT if the said person is a person suffering from any disability or injury which seriously impairs his ability to walk or who is blind the vehicle may wait for as long as may be necessary to enable that person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage

(b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary to avoid an accident

(c) the vehicle is being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or not being a passenger vehicle a motor cycle or an invalid carriage is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting

(d) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic

(e) the vehicle is waiting -

(i) while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the

dual use parking place in which the vehicle is waiting are being unloaded from the vehicle or having been unloaded therefrom are being delivered or

- (ii) while postal packets are being collected for loading on the vehicle from premises or postal boxes adjacent to the dual use parking place in which the vehicle is waiting or having been so collected are being loaded thereon
- (f) the vehicle not being a passenger vehicle a motor cycle or an invalid carriage is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 51(T) (1) (b)
- (g) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the dual use parking place from or to a depository another office or dwelling-house
- (h) in any other case the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the dual use parking place in which the vehicle is waiting and the vehicle does not wait for such purpose for more than twenty minutes or for such longer period as a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may approve or
- (i) the vehicle is waiting otherwise than in a parking bay (where such parking bay is provided) if goods are being sold or offered or exposed for sale from the vehicle by a person who is licensed by the Borough Council to sell goods from a stationary vehicle on a pitch situated in that dual use parking place or
- (j) a vehicle is displaying in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid waiver certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Borough Council to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate

PROVIDED THAT a waiver certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Borough Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid and that a notification of such cancellation shall be sent by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Borough Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Borough Council

- (2) No charge specified in the foregoing provisions of Article 51(K) or Article 51(M) or Article 51(N) or paragraph (2) of Article 51(T) shall be payable in respect of any vehicle waiting in such a parking place in accordance with foregoing provisions of this Article and a valid permit or a valid parking ticket need not be displayed on that vehicle or, in respect of payment made using the telephone parking payment system, receipt of payment need not be displayed on the hand held device
- (3) Except as provided by this Order the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a dual use parking place during the permitted hours

**Manner of waiting in such a parking place**

51(X) NO person shall cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a dual use parking place referred to in Article 51(K) and identified on the plans annexed to this Order by virtue of the provisions of paragraph (1) (e), (f), (g), (h) (i) or (j) of the last preceding Article otherwise than:-

- (a) in the case of a dual use parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are specified in the plans annexed to this Order so that the vehicle shall stand -
  - (i) unless the length of the vehicle precludes compliance with this subparagraph in accordance with those provisions and so that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the aforesaid parking place
  - (ii) if the length of the vehicle does preclude compliance with the last

preceding sub-paragraph so that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres and

- (b) in the case of any other dual use parking place so that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres and
- (c) so that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting

For the purposes of the foregoing sub-paragraph the expression "premises" shall not include any premises to or from which any furniture is being removed by virtue of the provisions of paragraph (1) (g) of the last preceding Article or to or from which goods are being delivered or collected by virtue of paragraph (1) (h) of that Article

### **Exemptions from charges**

51(Y) IN the case of a dual use parking place if on the leaving of a vehicle during the permitted hours in a parking bay (if such a parking bay is provided) in that parking place there is on every ticket parking meter situated in or in the vicinity of that parking place a notice placed by a civil enforcement officer or any person duly authorised by the Council or the Borough Council indicating that the ticket machine is out of order that vehicle shall be exempt from any initial charge

PROVIDED THAT if at least one of the said ticket machines is rectified or replaced not later than the maximum period for which vehicles may wait in respect of that parking place for which payment is made before the expiration of the permitted hours the vehicle is removed within that maximum period of such rectification or replacement. If the vehicle is not so removed the initial charge for the maximum period for which vehicles may wait in respect of that parking place shall be deemed to have been incurred and paid at the time when the vehicle was first left in the

parking bay within the said parking place either by the insertion of a coin or coins or a debit or credit card for the amount of that initial charge in the appropriate slot in a ticket machine relating to that parking place and all the provisions of this Part of this Order shall then apply accordingly

BUT ALSO PROVIDED THAT if the driver of that vehicle is a registered driver as defined in Article 2 and the telephone payment parking system is fully operational in respect of that parking place then the provisions of this Article shall not apply to that driver and shall also not apply to a vehicle which displays in the manner specified in Article 61 a valid residents parking permit or in the manner specified in Article 65 a valid residents' visitor's parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 67 a valid operational parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 68 a valid business permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 57 a valid carers permit issued in respect of that vehicle

**Placing of traffic signs etc.**

51(Z) THE Council and/or its agents (if any) shall -

- (a) place and maintain a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating the limits of each dual use parking place and/or each parking bay within such a parking place and
- (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each dual use parking place referred to in 51(K) and identified on the plans annexed to this Order a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that such parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of such vehicles specified in Article 51(L) and
- (c) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a dual use parking place and
- (d) place and maintain a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that any dual use parking place may be used by vehicles making payment of the parking charge

using the telephone payment parking system and the location identification number of such a parking place and parking bay

- (e) install and maintain in proper working order at least one ticket machine in or in the vicinity of each dual use parking place

## **DESIGNATION OF RESIDENTS ONLY PARKING PLACES**

### **Designation of such parking places**

51(AA) EACH area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a road identified on the plans as a residents only parking place within the area shown marked by a black broken line and labelled as Working Controlled Parking on any of the plans and unless otherwise so specified on the plans bounded on one side of that length by the edge of the carriageway and having a width throughout of 1.83 metres is hereby designated as a residents only parking place

### **Vehicles for which such parking places are designated**

51(BB) EACH residents only parking place identified on the plans may be used subject to the provisions of this Order for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles only as display in the manner specified in Article 61 a valid parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or a valid residents visitors parking permit Article 65 or in the manner specified in Article 67 a valid operational parking permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 68 a valid business permit issued in respect of that vehicle or in the manner specified in Article 57 a valid carers permit issued in respect of that vehicle

### **Manner of standing in such a parking place**

51(CC) THE driver of a vehicle waiting in a residents only parking place during the permitted hours in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order shall cause it so to stand:-

- (a) in the case of a residents only parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are identified on the plans so as to be in accordance with those provisions
- (b) in the case of any other residents only parking place -

(i) if the said parking place is not in a one-way road that the left or near side or right or off side of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle or

(ii) if the said parking place is in a one-way road that the left or near side of the vehicle is adjacent to the left-hand edge of the carriageway or that the right or off side of the vehicle is adjacent to the right-hand edge of the carriageway

and

(iii) that the distance between the edge of the carriageway and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres

(c) (i) that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a parking space and/or

(ii) that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of a residents only parking place

and

(d) that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting

#### **Alteration of position of a vehicle in such a parking place**

51(DD)WHERE any vehicle is standing in a residents only parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 51(CC) or of the provisions of Article 51(HH) a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions

#### **Power to suspend the use of such a parking place**

51(EE)(1) Subject to the following persons or organisations being able to exercise the function described below in this Article by virtue of legislation, a civil enforcement officer or a police constable in uniform, a person acting under the instructions (whether general or specific) of the Chief Officer of Police, or a person duly authorised by the Council or the Borough Council may suspend the use of a residents only parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary:-

(a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety



- (b) for the purpose of any building operation demolition or excavation adjacent to the said residents only parking place the maintenance improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to that parking place the laying erection alteration or repair in or adjacent to that parking place of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas water or electricity or of any electronic communication apparatus or the placing maintenance or removal of any traffic sign
- (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the said residents only parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to that parking place from or to a depository another office or dwelling-house
- (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any road will be thronged or obstructed or
- (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the said residents only parking place at times of weddings or funerals or on other special occasions

(2) Subject as set out in paragraph (1) of this Article a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may suspend for not longer than twenty-four hours the use of a residents only parking place or any part thereof whenever he considers such suspension reasonably necessary for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety

(3) On the suspension of the use of a residents only parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Article the person authorising or causing such suspension shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof as the case may be a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that the waiting by vehicles is prohibited

(4) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in a residents only parking place or any part thereof during such period as there is in or adjacent to that parking place or that part thereof a traffic sign or traffic signs placed in pursuance of paragraph (3) of this

Article:

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this paragraph shall apply -

- (i) in respect of any vehicle being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 51(EE) (1)(b) (d) or (e) or
- (ii) to anything done with the permission of the person suspending the use of that parking place or that part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article or a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer acting in the exercise of lawful authority

**Restriction on the use of such a parking place or a vehicle in such a parking place**

51(FF) DURING the permitted hours no person shall use any residents only parking place or any vehicle while it is in such a parking place in connection with the sale or offering or exposing for sale of any goods to any person in or near the said parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of his skill in handicraft or his services in any other capacity:

PROVIDED THAT nothing in this Article shall prevent the sale of goods from a vehicle -

- (a) if the vehicle is one which may wait in a residents only parking place in accordance with Article 51(GG)(1) and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected or
- (b) if the vehicle is one to which the provisions of Article 51(GG) (i) apply

THE driver of a motor vehicle using a residents only parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the said parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from that parking place

**Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in such a parking place**

51(GG)(1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order any vehicle may wait during the permitted hours anywhere in any part of a residents only parking place if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:-

- (a) the vehicle is waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes or such longer

period as a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer acting in accordance with lawful authority may approve to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage

PROVIDED THAT if the said person is a person suffering from any disability or injury which seriously impairs his ability to walk or who is blind the vehicle may wait for as long as may be necessary to enable that person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage

- (b) the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident
- (c) the vehicle is being used for fire brigade ambulance or police purposes or not being a passenger vehicle a motor cycle or an invalid carriage is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting
- (d) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic
- (e) the vehicle is waiting -
  - (i) while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the residents only parking place in which the vehicle is waiting are being unloaded from the vehicle or having been unloaded therefrom are being delivered or
  - (ii) while postal packets are being collected for loading on the vehicle from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the residents only parking place in which the vehicle is waiting or having been so collected are being loaded thereon

- (f) the vehicle not being a passenger vehicle a motor cycle or an invalid carriage is waiting only for so long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for any purpose specified in Article 51(EE)(1)(b)
- (g) the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the residents only parking place in which the vehicle is waiting from or to a depository another office or dwelling-house
- (h) the vehicle is waiting for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the residents only parking place in which the vehicle is waiting and the vehicle does not wait for such purpose for more than twenty minutes or for such longer period as a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may approve or
- (i) the vehicle is displaying in a prominent position behind the windscreen so that it is facing forwards and can be entirely and easily seen from the front of the vehicle a valid waiver certificate issued by a person duly authorised by the Council or the Borough Council to wait in accordance with the terms and conditions prescribed by the said certificate

PROVIDED THAT a waiver certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council or the Borough Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid and that a notification of such cancellation shall be sent by post to the holder of the certificate at any address which the Council or the Borough Council believes to be that person's address and the certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council or the Borough Council

(2) No charge shall be payable in respect of any vehicle waiting in a residents only parking place in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (a) to (h) inclusive of this Article and a valid permit need not be displayed on that vehicle

(3) Except as provided by this Order the driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a residents only parking place during the permitted

hours

**Manner of waiting in such a parking place**

51(HH)NO person shall cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a residents only parking place by virtue of the provisions of paragraph (1)(e) (f) (g) (h) or (i) of the last preceding Article otherwise than:-

- (a) in the case of a residents only parking place in relation to which special provisions as to the manner of standing of a vehicle in that parking place are identified on the plans so that the vehicle shall stand -
  - (i) unless the length of the vehicle precludes compliance with this sub-paragraph in accordance with those provisions and so that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the aforesaid residents only parking place
  - (ii) if the length of the vehicle does preclude compliance with the last preceding sub-paragraph so that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres and
- (b) in the case of any other residents only parking place so that the longitudinal axis of the vehicle is parallel to the edge of the carriageway nearest to the vehicle and the distance between the said edge and the nearest wheel of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres and
- (c) so that no part of the vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from any premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting

For the purposes of the last foregoing sub-paragraph the expression "premises" shall not include any premises to or from which any furniture is being removed by virtue of the provisions of paragraph (1)(g) of the last preceding Article or to or from which goods are being delivered or collected by virtue of the provisions of paragraph (1)(h) of that Article

**Placing of traffic signs etc**

51(II) THE Council shall -

- (a) place and maintain a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating the limits of each

- residents only parking place and/or each parking space and
- (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each residents only parking place identified on the plans a traffic sign or traffic signs indicating that such parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Article 51(BB) and
  - (c) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a residents only parking place
  - (d) there was substituted as SECTION II in PART IV the following similarly numbered SECTION

**"PART IV - SECTION II - RESIDENTS' VISITOR'S PARKING PERMITS**

**Application for and issue of a residents' visitor's parking permit**

- 63 (1) Any resident may apply to the Council for the issue of a residents' visitor's parking permit for the leaving without time limit during the permitted hours in any dual use parking place or shared-use parking place or residents parking place of a vehicle of a class referred to in paragraph (1) of Article 61 owned by and/or being used by a visitor and any application for such a residents' visitor's parking permit shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by a remittance for the appropriate fee in respect of a residents' visitor's parking permit hereinafter specified
- (2) The Council may at any time require an applicant for a residents' visitor's parking permit or any residents' visitor's parking permit holder to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a residents' visitor's parking permit made to them as they may reasonably call for to verify any particulars or information given to them or in respect of any resident's visitor's parking permit issued by them to that person as they may reasonably call for to verify that the residents' visitor's parking permit is valid

(3) Upon receipt of an application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this Article and the appropriate fee specified in paragraph (6) of this Article the Council upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident may in its absolute discretion issue to the applicant therefor one residents' visitor's parking permit the parking permit aforesaid being for the leaving without time limit during the permitted hours in the residents parking place or a dual use parking place of a vehicle owned by and/or being used by a person visiting the applicant therefor

PROVIDED THAT subject to the provisions of paragraph (4) of this Article the Council may in its absolute discretion limit the number of residents' visitor's parking permits that are issued at any one time in respect of a particular usual place of abode and may require the production and/or surrender of a used residents' visitor's parking permit or used residents' visitor's parking permits before issuing a further such permit

(4) Subject as provided below the number of residents' visitor's parking permits issued in respect of each separate usual place of abode shall not exceed one hundred and twenty in each calendar year

PROVIDED THAT this paragraph shall have effect subject to the proviso that in certain exceptional circumstances the number of residents' visitor's parking permits issued in respect of each separate usual place of abode may exceed one hundred and twenty in each calendar with no upper limit on the number of such permits so issued provided that in each case the exceptional circumstances referred to above are met and/or fully complied with

(5) If the Council is either unable or decides not to issue a residents' visitor's parking permit to an applicant therefor any remittance paid shall be refunded to the said applicant

(6) The fee referred to in paragraph (3) of this Article payable to the Council in respect of a residents' visitor's parking permit shall be two pounds for each

such parking permit and that the residents' visitor's parking permit shall be valid for a period of one day only

- (7) No refund shall be payable by the Council in respect of any unused residents' visitor's parking permits or any such parking permits which are or have been lost or destroyed by the resident to whom those residents' visitor's parking permits have been issued or which residents' visitor's parking permits have been mutilated or torn or accidentally defaced in any way whatsoever whilst those residents' visitor's parking permits have been issued to a resident and are actually held by that resident for the time being
- (8) For the avoidance of doubt it is hereby stated by the Council that -
- (a) the issuing of a residents' visitor's parking permit to a resident does not guarantee that any parking space within any shared-use parking place or residents only parking place or dual use parking place will be available for use by the visitor to that resident during the permitted hours and
  - (b) the residents' visitor's parking permit remains at all times whilst it is issued to the resident the property of the Council

**Form of residents' visitor's parking permits**

64 A residents' visitor's parking permit shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars -

- (a) a space for the insertion of the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the residents' visitor's parking permit is to be displayed on and used
- (b) an indication that the residents' visitor's parking permit has been issued by the Council
- (c) a figure stating the number of the residents' visitor's parking permit
- (d) the words and letter "Woking Controlled Parking Zone"
- (e) a space for the insertion of a set of figures and/or words indicating the days of the month and the calendar year and/or years when the residents' visitor's parking permit may be used



- (f) a list indicating the names of each month of the year

**Display of residents' visitor's parking permits**

65 AT all times during which a vehicle of a class referred to in paragraph (1) of Article 61 is left in any dual use parking place or shared-use parking place or residents only parking place during the permitted hours a valid residents' visitors parking permit shall be displayed on the vehicle in respect of which it is to be used on the front or near-side of the vehicle so that all the particulars on the residents' visitor's parking permit are readily visible from the front or near-side of the vehicle

PROVIDED THAT no such residents' visitor's parking permit need be so displayed if the vehicle is waiting in any dual use parking place or shared-use parking place or residents parking place pursuant to the provisions of Article 51(H) or Article 51(W) or Article 51(GG)

**Validation of residents' visitor's parking permits**

66 A residents' visitor's parking permit shall be validated by the resident to whom it has been issued or by the visitor by whom it is to be used by indicating by whatever means provided on that residents' visitor's parking permit the date of the day of the month and the year on which that residents' visitor's parking permit is to be used and by marking on the residents' visitor's parking permit the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which that residents' visitor's parking permit is to be used"

- (e) there was substituted as SECTION III in PART IV the following similarly numbered SECTION

**"PART IV - SECTION III**

**PROVISIONS APPLYING TO THE ISSUE AND USE OF**

**OPERATIONAL PARKING PERMITS**

**Application for and issue of an Operational Parking Permit**

67 (1) ANY person falling within the definition of medical personnel in paragraph (1) of Article 2 of this Order may apply to the Borough Council for the issue of an Operational Parking Permit for the leaving in any dual use parking place or shared use parking place or residents only parking place situated within the area shown marked by a black broken line and labelled as Woking Controlled

Parking Zone on any of the plans during the permitted hours of either a passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle belonging to or being used by a person attending in the course of medical or community care duties at any premises the postal address of which is in the roads and lengths of roads specified and described in The First Column of the First Schedule and any such application shall be made in accordance with formal guidance issued by and obtainable from the Borough Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such guidance to be supplied and the Borough Council may in its absolute discretion issue an Operational Parking Permit to such categories of medical personnel

- (2) THE Borough Council may at any time require an applicant for an Operational Parking Permit or an Operational Parking Permit holder to produce to an Officer of that Council such evidence in respect of an application for an Operational Parking Permit made to them as they may reasonably call for to verify any particulars or information given to them or in respect of any Operational Parking Permit issued by them to that person as they may reasonably call for to verify that the Operational Parking Permit is valid
- (3) UPON receipt of an application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this Article and upon being satisfied that the applicant is employed as one of the specific categories of medical personnel and is either the owner of either a passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle or a person authorised by the owner of such a vehicle the Borough Council may in its absolute discretion issue to the applicant therefor one Operational Parking Permit for the leaving without time limit and free of charge during the permitted hours in any residents' only parking place or a dual use parking place identified on the plans situated in any of the relevant areas of a vehicle belonging to or being used by medical personnel visiting a resident in the course of their duties
- (4) IN any respect not specifically mentioned in paragraphs (1), (2), (3), (5) and (6) of this Article the procedure validity and terms of use of an Operational

Parking Permit shall be the same as the procedure validity and terms of use of a parking permit and this paragraph shall be construed accordingly

- (5) NO charge shall be payable in respect of an Operational Parking Permit which subject to the provisions of this Order shall be valid for a period of twelve months
- (6) AN Operational Parking Permit shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:-
  - (a) a serial number identifiable in the office of issue
  - (b) the registration mark or marks of the vehicle or the two vehicles in respect of which the Operational Parking Permit has or have been issued PROVIDED THAT if the permit holder has the use of a pool vehicle from his/her employer then the said permit need not display the registration mark of a vehicle
  - (c) the period during which subject to the provisions of paragraph (5) of this Article the Operational Parking Permit shall remain valid
  - (d) an indication that the permit has been issued by the Borough Council
- (7) AT all times during which either a passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle which is being used only for the purposes specified in paragraph (1) of this Article is left in a dual use parking place or in a shared use parking place or a residents only parking place situated within the area shown marked by a black broken line and labelled as Woking Controlled Parking Zone and identified on the plans during the permitted hours a valid Operational Parking Permit shall be displayed on the vehicle in respect of which it was issued on the front or nearside of that vehicle so that all the particulars on the operational parking permit are readily visible from the front or nearside of the vehicle

PROVIDED THAT no such parking permit need be so displayed if the vehicle is waiting in such a parking place pursuant to the provisions of Article 51(H) Article 51(W) and Article 51(GG) or is a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position or in the prescribed manner a

disabled person's badge issued by any local authority"

(f) for Article 56 there was substituted the following Article -

**Application for and issue of a residents parking permit**

- 56 (1) Any resident who is -
- (a) the owner of not more than one vehicle being a passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle and who in the opinion of the Council -
    - (i) does not have and is unable to provide off-street parking and/or garage facilities for that vehicle or
    - (ii) is able to provide off-street parking and/or garage facilities for that vehicle onlymay apply to the Council for the issue to him of a parking permit in respect of that vehicle
  - (b) the owner of two or more vehicles being passenger vehicles or goods vehicles or a combination thereof and who in the opinion of the Council has off-street parking and/or garage facilities for one or more of those vehicles may apply to the Council for the issue to him of a parking permit in respect of one of those vehicles only
  - (c) the owner of two or more vehicles being passenger vehicles or goods vehicles or a combination thereof and who in the opinion of the Council does not have and is unable to provide off-street parking and/or garage facilities for any of those vehicles may apply to the Council for the issue to him of parking permits in respect of not more than two of those vehicles
  - (d) any such application as is mentioned in sub-paragraphs (a) (b) or (c) above shall be made on a form or forms issued by and obtainable from the Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form or forms to be supplied and shall be accompanied by a remittance for the appropriate fee hereinafter

specified

- (e) an owner of more than two vehicles shall not in any circumstances be entitled to a parking permit except as stated in sub-paragraphs (b) and (c) above
- (2) At premises where there is more than one resident applications from the residents will be treated on the basis that paragraph (1) of this *Article* shall apply to the first resident who applies and assuming that he is granted a permit or permits as appropriate no further applications from other residents will be considered
- (3) The Council may at any time require an applicant for a parking permit or any parking permit holder to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a parking permit made to them as they may reasonably call for to verify any particulars or information given to them or in respect of any parking permit issued by them to that person as they may reasonably call for to verify that the parking permit is valid
- (4) Upon receipt of an application duly made -
- (a) under the provisions of sub-paragraph (b) or (c) of paragraph (1) of this Article in respect of the first nominated vehicle the Council upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident and is the owner of a vehicle of the classes specified in paragraph (1) of this Article may in its absolute discretion issue to the applicant therefor one parking permit the parking permit being for the leaving without time limit during the permitted hours in any dual use parking place and/or in any shared use parking place and/or in any residents only parking place identified on the plans of the vehicle to which such parking permit relates by the owner of such vehicle or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the owner other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward
  - (b) under the provisions of sub-paragraph (c) of paragraph (1) of this

Article in respect of the second nominated vehicle the Council upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident and is the owner of a vehicle of the classes specified in paragraph (1) of this Article may in its absolute discretion issue to the applicant therefor one parking permit the parking permit being for the leaving without time limit during the permitted hours in any dual use parking place and/or in any shared use parking place and/or in any residents only parking place identified on the plans of the vehicle to which such parking permit relates by the owner of such vehicle or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the owner other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward

(c) under the provisions of sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (1) of this Article in respect of the nominated vehicle the Council upon being satisfied that the applicant is a resident and is the owner of a vehicle of the classes specified in paragraph (1) of this Article may in its absolute discretion issue to the applicant therefor one parking permit the parking permit being for the leaving without time limit during the permitted hours in any dual use parking place and/or in any shared use parking place and/or any residents only parking place identified on the plans of the vehicle to which such parking permit relates by the owner of such vehicle or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the owner other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward

(5) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article the Council shall not in any circumstances issue a parking permit to any resident which would be valid for any period during which any other parking permit issued to that resident by the Council and/or the Borough Council for the leaving of a vehicle in a street parking place pursuant to the provisions of any other enactment is valid

- (6) If the Council is either unable or decides not to issue a parking permit to an applicant therefor any remittance paid shall be refunded to the said applicant
- (7) The fee referred to in paragraph (1) of this Article payable to the Council shall be the sum of -
  - (a) fifty pounds in respect of a parking permit issued under the provisions of paragraphs (a) and (c) of paragraph (4) of this Article which subject to the provisions of this Order shall be valid for a period of twelve months running from any day of the month on which the parking permit first becomes valid
  - (b) seventy-five pounds in respect of a parking permit issued under the provisions of paragraph (b) of paragraph (4) of this Article which subject to the provisions of this Order shall be valid for a period of twelve months running from any day of the month on which the parking permit first becomes valid
- (8) It is hereby stated by the Council that -
  - (a) the issuing of a parking permit to a parking permit holder does not guarantee that any parking space within any dual use parking place and/or any shared use parking place and/or any residents only parking place will be available for use by the parking permit holder aforesaid during the permitted hours and
  - (b) the parking permit remains at all times whilst it is issued to a parking permit holder the property of the Council"
- (g) there was added as paragraph (4) of Article 62 the following paragraph -

"(4) The charge for the issue of a duplicate parking permit shall be fifteen pounds for each duplicate parking permit issued pursuant to paragraph (1) or paragraph (2) of this Article"
