## (CORMORANT WAY AND SOUTHLANDS DRIVE WEST CROSS SWANSEA)

#### **ORDER 2011**

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SWANSEA (hereinafter called "the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) (which said Act of 1984 is hereby referred to as "the Act of 1984") and the Traffic Management Act 2004 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 124 of the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order:

- THIS Order shall come into operation on Friday, the twenty eighth day of January 2011 and may be cited as "the Council of the City and County of Swansea (Prohibition of Waiting "At Any Time") (Cormorant Way and Southlands Drive West Cross Swansea) Order 2011"
- IN this Order:
- 2.1. **EXCEPT** where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order
- 2.2. THE Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the Interpretation of an Act of Parliament
- 2.3. **THE** prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any other prohibition or restriction whether made under the Act of 1984 or otherwise

2.4. "disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities'
Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (Wales) Regulations 2000

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles)(Wales) Regulation 2000

"parking disc" means a disc issued by a Local Authority complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specifications for Parking Discs to comply with the European Blue Badge Scheme being a disc coloured blue and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins, and

"relevant position" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons (Wales) Regulations 2000

"bus" shall have the same meaning as in Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981

"civil enforcement officer" has the same meaning as in Section 63A of the Act of 1984 and by virtue of Section 76 of the 2004 Act a civil enforcement officer appointed under Section 63A of the Act of 1984 is a civil enforcement officer in relation to parking contraventions

- 3. **NOTHING** in Article 5. of this Order shall make it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time of which the period of waiting began) to wait on the side of the road or roads referred to in the said Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from the previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of the road or roads
- 4. **NOTHING** in Article 5. of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides or lengths of the roads specified

therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-

- (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
  - (i) building industrial or demolition operations
  - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic
  - the laying erection alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said side of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984
  - (iv) a vehicle being used for police ambulance fire brigade or other emergency purposes
- (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties.
- (c) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 37 of the Post Office Act 1953
- (d) the vehicle to take in petrol oil water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of road
- (e) public service vehicles when waiting at an authorised bus stop to set down or pick up passengers
- 5. Save as provided in Articles 3. and 4. and except on the direction of a Police Officer in uniform or a person authorised by the Council or a civil enforcement officer no person shall cause any vehicle to wait "at any time" on the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in the Schedule hereto.

#### **SCHEDULE**

#### PROHIBITION OF WAITING "AT ANY TIME"

#### **CORMORANT WAY**

#### **Northern Side**

From its junction with Southlands Drive for a distance of 56 metres in a southerly and then a westerly direction.

#### Southern Side

From its junction with Southlands Drive for a distance of 36 metres in a south westerly direction.

#### **SOUTHLANDS DRIVE**

#### **South West Side**

From its junction with the north eastern kerb line of Cormorant Way for a distance of 16 metres north west thereof.
