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ORDER 2012

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SWANSEA (hereinafter called "the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and the Traffic Management Act 2004 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 and Section 124 of the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order.

SECTION 1 - PRELIMINARY

Citation and commencement

This Order shall come into operation on 22nd day of May 2012 and may be cited as the Council of the City and County of Swansea Queens Road, Mumbles, Swansea traffic regulation order 2012

Definitions

2. In this order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them:

"civil enforcement officer" has the same meaning as in Section 63A of the Act of 1984 and by virtue of Section 76 of the 2004 Act a civil enforcement officer appointed under Section 63A of the Act of 1984 is a civil enforcement officer in relation to parking contraventions;

- (i) building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the relevant position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
- (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984
- (iv) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes
- (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties.
- (c) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in Section 37 of the Post Office Act 1953
- (d) public service vehicles when waiting at an authorised bus stop to set down or pick up passengers
- (e) vehicles picking up and dropping off passengers

E Permits

The Council may at any time require an applicant for a Permit or a holder of a Permit to produce to an Officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application for a Permit made to them as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them or in respect of any Permit issued by them as they may reasonably require to verify that the Permit is valid

- (ii) On receipt of an application for a Permit the Council upon being satisfied that
 - (a) the applicant is a person who resides in a road or the Controlled Parking Zone referred to in the Schedules to this Order or is a person who falls within the categories of persons eligible for the granting of Permit as may be determined from time to time by the Council
 - (b) the application is made in respect of an eligible vehicle as defined in paragraph (iii) of this Article shall issue to the applicant a Permit in respect of that vehicle subject to no more than two Permits being issued in respect of any particular residence
- (iii) For the purposes of this Article "eligible vehicle" means:
 - (a) a passenger vehicle which is a motor vehicle constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than twelve passengers exclusive of the driver and not drawing a trailer
 - (b) a goods vehicle the weight of which does not exceed 3500kg unladen

(v) so that every part of the vehicle is within the limits of the parking place as marked on the carriageway.

B. Alteration of position of a vehicle in a parking place


Where any vehicle is standing in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 4.A. above, the Council or police officer in uniform may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions.

C. Movement of a vehicle in a parking place in an emergency

A police officer in uniform or a civil enforcement officer may move or cause to be moved or remove or cause to be removed, in case of emergency, to any place he/she thinks fit, any vehicle left in a parking place and shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle

D. Suspensions of use of parking place

- (1) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a parking place or any part thereof whenever they consider such suspension reasonably necessary:-
 - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
 - (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition of excavation adjacent to the parking place provided that a waiver issued by the Council is displayed in the relevant position on the vehicle, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to the parking



SCHEDULES

SCHEDULE 1

QUEENS ROAD

PERMIT HOLDER ONLY AT ANY TIME

South Side

From a point 58 metres west of its junction with the western kerb line of Kings Road to a point 90 metres west of that junction.

SCHEDULE 2


REVOCATIONS
