ORDER 2014

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SWANSEA (hereinafter called "the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and the Traffic Management Act 2004 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 and Section 124 of the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order.

SECTION 1 – PRELIMINARY

Citation and commencement

1. This Order shall come into operation on Friday 6th June 2014 and may be cited as the Council of the City and County of Swansea SWANSEA BOULEVARD (REVOCATIONS) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING LOADING AND UNLOADING "AT ANY TIME") (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AT ANY TIME) (ONE HOUR LIMITED WAITING (NO RETURN WITHIN TWO HOURS) MONDAY TO SATURDAY 8.00AM TO 6.00PM – PERMIT HOLDERS EXEMPT) (ONE HOUR LIMITED WAITING (NO RETURN WITHIN TWO HOURS) MONDAY TO SATURDAY 8.00AM TO 6.00PM) (PROHIBITION OF 'U' TURN)(PROHIBITION OF LEFT TURN)(LEFT TURN ONLY) traffic regulation order 2014

Definitions

2. In this order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them:

“civil enforcement officer” has the same meaning as in Section 63A of the Act of 1984 and by virtue of Section 76 of the 2004 Act a civil enforcement officer appointed under Section 63A of the Act of 1984 is a civil enforcement officer in relation to parking contraventions;

“public service vehicle” means a vehicle carrying passengers for a fee and for the purposes of this Order public service vehicle refers to a large public service vehicle capable of carrying more than eight passengers;

“relevant position” in respect of:-

- (a) a disabled person’s badge and parking disc has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Wales) Regulations 2000; and
- (b) a permit means exhibited on the windscreen, dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or, where the vehicle does not have a windscreen, dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the whole of the information on the front of the permit is clearly legible from outside the vehicle;
- (c) a pay and display ticket means exhibited on the windscreen dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or, where the vehicle does not have a windscreen, dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the whole of the information on the front of the ticket is clearly legible from outside the vehicle;
- (d) a waiver means exhibited on the windscreen, dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or, where the vehicle does not have a windscreen, dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on

the vehicle so that the whole of the information on the front of the waiver is clearly legible from outside the vehicle;

“waiver” means a waiver issued by the Council in respect of vehicles being used for building maintenance repair shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations and the Council may charge for such waiver such charge to be determined from time to time by resolution of the Council or relevant Committee thereof

Interpretation

3. Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order
4. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the Interpretation of an Act of Parliament
5. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any other prohibition or restriction whether made under the Act of 1984 or otherwise

SECTION 2 – PROHIBITION OF WAITING LOADING AND UNLOADING AT ANY TIME

Prohibition of Waiting Loading and Unloading at Any Time

6. Save as provided in Articles 7 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a civil enforcement officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 1

Exemptions

7. Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-
- (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
 - (i) building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the relevant position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984
 - (iv) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes
 - (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties.
 - (c) the vehicle of the Royal Mail or other universal services provider as defined in Section 4 of the Postal Services Act 2000 to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting mail.
 - (d) public service vehicles when waiting at an authorised bus stop to set down or pick up passengers
 - (e) vehicles picking up and dropping off passengers

SECTION 3 – PROHIBITION OF WAITING AT ANY TIME

Prohibition of Waiting at Any Time

8. Save as provided in Articles 9 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a civil enforcement officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 2

Exemptions

9. Nothing in Article 8 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-

- (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
 - (i) building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the relevant position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984
 - (iv) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes

SECTION 4 – PARKING BAYS, ONE HOUR LIMITED WAITING (NO RETURN WITHIN TWO HOURS) MONDAY TO SATURDAY 8.00AM TO 6.00PM – PERMIT HOLDERS EXEMPT

Parking Bays, One Hour Limited Waiting (No Return Within Two Hours) Monday To Saturday 8.00am To 6.00pm – Permit Holders Exempt

10. Save as provided in Articles 11 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a civil enforcement officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 3

Exemptions

11. Nothing in Article 10 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side or sides or length or lengths whereby the relevant permit has been issued.

SECTION 5 – PARKING BAYS, ONE HOUR LIMITED WAITING (NO RETURN WITHIN TWO HOURS) MONDAY TO SATURDAY 8.00AM TO 6.00PM

Parking Bays, One Hour Limited Waiting (No Return Within Two Hours) Monday To Saturday 8.00am To 6.00pm

12. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a civil enforcement officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the

Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 5

SECTION 6 – PROHIBITION OF A ‘U’ TURN

Prohibition of a ‘U’ Turn

13. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a civil enforcement officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to ‘u’ turn on the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 6

SECTION 7 – PROHIBITION OF LEFT TURN

Prohibition of a Left Turn

14. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a civil enforcement officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to turn left on the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 7

REVOCATION

15. The existing Orders are revoked insofar as they are inconsistent with the proposals contained in the schedules hereto and insofar as they relate to the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

SCHEDULE 1

PROHIBITION OF WAITING LOADING AND UNLOADING “AT ANY TIME”

ADELAIDE STREET (EAST SIDE)

From its junction with the southern kerbline of Somerset Place to its junction with the northern kerbline of Cambrian Place.

ADELAIDE STREET (WEST SIDE)

From its junction with the southern kerbline of Somerset Place for a distance of 54 metres in a southerly direction

From its junction with the northern kerbline of Burrows Place for a distance of 14 metres in a northerly direction

BURROWS PLACE (NORTH SIDE)

From its junction with the western kerbline of Adelaide Street for a distance of 13 metres in a westerly direction

From its junction with the eastern kerbline of Victoria Road for a distance of 22 metres in a easterly direction

SCHEDULE 2

PROHIBITION OF WAITING AT ANY TIME

SOMERSET PLACE

From a point 21 metres east to a point 38 metres east of its junction with the eastern kerbline of Adelaide Street, a distance of 17 metres.

SCHEDULE 3

PARKING BAYS

ONE HOUR LIMITED WAITING (NO RETURN WITHIN TWO HOURS) MONDAY TO SATURDAY 8.00AM TO 6.00PM – PERMIT HOLDERS EXEMPT

ADELAIDE STREET (WEST SIDE)

From a point 54 metres south of its junction with the southern kerbline of Somerset Place south for a distance of 39 metres.

SCHEDULE 4

PARKING BAYS

**ONE HOUR LIMITED WAITING (NO RETURN WITHIN TWO HOURS) MONDAY
TO SATURDAY 8.00AM TO 6.00PM**

BURROWS PLACE (NORTH SIDE)

From a point 13 metres west of its junction with the western kerblines of Adelaide Street for a distance of 23 metres in a westerly direction.

SCHEDULE 5

PROHIBITION OF 'U' TURN

VICTORIA ROAD JUNCTION WITH PRINCESS WAY

At a point in line with its junction of the north eastern kerblines of Princess Way.

VICTORIA ROAD JUNCTION WITH WIND STREET/ SOMERSET PLACE

At a point in line with its junction of the southern kerblines of Wind Street/ Somerset Place.

QUAY PARADE JUNCTION WITH WIND STREET/ SOMERSET PLACE

At a point in line with its junction of the northern kerblines of Wind Street/ Somerset Place.

OYSTERMOUTH ROAD JUNCTION WITH PRINCESS WAY

At a point in line with its junction of the south western kerblines of Princess Way.

SCHEDULE 6

PROHIBITION OF LEFT TURN

SOMERSET PLACE

At a point in line with its junction of the eastern kerblines of Victoria Road.

SCHEDULE 7

LEFT TURN ONLY

STRAND

At a point in line with its junction of the western kerblines of Quay Parade.

BURROWS PLACE

At a point in line with its junction of the south eastern kerblines of Victoria Road

SECTION 8 - REVOCATIONS

The existing orders are revoked insofar as they are inconsistent with the provisions contained in the Schedules below and insofar as they relate to the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in the Schedules below.

BUS LANE

CAER STREET (NORTH WEST SIDE)

From its junction with the north eastern kerblines of Princess Way to its junction with the south western kerblines of Castle Bailey Street/ Wind Street.
