AMENDMENT ORDER (NO. 6) 2006

Swindon Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4(2), 19, 32, 35, 45, 46, 47, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act of 1984"), as amended and the Road Traffic Act 1991 and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 and with the Road Traffic Act 1991, hereby make the following Order:-

PART 1 CITATION AND INTERPRETATION

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on the 3 April 2006 and may be cited as the Swindon Borough Council (Permitted Parking Area and Special Parking Area) (Waiting Restrictions and Street Parking Places Clearways and Bus Stop Clearways) Consolidation Order 2003 Amendment Order (No. 6) 2006.
- 2. The Swindon Borough Council (Permitted Parking Area and Special Parking Area) (Waiting Restrictions, Street Parking Places Clearways and Bus Stop Clearways) Consolidation Order 2003 (hereinafter referred to as the "the 2003 Order) shall be further amended as follows:

Delete from Article 2 of the 2003 Order the following definitions:

"passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle invalid carriage or disabled person's vehicle) not exceeding 5.30 metres in length and 2.25 metres in height and constructed or adapted to carry not more than 12 passengers exclusive of the driver; and not drawing a trailer.

Insert in Article 2 of the 2003 Order the following definitions

"operational Permits" means a permit issued under the provisions of Article 27 of the 2003 Order. Such permits shall authorise parking for a maximum of one hour's duration.

"operational Permit Holders" means a person to whom a permit was issued under the provisions of Article 27 of the 2003 Order.

"passenger carrying vehicle' means a motor vehicle (other than a motorcycle, invalid carriage or disabled person's vehicle) with a maximum of 8 seats (including the driver) or a car derived van or any goods vehicle up to and including 2.5 tonnes gross vehicle and not drawing a trailer, or a dual purpose vehicle.

PART III - AUTHORISATION AND USE OF STREET PARKING PLACES

After Article 15(1) of the 2003 Order there shall be inserted:

This restriction does not apply to a holder of a residents parking permit in relation to pay and display spaces only within that residents parking zone.

Delete Article 18(A) of the 2003 Order:

(b) for the purpose of servicing or washing any vehicle or part thereof other than is reasonably necessary to enable that vehicle to depart from the parking place.

After Article 22 (ii) of the 2003 Order there shall be inserted:

(iii) Motorcycles.

<u>PART IV – PERMITS</u>

Delete Article 27.(1) from the 2003 Order and substitute with:

27. (1) Any business, or resident, who is the owner of a vehicle of the following class, that is to say a passenger carrying vehicle with a maximum of 8 seats (including the drivers) or a car derived van or any goods vehicle up to and including 2.5 tonnes gross vehicle weight and not drawing a trailer, or a dual purpose vehicle, may apply to the Council or an authorised agent for a permit for the parking of that vehicle in a parking place within a residents' parking zone identified on the plans attached to the 2003 Order and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council or authorised agent and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and such fee as is for the time being prescribed by the Council.

(2) Any user of a vehicle of the following class, that is to say a passenger carrying vehicle with a maximum of 8 seats (including the drivers) or a car derived van or any goods vehicle up to and including 2.5 tonnes gross vehicle weight and not drawing a trailer, or dual purpose vehicle may apply to the Council or an authorised agent for an operational permit for the parking of that vehicle in a parking place within a resident's parking zone identified on the plans attached to the Order of 2003 and be obtainable from the Council or authorised agent and such fee is for the time being prescribed by the Council.

Delete 27. (3) (a) i) and (ii) from the 2003 Order and substitute with;

i) For residents of Zones A, D, E, F, G & L not more than one residents' parking permit per household provided that existing permit holders in these Zones who hold a second permit and in case of L only a third permit at 3 April 2006 shall be entitled to renew the second permit (and third permit in the case of Zone L only) annually for three years from this date so long as they remain resident at the same address. The entitlement to a second permit (and third in the case of Zone L only) will cease at the end of the third year.

ii) For residents of Zone B, C, H, J, K & N not more than two residents' parking permits per household provided that those existing permit holders who hold a third permit at 3 April 2006 will be entitled to renew the third permit annually for three years from that date so long as they remain at the same address. The entitlement to a third permit will cease at the end of the third year.

Delete Article 27. (3) (b) i) and ii) from the 2003 Order and substitute with:

- 50 visitor permits per household per annum valid for the day of issue. i)
- An additional 50 visitor permits per household per annum valid for a maximum of ii) 4 hours waiting for the day of issue.

After Article 27 (4)(c) of the 2003 Order there shall be inserted:

an operational parking permit shall be valid for 1 hour duration and may be used (d) in all residents parking zones in accordance with the guidance and regulations issued by the Council for the use thereof.

Delete Article 33 (D) of the 2003 Order and substitute with:

- For additional Visitors Permits Maximum 4 hours parking (d)
- the day on which, subject to the provisions of Article 30 of the 2003 Order, the (i) permit is valid:
- (ii) the start time in hours and minutes of when the permit becomes valid.
- (iii) identification that it is valid for a maximum of 4 hours waiting;
- (iv) an authentication that the permit has been issued by the Council;
- (v) the identifying zonal area letter and name,

After Article 33 (d) of the 2003 Order there shall be inserted:

- For operational parking permits maximum 1 hour parking per permit; (e)
- the day on which, subject to the provisions of Article 30 of the 2003 Order, the (i) permit is valid:
- the start time in hours of when the business become valid; (ii)
- Identification that is valid for a maximum of 1 hour waiting; (iii)
- an authentification that the permit has been issued by the Council. (iv) 5893/06
