

The Greater Manchester County (Park Parade
and Cavendish Street, Ashton-Under-Lyne)
(Clearway) (County) Order 1976

The Greater Manchester County Council in exercise of their powers under Section 1 (1) (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part 1X of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police for the County of Greater Manchester in accordance with Section 84C (1) of the said Act of 1967, hereby make the following Order:-

1. The Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
2. Save as provided in Article 3 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on either of the lengths of road specified in the schedule to this Order.
3. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on either of the lengths of road referred to in that Article:-
 - (a) for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation, demolition or excavation on or adjacent to either of the lengths of road, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of either of the lengths of road or the laying, erection, alteration or repair on or adjacent to either of the lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878;
 - (b) if the vehicle is a vehicle used for fire brigade purposes or an ambulance or any vehicle in the service of a local authority or police force in any case being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (c) if the vehicle is waiting in any case where the person in control of the vehicle is required by law to stop or is obliged to do so in order to avoid an accident, or is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control.

4. Notwithstanding any exemption contained in Article 3 of this Order the person in control of the vehicle waiting in either of the lengths of road shall move the vehicle on the instructions of a constable in uniform or of a traffic warden whenever such moving may be reasonably necessary for the purposes of preventing obstruction.
5. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st March, 1977 and may be cited as the Greater Manchester County (Park Parade and Cavendish Street, Ashton-Under-Lyne) (Clearway) (County) Order, 1976.

SCHEDULE

Roads in the Borough of Tameside
in the County of Greater
Manchester

1. Park Parade, Ashton-Under-Lyne from Grafton Street to Manchester Road including the carriageways of the three roundabouts and the link road connecting Park Parade to Stamford Street.
2. Cavendish Street, Ashton-Under-Lyne from Park Parade to a point 9 metres south of Bank Street.

(PROHIBITION OF FOOT PASSENGERS)
(COUNTY) ORDER 1976.

The Greater Manchester County Council in exercise of their powers under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part 1X of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police for the County of Greater Manchester in accordance with Section 84C(1) of the said Act of 1967, hereby make the following Order :-

1. Save as provided in Article 2 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform, proceed in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any foot passenger to proceed in the length of road referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary in connection with any building operation, demolition or excavation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the length of road referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878.
3. The Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
4. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st March, 1977, and may be cited as the Greater Manchester County (Park Parade, Ashton-under-Lyne) (Prohibition of Foot Passengers) (County) Order 1976.
