BOROUGH OF STALYBRIDGE
THE STALYBRIDGE (CORPORATION STREET AND HIGHER TAME
STREET)(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1971

The Stalybridge Borough Council in exercise of their powers under sections 1(1), (2) and (3) and 84D(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with section 84C(1) of the said Act of 1967, hereby make the following Order -

1. Save as provided in Article 3 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the length of road known as Corporation Street in the Borough of Stalybridge from its junction with Mottram Road for a distance in a southerly and westerly direction of 150 yards on the south and east side and 205 yards on the north and west side.
2. Save as provided in Article 3 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. in the length of road known as Higher Tame Street in the Borough of Stalybridge from its junction with Knowl Street for a distance in a westerly direction of 50 yards on the south side and 37 yards on the north side.
3. Nothing in Article 1 or in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of lengths of road referred to in those Articles, for so long as may be necessary -
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) to enable the vehicle, if it is in the service of or employed by the Post Office, to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
 - (d) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any funeral, building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the sides of lengths of road so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said sides of lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878;
 - (e) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

4. The Stalybridge (Higher Tame Street)(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1970 is hereby revoked.


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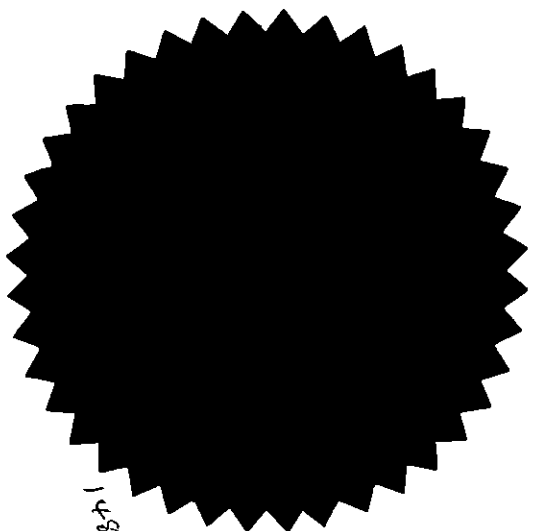
5. The Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament, and as if for the purposes of section 38 of that Act this Order were an Act of Parliament and the Order revoked by Article 4 of this Order were an Act of Parliament thereby repealed.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of September 1971, and may be cited as the Stalybridge (Corporation Street and Higher Tame Street)(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1971.
