**(ONE-WAY TRAFFIC) ORDER 2008**

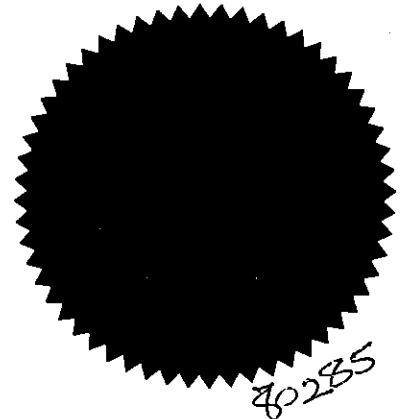
THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) and 2(2) and Part IV of schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1. No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in any of the lengths of roads specified in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order in a direction other than that specified in relation to that length of road in Column 2 of that Schedule.
2. THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH(CORPORATION STREET AND MELBOURNE STREET, STALYBRIDGE)(RESTRICTION OF ACCESS AND TRAFFIC REGULATION) ORDER 1999 shall have effect as though in schedule 1 to that order the sides of length of road specified in schedule 2 to this Order are hereby revoked.
3. Order will come into operation on the 27<sup>th</sup> March 2008 and may be cited as "THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH (CORPORATION STREET, STALYBRIDGE) (ONE-WAY TRAFFIC) ORDER 2008".

**(All vehicles prohibited 7am – 7pm Monday to Saturday inclusive, except for loading, unloading and access to off-street garaging)**

Corporation Street

between its junction with Melbourne Street and Trinity Street

between its junction with the southerly kerbline of Castle Street to its cul-de-Sac, some 10 metres south of Corporation Street.
