#### THE EXTINGUISHMENT OF VEHICULAR RIGHTS

### (METROPOLITAN BOROUGH OF TAMESIDE) (NO 1 ) ORDER 1989

Made 25th October

1989

The Secretary of State for Transport makes this Order in exercise of his powers under Section 212 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, and of all other enabling powers:-

- 1. Save as provided in Article 2 below any right which persons may have to use vehicles on the highways described in Schedule 1 to this Order and shown edged black on the deposited plan is hereby extinguished.
- 2. The provisions of Article 1 above shall not apply to the use of vehicles in the cases specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- 3. In this Order "the deposited plan" means the plan numbered NWRT5087/88/1(1) marked "Highway at Ashton-under-Lyne in the Metropolitan Borough of Tameside", signed by authority of the Secretary of State and deposited at the Department of Transport, Romney House, 43 Marsham Street, London SW1P 3PY.
- 4. This Order shall come into operation on the date on which notice that it has been made is first published in accordance with section 215(7) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, and may be cited as the Extinguishment of Vehicular Rights (Metropolitan Borough of Tameside) (No 1 ) Order 1989.

#### SCHEDULE 1

## Description of highway to which this Order relates (The distances are approximate)

The highway to which this Order relates is at Ashton-under-Lyne in the Borough of Tameside. It is shown edged black on the deposited plan and is part of a length of Warrington Street on its easterly side starting at a point 38 metres south of its junction with Wellington Road and extending in a south easterly direction for a distance of 87.5 metres.


## SCHEDULE 2

## Cases where persons may use vehicles on the highways described in Schedule 1 to this Order

Where the vehicle is using the highway:

- a. for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes;
- b. in connection with the laying, erection, inspection, maintenance, alteration, repair, renewal or removal in or near the said length of highway of any sewer, main, pipe, conduit, wire, cable or other apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or of any telecommunication apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984.
