
# THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL (COTTON STREET EAST, ASHTON UNDER-LYNE) (ONE WAY TRAFFIC) ORDER 1992.

THE TAMESIDE METROPOOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Traffic Regulations Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act hereby makes the following order:-

- 1. Save as provided in Article 3 of the order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in any of the lengths of road specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Order in a direction other than that specified in relation to that length of road in column 2 of that Schedule.
- 2. The Greater Manchester County (Cavendish Street/Oldham Road Area, Ashton-under-Lyne) (Traffic Regulation) (County) Order 1982, shall have effect as though in Schedule 1 to that Order the length of road Specified in Schedule 2 to this Order were deleted therefrom.
- 3. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall apply to the driving of any mechanical road cleansing vehicle being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
- 4. The Order shall come into operation on ( 11<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER 1992 ) and may be cited as "The Tameside Metropolitan Borough Council (Cotton Street East, Ashton-under-Lyne) (One Way Traffic) Order 1992.


### Column 2
