THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH (SAXON STREET AND INMAN STREET, DENTON) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING) ORDER 2004

THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1), 2(2) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of Part IV of Schedule 9 to the said Act of 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1. (1) In this Order:-

"authorised taxi rank" means any area of carriageway which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1028.2 in Schedule 6 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"authorised parking place" means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges For Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"taxi" means a vehicle licensed under Section 37 of the Towns Police Clauses Act 1847 or under any similar enactment;

"parking disc" means a disc issued by a local authority, 125 millimetres square and coloured blue if issued on or after 1st April 2001 or coloured orange if issued before that date and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;

"a recognised timing point" is the location where a public service vehicle may wait to ensure adherence to a published timetable or local service registration and includes departure and terminal points, provided that this Order shall only apply to those bus timing points which have been approved, in writing, by the police and Highway Authority.

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-
 - (a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when:-
 - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen, and
 - (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle, and

- (b) a parking disc in the relevant position, when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.
- (3) except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- 2. Save as provided in Article 3 to this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait, load or unload at any time on the sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- 3. (1) Nothing in Article 2 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) persons to board or alight from a vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of lengths of roads; or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or the land adjacent to, the sides of lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984.
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or any other Authority in the pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (d) the vehicle, to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000;
 - (e) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the sides of lengths of roads for so long as such waiting is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral; or
 - (f) the vehicle to be used for Fire Brigade, Ambulance or Police purposes.
- 4. THE URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF DENTON (VARIOUS STREETS) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND LOADING AND UNLOADING) ORDER 1970 shall have effect as though:

- (1) in Schedule 3 to that Order the sides of length of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order were deleted therefrom.
- 5. THE GREATER MANCHESTER COUNTY (A627/A6017, NORTH-SOUTH ROUTE TAMESIDE) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) (NO.1) (COUNTY) ORDER 1982 shall have effect as though:
 - (1) in Schedule 5 Part 2 to that Order the sides of length of road specified in Schedule 3 to this Order were deleted therefrom.
- 6. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restrictions or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the said Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

The Order shall come into operation on the 30th day of September 2004 and may be cited as "THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH (SAXON STREET AND INMAN STREET, DENTON) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING) ORDER 2004".
