TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH (PALATINE STREET, PALATINE COURT AND CLARE STREET, DENTON) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING ONLY) ORDER 2015

THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1), and 2(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of Part IV of Schedule 9 to the said Act of 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1. (1) In this Order:-

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges For Motor Vehicles)(England) Regulations 2000;

"disabled person's vehicle" means a vehicle which displays a disabled person's badge in accordance with the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended, or under any succeeding legislation, and shall include a badge issued under regulations having effect in Scotland or Wales under Section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Person's Act 1970, and a recognised badge under Section 21A and B of the 1970 Act;

"parking disc" means a disc issued by a local authority, 125 millimetres square, coloured blue and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;

"A designated loading bay" is a section of carriageway set aside purely for the purposes of loading and unloading, and is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1028.3 in Schedule 6 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002; and with a sign(s) complying with diagram 660.4 in Schedule 2 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-
 - (a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when:-
 - the badge is exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle or;
 - (ii) where a vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or facia, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle, so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle.
 - (b) a parking disc in the relevant position if:
 - (i) the disc is exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle and shows the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting began and that period is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle or:
 - (ii) where the vehicle does not have a dashboard or facia, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle, so that, when marked to show the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting began and that period is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle.

- (3) except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- 2. Save as provided in Article 6 to this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- 3. Save as provided in Article 6 to this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00am and 6.00pm Monday to Friday inclusive on the sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- 4. Save as provided in Article 6 to this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8.00am and 7.00pm Monday to Saturday inclusive on the sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 3 to this Order
- 5. Save as provided in Article 6 to this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time within the designated loading bay on the sides of lengths of roads as specified in the Schedule 4 to this Order except for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle.
- 6. (1) Nothing in Articles 2, 3, 4 and 5 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) persons to board or alight from a vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of lengths of roads; or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or the land adjacent to, the sides of lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any electronic communications network as defined in the Communications Act 2003:
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or any other Authority in the pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (d) the vehicle, to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000;

- (e) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the sides of lengths of roads for so long as such waiting is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral; or
- (f) the vehicle to be used for Fire Brigade, Ambulance or Police purposes.
- (2) Nothing in Articles 2, 3 and 4 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle on the sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 to this Order, at any time.
- (3) Nothing in Article 5 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait wholly within the designated loading bay for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle on the sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 4 to this Order, at any time.
- (4) Nothing in Articles 2, 3 and 4 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge or a parking disc (on which the driver, or person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on any side of the length of road specified in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 to this Order, for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of length of road on the same day).
- 7. THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH (WILTON STREET, CLARE STREET AND PALATINE STREET, DENTON) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING) ORDER 2003 shall have the effect as though Schedule 3 to that order were hereby revoked.
- 8. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restrictions or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the said Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

The Order shall come into operation on the 6 day of May 2016 and may be cited as "TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH (PALATINE STREET, PALATINE COURT AND CLARE STREET, DENTON) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING ONLY) ORDER 2015".

Schedule 1

No Waiting at Any Time

Palatine Street
(west side)

From its cul-de-sac end (located 16 metres north of its junction with Palatine Court) for a distance of 13 metres in a southerly direction.

From is junction with Palatine Court in a northerly direction up to and including its cul-de-sac end (located 16 metres north of its junction with Palatine Court).

Palatine Street
(both sides)

From a point 10 metres north of its junction with Clare Street to a point 10 metres south of that junction.

Clare Street (both sides)

From a point 40 metres west of its junction with Palatine Street to a point 6 metres east of that junction.

Schedule 2

No Waiting Monday - Friday 8am - 6pm

Palatine Court (both sides)

From its junction with Palatine Street in an easterly direction up to and including its cul-de-sac end.

Palatine Street (east side)

From its junction with Palatine Court to a point 10 metres north of its junction with Clare Street.

Schedule 3

No Waiting Monday - Saturday 8am - 7pm

Clare Street (south side)

From a point 6 metres east of its junction with Palatine Street to a point 15 metres west of its junction with Ashton Road.

Palatine Street (east side)

From a point 10 metres south east of its junction with Clare Street to a point 34 metres south east of that junction.

Schedule 4

Loading Only Mon - Fri 8am - 6pm

Palatine Street (west side)

From a point 13 metres south of its cul-de-sac end for a distance of 20 metres in a southerly direction.

Palatine Street (west side)

From a point 2 metres south of its junction with Palatine Mews for a distance of 20 metres in a northerly direction.

From a point 12 metres south of its junction with Palatine Mews for a distance of 19 metres in a southerly direction.
