



(MERCER STREET, DROYLSDEN)
(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) ORDER 1996

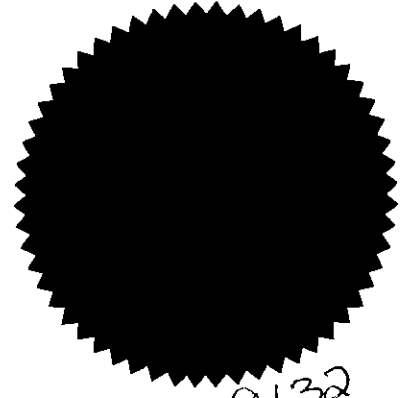
THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1), 2(2) and 2(5) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Schedule 9 of the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1. Save as provided in Article 2 to this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter or leave Mercer Street at its junction with Bell Street in Droylsden.
2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to enter or leave Mercer Street at its junction with Bell Street so far as such proceeding is necessary by any person who is the owner or occupier of premises whose means of access is from and only from Mercer Street (a qualifying person) and access/egress to that street from Market Street at that particular time is temporarily obstructed due to circumstances outside that persons control.
3.
 - (1) Any person who is the owner or occupier of premises whose means of access is from and only from Mercer Street may apply to the Council for the issue to him or her of a key to facilitate entry to /exit from Mercer Street at its junction with Bell Street. Any such application shall be made on a form provided by the Council and shall include the information required by the form to be supplied.
 - (2) The Council may at any time require a qualifying person to produce to an Officer of the Council upon application for a key, such evidence as they may reasonably call for to verify any particulars or information given to them.
 - (3) On receipt from a qualifying person of an application made under paragraph (1) above in respect of a vehicle, the Council shall issue to him or her a key in respect of access to/egress from Mercer Street at its junction with Bell Street on being satisfied that the applicant may from time to time reasonably require such access/egress in connection with the use of premises of which he or she is the owner or occupier.
 - (4) A qualifying person may surrender the key to the Council at any time but must surrender the key on the vacation of premises to which access referred to in Article 3(1) refers.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the 16th day of April 1997 and may be cited as "THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH (MERCER STREET, DROYLSDEN) (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) ORDER 1997"
