THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH (VARIOUS STREETS, DROYLSDEN) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND REVOCATION) ORDER 2010 PART 1

THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) and 2(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Parts III and IV of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1. (1) In this Order:-

disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges For Motor Vehicles)(England) Regulations 2000;

"disabled person's vehicle" means a vehicle which displays a disables person's badge in accordance with the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 as amended, or under any succeeding legislation, and shall include a badge issued under regulations having effect in Scotland or Wales under Section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Person's Act 1970, and a recognised badge under Section 21A and B of the 1970 Act;

"parking disc" means a disc issued by a local authority, 125 millimetres square, coloured blue and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-
 - (a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when:-
 - (i) the badge is exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle or;
 - (ii) where a vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard of facia, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle, so that the front of the badge is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle.
 - (b) a parking disc in the relevant position if;
 - the disc is exhibited on the dashboard or facia of the vehicle and shows the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting began and that period is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle or;
 - (ii) where the vehicle does not have a dashboard of facia, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle, so that, when marked to show the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting began and that period is clearly legible from the outside of the vehicle.

- Save as provided in Article 4 to this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- 3. Save as provided in Article 4 to this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 9.00am and 5.00pm on Monday to Friday inclusive on the sides of lengths of roads specified in the Schedule 2 to this Order.
- 4. (1) Nothing in Article 2 and 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) persons to board or alight from a vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of lengths of roads; or
 - the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or the land adjacent to, the sides of lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any electronic communications network as defined in the Communications Act 2003.
 - the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or any other Authority in the pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (d) the vehicle, to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000.
 - (e) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the sides of lengths of roads for so long as such waiting is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral; or
 - (f) the vehicle to be used for Fire Brigade, Ambulance or Police purposes.
 - (2) Nothing in Articles 2 and 3 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle on the sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 and 2 to this Order, at any time.

- Nothing in Article 2 and 3 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver, or person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on any of the sides of lengths of roads referred to in schedule 1 and 2 to this Order for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of length of road on the same day)
- 5 THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH (ALBERT STREET AND BAGULEY STREET, DROYLSDEN)(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1997 shall have the effect as though in Schedule 1 to that Order the sides of lengths of road specified in Part 1 of Schedule 3 to this Order were deleted therefrom.
- 6 THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH (VARIOUS ROADS)
 (DROYLSDEN)(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2006 shall have the effect as though in the Schedule to that Order the sides of lengths of road specified in Part 2 of Schedule 3 to this Order were deleted therefrom.
- 7 THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH (CHAPEL STREET) (DROYLSDEN)(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1990 is hereby revoked.
- 8 The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restrictions or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the said Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

The Order shall come into operation on the 7th day of January 2011 and may be cited as "THE TAMESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH (VARIOUS STREETS, DROYLSDEN) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND REVOCATION) ORDER 2010 PART 1"

College Avenue (both sides)

from its junction with Greenhow Street for a distance of 5

metres in a westerly direction.

Baguley Street (north side)

from its junction with Market Street for a distance of 25

metres in an easterly direction.

(south side)

from its junction with Market Street for a distance of 15

metres in an easterly direction.

Chapel Street (north side)

from its junction with Market Street for a distance of 30

metres in an easterly direction.

from a point 44 metres east of its junction with Market Street for a distance of 5 metres in an easterly direction.

(south side)

from its junction with Market Street to a point 5 metres east

of its junction with Beswick Street.

from its junction with Pickmere Close for a distance of 5

metres in a westerly direction.

Beswick Street (both sides)

from its junction with Chapel Street for a distance of 5

metres in a southerly direction.

Pickmere Close (west side)

from its junction with Chapel Street for a distance of 9

metres in a southerly direction.

Luke Road (both sides)

from its junction with Dunkirk Street for a distance of 10

metres in a north easterly direction.

Lines Road (both sides)

from its junction with Dunkirk Street for a distance of 10

metres in a south westerly direction.

Dunkirk Lane (north side)

from a point 10 metres north west of its junction with Luke Road to a point 10 metres south east of that junction.

Dunkirk Lane (south side)

from a point 10 metres north west of its junction with Lines

Road to a point 10 metres south east of that junction.

SCHEDULE 2

No waiting Monday to Friday, 9am to 5pm

Baguley Street (north side)

from a point 25 metres east of its junction with Market Street for a distance of 80 metres in a easterly direction.
