

**THE BOROUGH OF TELFORD AND WREKIN**  
**(BEAUMARIS ROAD & CROWN MEWS, NEWPORT)**  
**(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2010**

THE BOROUGH OF TELFORD AND WREKIN in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1), 2(2) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This order shall come into operation on 7<sup>th</sup> January 2011 and may be cited as The Borough of Telford and Wrekin (Beaumaris Road & Crown Mews, Newport) (Prohibition Of Waiting) Order 2010.
  
  2. (1) In this Order:-

"authorised parking place" means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges For Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000.

"parking disc" means a disc issued by a local authority, 125 millimetres square and coloured blue if issued on or after 1<sup>st</sup>. April 2001 or coloured orange if issued before that date and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;
  - (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-
    - (a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when:-
      - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen, and
      - (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle, and
    - (b) a parking disc in the relevant position, when the disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.
  - (3) except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- 
3. Save as provided in Article 4 to this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the sides of lengths of roads specified in the Schedule to this Order.

4. (1) Nothing in Articles 3 or 4 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
- (a) persons to board or alight from a vehicle;
  - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
    - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of lengths of roads; or
    - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or the land adjacent to, the sides of lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984.
  - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or any other Authority in the pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - (d) the vehicle, to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000;
  - (e) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the sides of lengths of roads for so long as such waiting is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral; or
  - (f) the vehicle to be used for Fire Brigade, Ambulance or Police purposes.
- (2) Nothing in Article 3 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle on the sides of lengths of roads specified in the Schedule to this Order, at any time.
- (3) Nothing in Article 3 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle:
- (a) to wait upon an authorised parking place
- (4) Nothing in Article 3 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver, or person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on any of the sides of lengths of roads referred to in those Articles for a period not exceeding three hours

(not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of length of road on the same day).

6. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restrictions or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the said Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.

<b>Schedule One – (No waiting at any time)</b>	
<b>Column One</b>	<b>Column Two</b>
Beaumaris Road – eastern section (north side), Newport	From its junction with New Street for a distance of 75 metres in an easterly direction.
Beaumaris Road – eastern section (south side), Newport	From its junction with Gravelly Drive for a distance of 14 metres in an easterly direction.  From a point 61 metres east of its junction with Gravelly Drive for a distance of 14 metres in an easterly direction.
Crown Mews (east side), Newport	From its junction with Beaumaris Road for a distance of 18 metres in a northerly easterly direction.
