

Telford And Wrekin Borough
(Walker Street, Wellington)
(Prohibition & Restriction Of Waiting, Revocation,
Weight Restrictions and One Way)Order 2011

Notice is hereby given that the Telford & Wrekin Borough in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1), 2(2) and 4(2) 9, 10 & 11 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of Part IV of Schedule 9 to the said Act all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 hereby makes the following Order: -

This Order shall come into effect on **1st December 2011** and may be cited as the Borough of Telford and Wrekin (Walker Street, Wellington)(Prohibition & Restriction of Waiting, Revocation, Weight Restrictions and One Way)Order 2011

- 1) The Traffic Regulation Orders specified in **Schedule 1** to this Order shall have the effect of revoking or removing all references to the order specified in Column 1 of **Schedule 1** to this extent specified Column 2 of that Schedule.
- 2) In this order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:
 - a) "doctor" is a person registered as a "fully registered medical practitioner" under the provisions of the Medical Act 1983;

"parking space" means a space in the parking place referred to in the Schedule which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle;

"parking place" means any part of a road authorised by this Order to be used as a parking place;

"schedule" means the schedule to this Order;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in The Disabled Person's (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, 125 millimetres square coloured blue, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;

"Goods Vehicle" means a motor vehicle or trailer constructed or adapted for the use for the carriage or haulage of goods or burden of any description;

"heavy commercial vehicle" shall have the same meaning as in Section 138 of the Act.
 - b) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by, or as having effect by virtue of, any subsequent enactment. "Enactment" means any enactment, whether public, general or local and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument.
- 3) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

- 4) The prohibitions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any Regulations or Orders made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984, or by or under any other enactment.
- 5) Save where the contrary is indicated, any reference in this Order to:-
 - a) this Order or another Order shall be construed as such a reference to this Order or, as the case may be, such other Order, as the same may have been or may from time to time be amended, varied or supplemented;
 - b) A Statute or Regulation shall be construed as reference to such Statute or Regulations as the same may have been, or may from time to time be amended or re-enacted.
- 6) For the purposes of this Order, a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying-
 - a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant position, when: -
 - i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part I of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle; or .
 - ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part I of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle.
 - b) a parking disc in the relevant position if –
 - i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; or
 - ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.
- 7) In this order all distances relating to the restrictions imposed have been measured in relation to the roads or the length of road specified in the following manner:-
 - a) except where otherwise specified a dimension has been measured along the centreline of carriageway of the roads specified.
 - b) for restrictions relating to Side Roads, the start point of measurement, when measured from a junction, is the rear of the highway relating to the main road.
- 8) Save as provided in **Article 10** to this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the sides of lengths of roads specified in Column 1 of **Schedule 2** to this Order in relation to that length of road in Column 2 of that Schedule.
- 9) Nothing in **Article 9** to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle on the sides of lengths of roads specified in the Schedule 2 to this Order, at any time.
 - a) Nothing in **Article 9** to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle:
 - i) to wait upon an authorised parking place.

- 10) Nothing in **Article 9** to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver, or person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on any of the sides of lengths of roads referred to in those Articles for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of length of road on the same day).
- 11) Save as provided in **Article 13** to this Order no person shall except upon the direction of or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait or load or unload at any time on the sides of lengths of roads specified in Column 1 of the **Schedule 3** to this Order in relation to that length of road in Column 2 of that Schedule.
- 12) Nothing in **Articles 9 & 12** shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
- a) persons to board or alight from a vehicle
 - b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely: -
 - i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of lengths of roads; or
 - iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or the land adjacent to, the sides of lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984.
 - c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or any other Authority in the pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - d) the vehicle, to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000;
 - e) the vehicle to be used for Fire Brigade, Ambulance or Police purposes.
 - f) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads or sides of roads; or
 - g) the vehicle to wait near at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to said lengths of road or sides of road for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral.
- 13) Save as provided in **Article 10**, no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the sides of roads or in any of the lengths of roads specified in Column 1 of the **Schedule 4** to this Order in relation to that length of road in Column 2 of that Schedule., between the hours of 8:00am and 6:00pm: Monday to Saturday
- a) for a longer period than 30 minutes, or
 - b) if a period of less than 1hour has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) by that vehicle on that side of road.

- 14) Save as provided in **Article 10**, no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of the sides of roads or in any of the lengths of roads specified in Column 1 of the **Schedule 5** to this Order in relation to that length of road in Column 2 of that Schedule., between the hours of 8:00am and 6:00pm:
- 15) Save as provided in **Article 17** no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in a westerly direction on the sides of lengths of roads specified in Column 1 of the **Schedule 6** to this Order in relation to that length of road in Column 2 of that Schedule.
- 16) Nothing **Article 16** of this order shall apply to:-
 - a) it is being used for police, ambulance, fire brigade or local authority purposes in an emergency situation;
- 17) The part of road or lengths of roads specified in **Schedule 7** to this Order is authorised to be used , subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for a disabled person's vehicle in such positions as are specified in relation to that part of the road in the said schedule.
- 18) Where in **Schedule 7** to this Order, the parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the parking place:-
 - a) unless it is of the specified class; or
 - b) if it is in a position other than that specified.
- 19) The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a parking place for longer than the maximum period permitted for waiting specified in the Schedule to this Order in relation to that parking place
- 20) When a vehicle has left the parking place after waiting thereon the driver thereof shall not within 1 hour after its leaving permit it to wait again upon that parking place.
- 21) Nothing in **Articles 14 & 15** of this order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge to wait on the sides of roads referred to in those Articles outside the times and days of operation of any restriction on loading and unloading;
- 22) The driver of a vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.
- 23) No person shall use a vehicle while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skills or services.
- 24) Save as provided in **Article 26** of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden, use, cause or permit any heavy commercial vehicle over 7.5 tonnes to proceed in the roads specified in the **Schedule 8** to this Order.
- 25) Nothing in **Article 25** of this Order shall make it unlawful to use, cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in the said roads and lengths of roads referred to in that Article if the vehicle is being used:

- a) for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to the said roads and lengths of roads;
- b) in connection with the carrying out on, or on premises situated on or adjacent to the said roads and lengths of roads of any of the following operations, namely:
 - i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads and lengths of roads;
 - iv) the laying, erection alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to the said roads and lengths of roads, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in Schedule 2 of the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- c) in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- d) in the service of a local authority, or a water undertaker or sewerage undertaker, or the Environment Agency in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- e) to proceed to or from any premises situated in or adjacent to the said roads and lengths of roads at which the vehicle is to be, or has been, garaged in accordance with conditions imposed by the Traffic Commissioners, or at which the vehicle is to be serviced or repaired;
- f) for the purposes of agriculture on any land adjacent to the said roads and lengths of roads, or for or in connection with the haulage of timber felled upon such land; or
- g) in connection with a circus, fair or similar event the holding of which on, or in the vicinity of, the said roads lengths of roads has been authorised by the Council.

26) The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restrictions or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the said Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.
