

**TELFORD AND WREKIN COUNCIL
(DALE END, COALBROOKDALE)
(EXPERIMENTAL PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2019**

Borough of Telford & Wrekin (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following order.

This Order may be cited as the Telford and Wrekin Council (Dale End, Coalbrookdale)

1. (Experimental Prohibition Of Waiting) Order 2019 and shall come into operation on 7th February 2019 for a period not exceeding eighteen months.

2. (1) In this Order:-

"Authorised Parking Place" means any parking place on a road authorised or designated by an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984;

"Disabled Person's Badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges For Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000.

"Parking Disc" means a disc issued by a local authority, 125 millimetres square and coloured blue capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;

"Vehicle" means a vehicle of any description and includes a machine or implement of any kind drawn or propelled along road whether by animal or mechanical power;

(2) For the purpose of this Order a Vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:-

a) a Disabled Person's Badge in the relevant position, when:-

(i). in the case of a Vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the Disabled Person's Badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen, and

(ii). in the case of a Vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the Disabled Person's Badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the Vehicle, and

b) a Parking Disc in the relevant position, when the Parking Disc is exhibited thereon with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.

3. Save as provided in Article 4 to this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any Vehicle to park, stop or wait at any time on all days on the sides of the roads specified in Column 1 of the Schedule and along the lengths of those roads described in Column 2 of the Schedule .

4. (1) Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any Vehicle to park, stop or wait on the sides of lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-

- a) persons to board or alight from a Vehicle;
 - b) for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from a Vehicle;
 - c) the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i). building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii). the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii). the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of lengths of roads; or
 - (iv). the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or the land adjacent to, the sides of lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984.
 - d) the Vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority in the pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - e) the Vehicle, to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000;
 - f) the Vehicle to be used for Fire Brigade, Ambulance or Police purposes.
- (2) Nothing in Article 3 to this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's Vehicle which displays in the relevant position a Disabled Person's Badge and a Parking Disc (on which the driver, or person in charge of the Vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to park, stop or wait on any of the sides of lengths of roads referred to in the Schedule for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same Vehicle on the same side of length of road on the same day).
5. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restrictions or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the said Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.
6. The Assistant Director: Governance, Procurement & Commissioning for the Council, or a person authorised by that officer, may modify or suspend the operation of the Order or any provision of it if it appears to him essential –
- a) in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic,
 - b) in the interests of providing suitable and adequate on-street parking facilities, or
 - c) for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the order runs.

The power conferred by such a provision shall be exercised only after consultation with the appropriate chief officer of police and giving such public notice as the Secretary of State may direct.
