HERTFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE HERTFORDSHIRE (SOUTH WAY, HUNTON BRIDGE HILL and ADJOINING ROADS, ABBOTS LANGLEY) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING, EXCEPT FOR LOADING AND UNLOADING) ORDER 2001

The Hertfordshire County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984"), and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the said Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "The Hertfordshire (South Way, Hunton Bridge Hill and adjoining Roads, Abbots Langley) (Prohibition of Waiting, Except for Loading and Unloading) Order 2001 and shall come into operation on Monday 7 April 2003.

2. In this Order

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specifications for Parking Discs (BS No. 4631: 1970), coloured orange or blue, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins; and

"relevant position" means

- i) A vehicle displays a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if:
 - a) in the case of vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen and with its front facing forward so as to be legible from outside the vehicle; and
 - b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle.
- ii) A vehicle displays a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if:
 - a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle; or
 - b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle.
- iii) A vehicle displays a parking disc in the relevant position if:
 - a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; or

- b) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.
- 3. Save as provided in Articles 4, 5 and 6 of this Order, no person shall, except under the direction or with the permission of an officer authorised by Three Rivers District Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the lengths of roads in Abbots Langley specified the Schedule of this Order.
- 4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, industrial and demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic:
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said length of road;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus defined in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in Schedule 2 of the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - (v) to a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (d) packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953.
- 5. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the most recent period of waiting began), to wait in the lengths of roads referred to in the said Article for a period of 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).
- 6. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule to this Order for the purposes of loading and unloading goods to or from premises in or adjacent to the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 7. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition and not in derogation from any Restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.
- 8. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

SCHEDULE

Lengths of roads in Abbots Langley - No waiting at any time, except for loading & unloading

South Way

- north side
- a) From the eastern kerbline at its junction with Upper Highway, eastwards to a point 12 metres east of the eastern kerbline of its most westerly junction with South Way Service Road, a distance of 170 metres.
- b) From a point 11 metres east of the eastern kerbline at its most westerly junction with the South Way service road, eastwards for a distance of 71 metres.
- c) From a point 44 metres east of the eastern kerbline at its middle junction with the South Way service road, eastwards to a point 142 metres east of the eastern kerbline at its junction with the most easterly access to South Way service road, a distance of 340 metres.
- south side
- d) From a point 3 metres east of the centreline of its junction with its middle junction with South Way Service Road, westwards to a point at the eastern kerbline of its eastern junction with Gypsy Lane, a distance of 300 metres.
- e) From a point 44 metres east of the eastern kerbline at its middle junction with the South Way service road, eastwards for a distance of 356 metres.

South Way Service Road

- -east side
- f) From its most easterly junction with South Way, back into the service road for a distance of 13 metres.
- -west side
- g) From its most easterly junction with South Way, back into the service road for a distance of 15 metres.

Essex Lane

- east side
- h) From the eastern kerbline at its most easterly junction with South Way, southwards for a distance of 16 metres.
- west side
- i) From the western kerbline at its most easterly junction with South Way, southwards for a distance of 14 metres.

Hunton Bridge Hill

- north side
- j) From the eastern parapet of the railway bridge, eastwards to a point 10 metres east of the eastern kerbline at its junction with Hamilton Road, a distance of 73 metres.
- k) From a point 14 metres west of the western kerbline at its junction with Lauderdale Road, eastwards to a point at the western kerbline at its junction with Upper Highway, a distance of 133 metres.
- south side
- 1) from the eastern parapet of the railway bridge, eastwards to the westerly kerbline at its westerly junction with Gypsy Lane, a distance of 214 metres.
- m) from a point at the eastern kerbline of its eastern junction with Gypsy Lane, westwards to a point at its western kerbline with its western junction of Gypsy Lane, a distance of 32 metres.

Hamilton Road

- east side

n) from its junction with Hunton Bridge Hill, northwards for a distance of 16 metres.

Hamilton Road

- west side
- o) From its junction with Hunton Bridge Hill, northwards for a distance of 17 metres.

Lauderdale Road

- east side
- p) From its junction with Hunton Bridge Hill, northwards for a distance of 15 metres.
- west side
- q) From its junction with Hunton Bridge Hill, northwards for a distance of 17 metres.

Long Elms

- east side
- r) from a point at the western kerbline of its junction with South Way, to a point at the southern kerbline of its junction with Upper Highway, a distance of 15 metres.
- west side
- s) from a point at the eastern kerbline of its junction with South Way, to a point opposite the southern kerbline of its junction with Upper Highway, a distance of 15 metres.

Upper Highway

- east side
- t) From its junction with Hunton Bridge Hill, northwards for a distance of 18 metres.
- west side
- u) From its junction with Hunton Bridge Hill, northwards for a distance of 24 metres.

Hunton Bridge Hill

- south side
- v) from a point at the eastern kerbline of its eastern junction with Gypsy Lane, westwards to a point at its western kerbline with its western junction of Gypsy Lane, a distance of 32 metres.

South Way


- north side
- w) from a point 20 metres east of the eastern kerbline of its junction with Upper Highway, eastwards to a point 12 metres east of the eastern kerbline of its most westerly junction with South Way Service Road, a distance of 150 metres.
- south side
- x) from a point at the eastern kerbline of its most easterly junction with Essex Lane, westwards to a point at the eastern kerbline of its eastern junction with Gypsy Lane, a distance of 185 metres.

Long Elms

- east side.
- y) from a point at the western kerbline of its junction with South Way, to a point at the southern kerbline of its junction with Upper Highway, a distance of 15 metres.
- west side
- z) from a point at the eastern kerbline of its junction with South Way, to a point opposite the southern kerbline of its junction with Upper Highway, a distance of 15 metres.
