THE THREE RIVERS DISTRICT COUNCIL (HIGH ELMS LANE, **GARSTON) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2003**

The Three Rivers District Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") pursuant to arrangements made under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the Hertfordshire County Council in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under Sections 1(1), 2(1), 2(2), 3 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, ("the Act") and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act.

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on 1 September 2003 and may be cited as "The Three Rivers District Council (High Elms Lane, Garston) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2003".
- 2. In this Order

'parking attendant' has the same meaning as in Section 63A of the Act

- 3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order, no person shall, except under the direction or with the permission of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the lengths of High Elms Lane, Garston either on the verge or roadway specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:
 - a) a person to board or alight from a vehicle;
 - b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely
 - i) building, industrial and demolition operations;
 - ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said length of road;

- iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus defined in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in Schedule 2 of the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- v) to a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- vi) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- vii) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953.
- 5. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of any Act of Parliament.
- 6. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
