## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

**THE HERTFORDSHIRE  
(RICKMANSWORTH PARK SCHOOL ACCESS ROAD, RICKMANSWORTH)  
(PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2003**

The Hertfordshire County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3) and 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "The Hertfordshire (Rickmansworth Park School access road, Rickmansworth) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 2003" and shall come into operation on Tuesday 13 April 2004.
2. Save as provided in Articles 5, 6 and 7 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in that length of Rickmansworth Park School access road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
3. Save as provided in Articles 5, 6 and 7 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 10.00 am and 11.00 am Monday to Friday in that length of Rickmansworth Park School access road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
4. Save as provided in Article 5 to this Order, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to stop or wait between the hours of 8.00am and 5.00pm during school term time in that length of Rickmansworth Park School access road specified in Schedule 3 to this Order.

In this Article –

"school term time" has the meaning – as those days of the year which have been determined by the education authority as school days in accordance with the provisions of Section 32 of The Education Act 2002.

5. (1) Nothing in Articles 2, 3 and 4 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by those Articles (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as "the restricted area") in relation to –

(a) a vehicle being used for Fire and Rescue, Ambulance or Police purposes.

(b) Anything done with the permission of or at the direction of –

- (i) a police officer in uniform;
- (ii) a traffic warden;
- (iii) in respect of any of the lengths of road in the restricted area which are in a special parking area designated under Part II of the Road Traffic Act 1991 or Schedule 3 to that Act, a parking attendant appointed under section 63A of the Act of 1984;

- (c) a vehicle which is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the drivers control or which has stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property or when required by law to do so;
- (d) a vehicle which is stationary in order that it may be used for one or more of the purposes specified in sub-Article (2) of this Article and which cannot reasonably be used for such a purpose without stopping in the restricted area;
- (e) a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is stationary only for so long as may be reasonably necessary for postal packets to be collected or delivered;

In this Article -

The expressions "universal service provider", "provision of a universal postal service" and "postal packet" shall bear the same meanings as in the Postal Services Act 2000.

(2) The "purposes" referred to in sub-Article (1)(d) of this Article are -

- (a) any operation involving building, demolition or excavation;
- (b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a road;
- (d) constructing, improving, maintaining, or cleaning of any street furniture; or
- (e) the laying, erection, alteration, repair or cleaning of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus kept or installed for the purposes of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position.

6. Nothing in Article 2 or 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait only for so long as may be reasonably necessary -

- (a) to enable goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle from or to premises adjacent to the restricted area;
- (b) to enable a passenger to board or alight and to load and unload any luggage of the passenger.

7. (1) Nothing in Article 2 or 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc, to wait at any time in the length of road as specified in Schedule 1 to this Order for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).

(2) In this Article -

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984;

"parking disc" means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specifications for Parking Discs (BS No. 4631: 1970), coloured orange or blue, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins; and

"relevant position" means

- i) A vehicle displays a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if:-
    - a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle; or
    - b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle;
  - ii) A vehicle displays a parking disc in the relevant position if:-
    - a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; or
    - b) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.
8. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
9. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by any other enactment.

### **SCHEDULE 1**

#### **lengths of Rickmansworth Park School access road – no waiting at any time**

Access Road (north and east side)	from its junction with the north western kerb line of Park Road westwards, north westwards, northwards then westwards to its junction with the eastern kerb line of Southgate Cottages access road, a distance of approximately 191 metres.
(west side)	from its junction with the north western kerb line of Park Road north westwards for 22 metres.
(west side)	from its junction with the western kerb line of Southgate Cottages access road southwards for 25 metres.
(south side)	from its junction with the eastern kerb line of the entrance drive of Rickmansworth Park School northwards then eastwards for 20 metres.

## SCHEDULE 2

length of Rickmansworth Park School access road –  
no waiting 10.00 am to 11.00am Monday to Friday

Access Road (west side) from a point 54 metres north west of its junction with the north western kerb line of Park Road northwards and westwards for 74 metres.

## SCHEDULE 3

length of Rickmansworth Park School access road –  
no stopping or waiting on School Keep Clear markings  
8.00am to 5.00pm Monday to Friday during school term time

Access Road (west side) from a point 22 metres north west of its junction with the north western kerb line of Park Road northwards for 32 metres.
