THE THREE RIVERS DISTRICT COUNCIL (BUCKNALLS LANE, GARSTON) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2004

The Three Rivers District Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) makes this Traffic Regulation Order pursuant to arrangements under Section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the Hertfordshire County Council in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under Sections 1(1), 2(1), 2(2)(c), 4(1) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, (“the Act”) and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act.

1. This Order shall come into operation on 29 September 2004 and may be cited as “The Three Rivers District Council (Bucknalls Lane, Garston) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2004”.

2. In this Order

‘disabled person’s badge’ has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act

‘disabled person’s vehicle’ has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act

‘parking attendant’ has the same meaning as in Section 63A of the Act

‘relevant position’ means

- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen and with its front facing forward so as to be legible from outside the vehicle; and
- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle.

A vehicle displays a parking disc in the relevant position if:-

- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; or

- (b) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.
3. Save as provided in Articles 5, 6 and 7 of this Order, no person shall, except under the direction or with the permission of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the lengths of Bucknalls Lane, Garston specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
 4. Save as provided in Articles 5, 6 and 8 of this Order, no person shall, except under the direction or with the permission of a parking attendant, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 3 p.m. and 4 p.m. Monday to Friday (inclusive) in the lengths of Bucknalls Lane, Garston specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
 5. Nothing in Articles 3 or 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - a) a person to board or alight from a vehicle;
 - b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely
 - i) building, industrial and demolition operations;
 - ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said length of road;
 - iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus defined in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in Schedule 2 of the Telecommunications Act 1984;
 - v) to a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
 - vi) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - vii) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953.
 6. Nothing in Articles 3 or 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle in any lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order at any time on any day.

7. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge to wait in the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 1 to this Order for a period of 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).
8. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge to wait for any period of time in the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 2 of this Order.
9. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of any Act of Parliament.
10. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

SCHEDULE 1

On the north side of Bucknalls Lane commencing adjacent to the eastern side of the pedestrian crossing at its junction with A405 St Albans Road for a length of 28 metres easterly along Bucknalls Lane.

On the south side of Bucknalls Lane commencing adjacent to the eastern side of the pedestrian crossing at its junction with A405 St Albans Road for a length of 32 metres easterly along Bucknalls Lane

SCHEDULE 2

On the north side of Bucknalls Lane commencing from a point 28 metres east of the pedestrian crossing at its junction with A405 St Albans Road for a length of 203 metres easterly along Bucknalls Lane.

On the south side of Bucknalls Lane commencing from a point 32 metres east of the pedestrian crossing at its junction with A405 St Albans Road for a length of 198 metres easterly along Bucknalls Lane.
