## THE THREE RIVERS (GREENWAYS, ABBOTS LANGLEY) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2009

The Three Rivers District Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") makes this Traffic Regulation Order pursuant to arrangements made under Section 19 of the Local Government Act of 2000 and the Local Governments (Arrangements for Discharge of Functions) (England) Regulations 2000 with Hertfordshire County Council, and in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended from time to time ("the Act"), and of Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and under all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act.

1. This Order shall come into operation on 16 November 2009 and may be cited as "The Three Rivers (Greenways, Abbots Langley) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 2009".

2. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them:

**"Civil Enforcement Officer"** has the same meaning as in section 76 of the Traffic Management Act 2004;

**"disabled person's badge"** has the same meaning as in section 142(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

**"disabled person's vehicle"** has the same meaning as in section 142(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

**"relevant position"**

- i) a vehicle displays a disabled person's badge in the relevant position if:

- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen and with its front facing forward so as to be legible from outside the vehicle; and

- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle.

- ii) a vehicle displays a parking disc in the relevant position if:

- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or facia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; or

- (b) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the quarter hour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle.

3. Save as provided in Articles 4, 5 and 6 of this Order, no person shall, except under the direction or with the permission of a civil enforcement officer in uniform and on duty or a police officer on duty, cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths of roads as specified in the Schedules of this Order.
4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary in the lengths of roads specified in the Schedules of this Order:
  - a) to enable a person to board or alight from a vehicle;
  - b) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:
    - i) building, industrial and demolition operations;
    - ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said length of road;



- iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any electronic communications apparatus defined in paragraph 1(1) of the Telecommunications Code contained in Schedule 2 of the Telecommunications Act 1984;
  - v) for the purpose of the fire brigade, ambulance or police;
  - vi) in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
  - vii) for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000.
- c) where the vehicle is a pedal cycle
  - d) where the person in control of the vehicle:
    - i) is required by law to stop;
    - ii) is obliged to stop so as to prevent an accident;
    - iii) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his/her control.
5. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded or unloaded from the vehicle in any lengths of roads specified in the Schedules of this Order at any time on any day.
- 6.
- a) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (marked to show the quarter hour period during which the period of exempted waiting began) to wait at any time in the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 1 of this Order for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same lengths or road).
  - b) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge to wait at any time in the lengths of road referred to in Schedule 2 of this Order.
7. The restriction imposed by this Order shall be in addition and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
8. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of any Act of Parliament.
9. Contravention of this Order may constitute an offence.

## SCHEDULE 1

### **No Waiting At Anytime**

On the northeast side of Greenways from a point opposite a point in line with the boundary between 33 and 35 Greenways following the kerb line for a distance of 46 metres to a point opposite a point in line with the boundary between 27 and 29 Greenways.

## SCHEDULE 2

### **No Waiting Monday to Friday 8:15am to 9:15am and 2:45pm to 3:45pm Except Bank Holidays**


On the southeast side of Greenways from a point in line with the boundary between 27 and 29 Greenways in a south-westerly direction for 38 metres.

On the southwest side of Greenways from a point in line with the boundary between 33 and 35 Greenways following the kerb line in a south-easterly and south-westerly direction for 31 metres.

On the northeast side of Greenways from a point 5 metres south of a point in line with the boundary between 30 and 32 Greenways in a south-easterly direction for 36 metres to a point opposite a point in line with the boundary between 33 and 35 Greenways.
